

SANPETE COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING

July 5, 2016, 1:00 P.M.

Sanpete County Courthouse, 160 North Main, Room 101, Manti, Utah

Present are: Commission Chair Claudia Jarrett, Commissioners Steve Frischknecht and Scott Bartholomew, and County Clerk Sandy Neill. County Attorney Brody Keisel is excused.

Meeting is called to order by Commission Chair Claudia Jarrett.

CLAIMS

Auditor Ilene Roth is present. Motion is made by Commissioner Frischknecht to approve payment of claims #338944 through #339044. The motion is seconded by Commissioner Bartholomew, and the motion passes.

MICHAEL BLAIR: APPROVAL TO RENAME THE COUNTY ROAD NEAR HIS HOME ON 2940 WEST NEAR STERLING

This matter is tabled. An ordinance will be prepared before we can hear this matter.

DOUGLAS TAYLOR: APPROVAL TO RENAME THE COUNTY ROAD NEAR HIS HOME ON 5500 EAST NEAR MORONI

Douglas Taylor is present. He is requesting that this road be removed from the County road system. The road has not been graveled for at least 15 years, the road is graded, and has been plowed after storms. He would like to be able to place a locked gate on this road. The road does not access anything except his property. There is a dead end sign posted but the public continue to drive down the road. Motion is made by Commissioner Bartholomew to allow Mr. Taylor to place a gate on the road as long as it is not locked. The gate will be closed primarily at night or when he is gone. The motion is seconded by Commissioner Frischknecht, and the motion passes.

KEVIN BURGESS: FINAL APPROVAL OF A ONE-LOT MINOR SUBDIVISION ON S21771X, LOCATED NORTHEAST OF MORONI

Kevin Burgess and Scott Olsen are present. This property is on the Blue Hills road. Motion is made by Commissioner Frischknecht to approve the one-lot minor subdivision on S21771X, located Northeast of Moroni. The motion is seconded by Commissioner Bartholomew, and the motion passes.

LORI NAY: DISCUSSION OF RURAL UTAH ALLIANCE

Lori Nay is present. She gives an overview of the Rural Utah Alliance (RUA). Their purpose is to provide guidance, lobbying, and policy-making. During the last legislation a group of rural organizations got together and decided it would be good to have a non-profit organization of counties to give rural Utah a better voice. Utah Association of Counties (UAC) supported forming this group. Funding was received from the State for \$250,000 to get this organization started. The fee for counties to join is currently \$5,000 per year. Each member county would have one member on the board. The Commission ask if the Foundation of Integrated Preservation (FIP) and this group serve the same purposes. UAC helped create FIP, which is a 501(c)(3) foundation. Mrs. Nay will look into this. Eight counties have joined so far.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion is made by Commissioner Bartholomew to approve the minutes from June 7, 2016 with minor corrections. The motion is seconded by Commissioner Frischknecht, and the motion passes.

LORI GILES: DISCUSSION OF SIX MILE ROAD BY PALISADE LAKE

Paul Brown, Pat Halliday, Al Halliday, James Giles, and Lori Giles are present. Mr. Brown explains that the County road runs through their subdivision, and heads up the canyon. The County has done a great job maintaining the road. ATV use has increased greatly in the last few years on this road. Park visitation has also increased over the last few years bringing even more ATV's to the area. The road was re-graded, and is easier to travel. The speed that the vehicles travel have increased. They are requesting speed limit signs and increased law enforcement. The Commission will put a request in to the Sheriff's Office to review the speed limit on this road. The Commission will also request more patrol in the area. The road supervisor will be made aware of a request to reduce the dust on the road to see if this can be fit into their budget in the future. Upon an application being submitted, this will also be reviewed by the roads special service district to see if this can fit in their budget for next year. Also the State Parks and Recreation will be notified to see if this can fit in their budget.

CANVASS OF THE JUNE 2016 PRIMARY ELECTION, AND AUDIT RESULT OF TABULATION EQUIPMENT

Sandy Neill presents the June 2016 primary election results to be canvassed. Motion is made by Commissioner Frischknecht to approve the canvass of the 2016 primary election. The motion is seconded by Commissioner Bartholomew, and the motion passes. Motion is made by Commissioner Bartholomew to approve the audit results. The motion is seconded by Commissioner Frischknecht, and the motion passes. The canvass results are attached to these minutes.

JOSHUA BREWER: REQUEST FOR SAFETY MEASURES TO BE TAKEN TO PROTECT HIS CHILDREN FROM IRRIGATION PONDS THAT WERE DUG ADJACENT TO HIS PROPERTY NEAR WALES

Joshua and Angela Brewer are present. They are concerned about the open ponds near their home. Their back yard is fenced, but the ponds aren't. The irrigation ponds are about 15 feet deep, and are a danger to others, too. The irrigation company told them that after meeting with their legal counsel, they would not be constructing a fence around this pond. The banks around the pond are steep and it would be easy to slide off into the pond. The ponds are fed by spring water, and contain water year-round. There are regulations for storage reservoirs but not for storage ponds. Commissioner Bartholomew will contact the irrigation company to see if permission can be granted to access the property to place fencing around the pond. Commissioner Bartholomew offers to help with the funding for this if the irrigation company will allow this to be done.

Motion is made by Commissioner Bartholomew to go into executive session to discuss the character, professional competence, or physical or mental health of an individual. The motion is seconded by Commissioner Frischknecht, and the motion passes.

EXECUTIVE SESSION






