



- **Pamela Vickrey (moderator)** is the Executive Director of Utah Juvenile Defender Attorneys & Vice Chair to the Utah Sentencing Commission, Chair of the Juvenile Subcommittee for the U.S.C., Chair-Elect to Utah's State Advisory Group and the defense representative to the Supreme Court Advisory Committee on the Rules of Juvenile Procedure. As the only certified Juvenile Training Immersion Program trainer in Utah, Ms. Vickrey attends, participates in, and provides training to juvenile defense attorneys in the state and around the country <http://njdc.info/our-work/jtip/>.
- **Jo Ellen Cline** is the Criminal Justice Counsel for the Ohio Criminal Sentencing Commission. Her work includes developing effective strategies and recommendations regarding sentencing, diversion, and juvenile justice issues. Ms. Cline previously served as government relations counsel for the Supreme Court of Ohio for fourteen years; as an assistant state public defender; as the legislative liaison for the Ohio Public Defender's Office; and as Minority Legal Counsel in the Ohio House of Representatives. - **David Dominguez**, Law Professor Emeritus, Brigham Young University Law School, grew up in a Los Angeles ghetto near the campus of the University of Southern California. He graduated with honors from Yale in 1977 and received his J.D. from the University of California at Berkeley Law School in 1980. After 8 years as a trial attorney with the National Labor Relations Board, he joined the law faculty at B.Y.U. in 1989. He taught Criminal Law, Work Law, and Community Lawyering for 25 years before retiring from full-time law teaching in 2014. Professor Dominguez continues to teach part-time at BYU Law School and is Founder and Executive Director of www.StrideOn.com, which specializes in training culturally diverse professionals and community members to solve legal problems as multicultural teams.
- **Leah Farrell** is the Staff Attorney at the ACLU of Utah, joining the organization in 2011 from the University of Texas School of Law. Leah has litigated ground breaking case in areas such as LGBT rights, Racial Justice, students' rights, and First Amendment protection. Leah also serves as a policy expert and advocate on state and local legislation and issue campaigns, including Racially Just Utah <http://www.acluutah.org/racial-justice>.
