- 110, 000 sq. ft. Multi-Use Recreational Facility
- Built in 1998 as a Venue for the 2002 Winter Olympic Games
- Hosted Men's practice sessions and Women's games (Including Bronze Medal Match)
- Privately managed until November = 2008
- Jointly owned by Provo City and Utah County Governments. Managed by Provo City

- 4 Full-Time and scaled Part-Time/Seasonal employees
- Year round operations: 2 Olympic ice sheets & 2 indoor synthetic turf fields
- Over 500,000 Participants, Athletes and Spectators a year
- Multi-use facility: Hockey, Skating, Broomball, Soccer, Lacrosse, Rugby, Baseball, Quidditch, Ultimate Frisbee, Bubble Ball and Laser Tag
- Operational Goals:
 - 1. Increased facility efficiency
 - 2. Increase impact decrease subsidy (City Operations 2008 at \$603,419 now \$170,000)
 - 3. Improved facility awareness
 - 4. Focus on capital improvements
 - 5 Maintain the Olympic Standard
