



PROJECTS

Information from Engineering Department

2700 West Wall



Construction of the new wall along the west side of 2700 West Road South of 4700 S is complete. The project replaced the existing variety of fencing with a 6' stamped concrete sound wall. Staining of the new fence and final landscaping is scheduled to be completed this month.

Bowling Avenue Wall



This project will install a precast concrete decorative wall between the Salt Lake Community College campus and a section of the residents along Bowling Avenue (project extent may be modified). The existing variety of fencing will be replaced with a 10' stamped concrete wall (Taylorsville typical style). The open house held for the residents last week was well attended. Construction of this new wall along the south side of Community Blvd. is scheduled for construction after May 7th to correspond with the end of semester at the college.

maintenance to the storm water system, adding devices to help clean the storm water, disconnecting storm drainage from irrigation systems and reduce flooding in areas.

Redwood Road Beautification Project (4100 South to 4700 South)



Redwood Road is an arterial with a significant amount of traffic, and this section of the roadway is within a commercial area with a high number of accesses. The City received funding from Wasatch Front Regional Council to achieve the following goals for this segment of Redwood Road:

- Improve safety using access management by consolidating accesses and improving flow at driveways;
- Improve pedestrian safety and comfort with wider park strips and sidewalks;
- Improve aesthetics using landscaping ; and
- Improve safety of UTA bus stops by providing pedestrian buffers, benches, and shelters.

Regional Trail System Phase 3: I-215 Bridge at 5400 South



This project will provide non-motorized transportation connectivity for the existing and proposed regional trail system ultimately spanning across Taylorsville. This will include reconstruction of sidewalk under I-215 and provide a pathway and trail for pedestrians, bicyclists and other non-motorized forms of transportation. These improvements will increase safety for both motorists and pedestrians. Beautification measures will include landscaping along pathway and wall design along the underpass.

UDOT UPDATE

Information from UDOT

UDOT will be resurfacing S.R. 266 (4700 South) from I-15 to I-215 West to increase the life of the roadway. Construction is scheduled to begin mid-April and continue through July 2016. Surrounding residents and businesses can expect traffic restrictions, construction equipment and vehicles, and an increase in noise. Residents may also expect an increase in nighttime related activities during the month of May.

ENVIRONMENTAL TRAFFIC STUDY AT BANGERTER 5400 & SOUTH

Information from UDOT

UDOT is conducting an environmental study to evaluate the potential benefits and impacts of constructing a freeway-style interchange at 5400 South. As part of the study, UDOT will also evaluate three other intersections at 7000 South, 9000 South and 11400 South to determine if free-way style alternatives will be suitable options at these locations. The Study is scheduled for completion in May 2016 with construction starting in 2017, pending approval of the Environmental Study.

A public meeting will be held in Spring 2016 to present the results of the Study, but the project team welcomes your questions and comments about environmental issues and transportation needs throughout the Study. ELECTRONIC PLAN REVIEW

Information from Building Department

On March 15, 2016, the City of Taylorsville's Building Department transitioned to an electronic plan review format for all building permit applications. Instead of bringing building plans to the city offices, plans will now be submitted electronically to the city's plan review website: <http://taylorsville.eprocess360.com/login>

Here you will be able to check the status of plans, schedule inspections, and manage your building permit. This website will simplify the permit application process and allow

users to inquire about the status any time of day. The building department is available to offer first-time users assistance with website use and set up to scan and upload their plans. This change will streamline the overall process and assist in keeping permit costs as low as possible.

Adoption fees include first set of vaccinations, rabies vaccination and sterilization surgery, when necessary. A microchip may be added for \$20. License fees may also be collected if the new adopter resides within Taylorville or West Valley City limits.

Regular Adoption Fees:

Large dogs: \$50.00

Small dogs (under 30 lbs.): \$100

Puppies: \$150

Adult Cats: \$30 (two for \$40)

Kittens: \$40 (two for \$50)

Adoption fees include first set of vaccinations, rabies vaccination and sterilization surgery, when necessary. A microchip may be added for \$20. License fees may also be collected if the new adopter resides within Taylorsville or West Valley City limits.
