

## MINUTES OF THE JULY 19, 2016 BOARD TRAINING

Alpine School District's Board of Education met in a training meeting on Tuesday, July 19, 2016, at 11:00 P.M. The training took place at the Alpine School District Office.

Board members present: President John C. Burton, Vice President JoDee C. Sundberg, S. Scott Carlson, Deborah C. Taylor and Paula H. Hill.

S. Scott Carlson left the meeting at 1:00 p.m.

Excused: Wendy K. Hart and Brian E. Halladay.

Also present: Superintendent Samuel Y. Jarman, Business Administrator Robert W. Smith and members of the administrative staff.

The following took place during the training:

1. Meeting with Saratoga Springs City  
Board members met with Mayor Jim Miller and City Council members from Saratoga Springs. Superintendent Jarman presented information about the proposed bond and there was discussion about the growth in the Saratoga Springs area. Alpine School District and Saratoga Springs City will continue to meet in quarterly meetings.
2. District Goals  
Cabinet members reported on the achievement of the district goals set by the Board in February.

## MINUTES OF THE JULY 19, 2016 STUDY SESSION

Alpine School District's Board of Education met in a regularly scheduled study session on Tuesday, July 19, 2016 at 4:00 P.M. The meeting took place at the Alpine School District Office.

Board members present: President John C. Burton, Vice President JoDee C. Sundberg, Deborah C. Taylor, and Paula H. Hill.

Wendy K. Hart joined the meeting by phone.

Excused: S. Scott Carlson and Brian E. Halladay.

Also present: Superintendent Samuel Y. Jarman, Business Administrator Robert W. Smith, and members of the administrative staff. There were approximately six others in attendance.

The following took place at the study session:

1. Rob Smith, Business Services Administrator, shared Alio updates. Alio is the financial system used by Alpine School District. In the fall of 2016, a "One Stop Shop" website will be launched. This will allow for parents to go to one site to pay all of their children's school

fees. In January 2017 the Alpine Foundation will come online through campus accounting. This will allow for grade-level donations. Donations made to individual teachers can still be sent directly to the Alpine Foundation or made through payroll deduction. The Business Services staff assisted the Board members in setting up their dashboards for Alio Intelligence. This will allow the Board to access budgetary information as needed.

2. Jess Christen, District Operations Administrator, shared the updates on the proposed bond projects. Board members discussed and made recommendations for the project list. At the August 16 Board meeting, the Board will decide if they want to pass a resolution to put the bond on the November ballot.

#### MINUTES OF THE JULY 19, 2016 BOARD MEETING

Alpine School District's Board of Education met in a regularly scheduled Board meeting on Tuesday, July 19, 2016 at 6:00 P.M. The meeting took place at the Alpine School District Office.

Board members present: President John C. Burton, Vice President JoDee C. Sundberg, Deborah C. Taylor, and Paula H. Hill.

Wendy K. Hart joined the meeting by phone.

Excused: S. Scott Carlson and Brian E. Halladay.

Also present: Superintendent Samuel Y. Jarman, Business Administrator Robert W. Smith, and members of the administrative staff. There were approximately 55 others in attendance.

Board President John C. Burton conducted the meeting.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Cabinet member Jess Christen led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### REVERENCE

Kara Sherman offered the reverence.

#### COMMUNITY COMMENTS

**Skylar Ostler** is a transgender student who graduated from Alpine School District and now attends UVU. She addressed the Board about rejecting federal funding to avoid compliance to the Title IX guidelines. Board President John Burton said there was no plan to reject federal funding. Skylar asked that they not reject the Title IX guidelines, but respect the rights of all students.

**Oliver Young** is a 19-year-old student at UVU and is a transgender man. He referenced the last Board meeting and community comments about the Title IX guidelines. He spoke against rejecting federal funding and taking away the rights of students. The overreach people are concerned about is not new, but is a reminder and clarification of the law given in 2014.

**Tessa White** is a teacher for Alpine School District. She thanked the Board for clarifying there will not be a budget created without federal funding. She called on the Board to require training for teachers and staff on how to create a safe environment for LGBTQ students. Teachers need to know what support and accommodations are available to the LGBTQ students in the district. Before coming to Alpine School District, Ms. White taught at a charter school in Eagle Mountain. The school had a higher than average LGBT student population. These students reported their reason for leaving Alpine School District was due feeling bullied and unsafe. Ms. White asked the Board to create an environment that would allow all students to feel safe.

**Barb Healey** thanked the Board for the clarification that federal funding will not be declined. She is a safe zone trainer from the Utah Pride Center and feels this is a perfect opportunity for Alpine School District to create a safe zone for LGBTQ students. Ms. Healey said that based on a United Kingdom study released few months ago, high schools that have Gay Straight Alliance Clubs see suicide rates go down by 70% after three years, in the entire school population. We need to teach our kids to not hate, but to love and accept everyone.

**Karen Deysher** thanked the Board for the clarification regarding federal funding. She is the program manager of the LGBT community at UVU and is willing to work with Alpine School District on training faculty and staff on creating a safe environment for students. Ms. Deysher shared statistics from the K-12 students who responded to the Gay Lesbian Straight Education Network 2011 School Climate Survey. The statistics indicate that, overall, LGBT students feel unsafe at school. One of simplest ways to have an inclusive environment for all students is to follow Title IX guidelines, which protects the gender identity of students.

**Lisa Williamson** is a mother of six children who were educated in the Provo School District. She has grandchildren attending Alpine School District and hopes they will belong to a classroom, to a school and a district that will have teachers who are educated about issues with transgender students. Mrs. Williamson referenced the Alpine School District mission statement, "Educating all students to ensure the future of our democracy" which includes transgender students. She works with transgender students at UVU and said they have enriched her life. As an educator she knows that if you are terrified while at school, you cannot learn. If Alpine's motto is to educate every student, please include every student and provide places where they can learn.

**Erin Bigler** graduated from Provo School District and just moved back to Utah County. Her three children will be attending Alpine School District and she feels it is critical that they attend a school where they feel safe. It is important that her children have the right to self identify and for this right to be supported at school to allow them to grow to their full potential. Mrs. Bigler is a licensed clinical social worker in the state of Utah and reiterated some of the statistics shared previously. Despite what we here about the LGBTQIA community being dangerous, scary or different, the truth is that transgender kids are at the most risk for abuse. Students, who come to school and fear for their safety, will not have to opportunity to learn. If the Board sets the tone for inclusion, the teachers and students will follow.

**Brooke Swallow-Fenton** commented that her father was a teacher at Cherry Hill Elementary for over twenty years and was a champion of equality. She noted that this is not a school thing, but a culture issue and referenced an article published in 1979 by a BYU Zoology Professor.

**Laura Lund** lives in Orem and commented that her six children do not attend Alpine School District schools because of the negative experiences they had regarding LGBTQ students and the lack of protection. She thanked Board member Paula Hill for having someone from the district contact her after she spoke about this topic in the May Board meeting. Mrs. Lund said she was reviewing the nondiscrimination policy and noticed sexual orientation and gender identity are not included and asked that a modification be made to include those students. These students need to know they can ask for help and not be ignored. She is supportive of teacher training because it would give them the ability to help all students. She appreciates the school district adopting the guidelines because it addresses many issues and provides a safe environment for learning.

**Jonathan Sober** commented that he had a hard time in Alpine School District when he came out and had a lot of bad experiences. He almost attempted suicide in high school because he had no friends and felt the teachers didn't accept him. He decided to allow the experience to make him a better person. Mr. Sober felt things improved when his parents put him in a charter school.

**Hiroyuki Hensley (Yoki)** believes that schools will be safer when transgender students are using bathrooms they identify with. She suffered a lot of bullying because of being transgender and it is not something anyone should have to go through. With more support for transgender students, more lives will be saved.

**Nathan Hill** commented that all people deserve an education, including transgender students. Part of getting an education is to have a safe environment for learning.

**Tac Mortensen** graduated from American Fork High School. He was taunted since junior high about being gay, before he even identified as such. He has listened to both arguments regarding parent concern for the safety of their children. Those who are transgender should not be targeted as being unsafe just because they are the minority. Mr. Mortensen said he hoped the Board hasn't been overwhelmed by the comments, but hopes they understand that transgender individuals need to be able to use the bathroom with which they identify.

**Rebecca Wright** is a teacher in Alpine School District and attests to the district's organizational culture that cares for all students. Alpine School District Board shows they care by their commitment to keep federal funding and their statement that they are currently working with families of transgender students to provide accommodations. Ms. Wright shared three specific things she would like to see happen to help parents know that our district will support and accommodate the LGBTQIA students. (1) The discrimination policy should include sexual and gender identity. (2) Our anti-bullying policy should include specific language that is LGBTQIA related. (3) District personnel receive safe zone training.

**Erin Brown** is a parent of students and a former teacher in Alpine School District. She thanked the Board for their efforts on behalf of our students and for the clarification regarding the federal funding.

**Rachel Nelson** stood in for Leonard Nevin who signed up to make a comment. Mrs. Nelson said the bottom line is that education is for all students as stated in the Alpine School District mission statement. She is the mother of five and wants all students to feel safe. We need to make sure the education system is designed to allow a safe learning environment for everyone.

**Laura Nevin** commented that she is a “mama dragon” a term for mothers of LGBTQIA children. Five of her eight children graduated from Alpine School District and her youngest child is gay. Mrs. Nevin commented that as parents, we love and accept our children as they are. She was surprised when attending high school graduation in May, that it was very binary. She asked the Board to do all that they could to make schools safe for all students.

The latest Alpine Foundation report was included for the Board’s review.

4. Student Releases - (CK, JL, KM, JO)

The Board received background information relative to the release of these students.

Superintendent Jarman recommended the approval of the routine business. **JoDee Sundberg made the motion and Debbie Taylor seconded it. The motion passed unanimously.**

ACTION ITEMS

1. Resolution #2016-011 – Property Purchase in Highland

Superintendent Jarman explained this resolution is for the purchase of property in Highland around the area of Lone Peak High School to allow for the expansion of the parking lot.

**Debbie Taylor made the motion to approve Resolution #2016-11 and Wendy Hart seconded it. The motion passed unanimously.**

2. Resolution #2016-012 – Civil Engineering/Geotechnical Testing for New School Sites

Superintendent Jarman explained this resolution is for the civil engineering and geotechnical testing that needs to be done on three of our properties. This would benefit the process of constructing future schools.

**JoDee Sundberg made the motion to approve Resolution #2016-012 and Debbie Taylor seconded it.** Board members asked clarifying questions. **The motion passed unanimously.**

3. November Board Meeting Date Change

Superintendent Jarman recommended the approval to change the November Board meeting date from November 8, 2016 to November 15, 2016.

**Paula Hill made the motion to change the date of the November Board meeting and Debbie Taylor seconded it. The motion passed unanimously.**

4. Excursion Request – American Fork High School

Superintendent Jarman recommended the approval of the American Fork High School excursion request.

**JoDee Sundberg made the motion to approve the excursion request and Paula Hill seconded it.** Board members asked clarifying questions. **The motion passed unanimously.**

DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEM

1. Close Westlake High School to Out of Area Requests

Superintendent Jarman read the proposal submitted by Assistant Superintendent Dr. John Patten, to close Westlake High School to out of area students beginning immediately and continuing until a new high school relieves the enrollment numbers. The proposal is based on the following:

- **Capacity:** The April enrollment report shows a total student enrollment of 2,475 students. It projected that there will be 2,784 students this fall, making it the largest high school in the district. The building was constructed to accommodate approximately 2,400 students. The addition of twenty satellite classrooms will meet the current enrollment numbers, but cannot accommodate significant growth. The facility will not accommodate any more portable classrooms, but the projections show an enrollment of 3,211 students for the 2018-19 school year. If the Board votes to put the bond on the ballot and it passes, this is still one year prior to a high school opening in Eagle Mountain.
- **Trust Land Funds for FTEs:** Principal Gary Twitchell and the School Community Council allocated Trust Land funds to help with FTEs for class size reduction.

Superintendent Jarman recommended the discussion and approval of closing Westlake High School to out of area requests, until another high school is built to relieve the growing numbers.

**Paula Hill made the motion to close the boundaries of Westlake High School to out of area requests. Wendy Hart seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.**

DISCUSSION

1. 2018-19 School Calendar Recommendations

Elizabeth Wilson, Director of Human Resources, presented the calendar options for the 2018-19 school year. She shared the input and recommendations from the calendar committee and addressed questions from Board members. The approval of the 2018-19 school calendar will be an action item on the August 16 Board meeting agenda.

## REPORTS

### 1. School Reports

Elementary Supervisors Barry Beckstrand and Dr. Mark Pew reported to the Board about the great things happening in the elementary schools in Alpine School District. Mark shared the following facts: 41,617 of the 75,000+ students enrolled in the district are elementary. There are 6,563 students attending traditional and 35,292 attending extended day schools. 874 students are participating in ALL programs throughout the district and 2,506 students that participate in the dual immersion language programs. Mark reported that great things are happening with the adoption of the Wonders Literacy Program and recognition was given to Dr. Garrick Peterson and the Curriculum Department for their efforts in training teachers and principals. Barry Beckstrand reported on the success of unpacking standards, double dosing grants and tier 2 interventions as we move towards our literacy goal. He said the data shows we have good solid instruction, but there is always room for improvement. In 2015-16 we opened River Rock Elementary in Lehi and Springside Elementary in Saratoga Springs will open for the 2016-17 school year. Barry thanked the Board for their support in expediting the building of Springside to meet the needs of the students in the community.

John Spencer, the Administrator of High Schools, recognized the courage of the individuals who spoke during the community comments. His hope is that they know how deeply they are cared for and that all are committed to providing a safe environment for every student.

John presented an overview of each high school, providing their graduation rates, awards and successes. Some of the highlights shared were that Lone Peak High was named the top 5A high school and Orem High the top 4A school in the state by the Utah High School Activities Association (UHSAA). Pleasant Grove High was one of seven traditional high schools to receive an A grade, along with Lone Peak High. Lone Peak's principal, Rhonda Bromley, was named State Principal of the Year by the PTA. Timpanogos High had the highest graduation rate in Alpine School District. Summit had 49 graduates, which is 65% of their students and the highest percentage in 35 years. John recognized Lori Thorn, principal of Polaris High School. 80% of the Polaris senior young parents graduated and 46 of their seniors were early graduates. The Polaris graduates benefitted from teacher scholarship donations (\$4,300).

Superintendent Jarman commended the great leadership we have in Alpine School District.

A RESOLUTION providing for the holding of a Bond Election in Alpine School District, Utah County, Utah for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the School District the question of the issuance and sale of \$387,000,000 General Obligation School Building Bonds; providing for the holding of a public hearing and the publication of a Notice of Public Hearing; declaring official intent with respect to certain expenditures; and providing for related matters.

WHEREAS, there is an immediate and pressing need of raising money for the purpose of paying all or a portion of the costs to acquire land; acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping new school facilities; and improving or rebuilding existing facilities (collectively, the “*Project*”) under the charge of the Board of Education (the “*Board*”) of Alpine School District, Utah County, Utah (the “*District*”); and, to the extent necessary, for providing moneys for the refunding, at or prior to the maturity thereof, of general obligation bonds of the Board authorized hereunder or heretofore issued and now outstanding;

WHEREAS, there are no funds in the treasury of the Board available for this purpose;

WHEREAS, Section 11-14-318 of the Local Government Bonding Act, Chapter 14, Title 11 of the Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended (the “*Utah Code*”) requires that a public hearing be held with respect to the issuance of such bonds for said purposes and that notice of such public hearing be given as provided by law;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to (a) hold a Bond Election on November 8, 2016 to submit to the qualified electors of the District the question of the issuance of such bonds for said purposes (the “*Bond Election*”), (b) provide for the holding of a public hearing and (c) direct the publication and posting of a Notice of Public Hearing (the “*Notice of Public Hearing*”); and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to provide for the conduct of the Bond Election by designating the election officials, approving the polling places and providing for other related matters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Alpine School District, Utah County, Utah, as follows:

*Section 1.* In satisfaction of the requirements of Section 53A-18-102 of the Utah Code, the Board hereby finds and determines that it is advisable to issue school district bonds to address the needs of the Board and the District to pay all or a portion of the costs to acquire land; acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping new school facilities; and improving or rebuilding existing facilities under the charge of the Board, and, to the extent necessary, to provide moneys for the refunding, at or prior to the maturity thereof, of general obligation bonds of the Board authorized hereunder or heretofore issued and now outstanding.

*Section 2.* A special bond election shall be called and held in the District on Tuesday, November 8, 2016, to submit to the qualified electors of the District the question of whether bonds of the Board to the amount of \$387,000,000 shall be issued and sold for the purpose of raising money to pay all or a portion of the costs to acquire land; acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping new school facilities; and improving or rebuilding existing facilities under the charge of the Board, and, to the extent necessary, for providing moneys for the refunding, at or prior to the maturity thereof, of general obligation bonds of the Board authorized hereunder or heretofore issued and now outstanding.

*Section 3.* The question shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the District at the Bond Election and such Bond Election is hereby called to be held in the District on Tuesday, November 8, 2016 (the "*Election Date*"). The question shall be submitted in substantially the form set out in the form of ballot appearing in Section 4 hereof.

*Section 4.* The ballots to be used at the Bond Election shall comply in all respects with the requirements of Section 11-14-206 and Title 20A, Chapter 6, Part 1 of the Utah Code, and shall be in substantially the following form:

**PROPOSITION #1**

Shall the Board of Education (the “Board”) of Alpine School District, Utah (the “District”), be authorized to issue General Obligation Bonds (the “Bonds”) in a principal amount not to exceed Three Hundred Eighty Seven Million Dollars (\$387,000,000) for the purpose of paying all or a portion of the costs to acquire land; acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping new school facilities; improving or rebuilding existing facilities; and the authorization and issuance of the Bonds due and payable with a term not to exceed twenty (20) years from the date or dates of issuance of the Bonds?

**PROPERTY TAX COST OF BONDS**

The District has other outstanding bonds for which a tax decrease would occur upon the retirement of such bonds, which may not occur if the Bonds are issued. However, these outstanding bonds reduce over time such that it is expected that there will be no incremental property tax increase on residences and businesses within the District from current annual levels after the Bonds are issued.

If the Bonds are issued as planned, without regard to the existing taxes currently paid for existing bonds that will reduce over time, a property tax sufficient to pay debt service on the Bonds will be required over a period of twenty (20) years in the estimated amount of \$195.05 per year on a \$275,000 primary residence and in the estimated amount of \$354.64 per year on a business or secondary residence having the same value.

The foregoing information is only an estimate and is not a limit on the amount of taxes that the District may be required to levy to pay debt service on the Bonds. The District is obligated to levy taxes to the extent provided by law in order to pay the Bonds. The amounts are based on various assumptions and estimates, including estimated debt service on the Bonds and taxable values of property in the District.

**FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS**

**AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS**

Section 5. In satisfaction of the requirements of Section 11-14-318 of the Code, a public hearing shall be held by the Board on Tuesday, September 13, 2016, during the Board meeting that begins at 6:00 p.m., at 575 North 100 East, American Fork, Utah 84003, with respect to the issuance by the Board of general obligation bonds, if approved by eligible voters at the Bond Election, for the purposes set forth in Section 1 and the potential economic impact of the Project.

Section 6. The Business Administrator shall cause the “Notice of Public Hearing,” in substantially the form attached hereto as *Exhibit 1*, to be published (a) once each week for 2 consecutive weeks in *The Daily Herald*, a newspaper of general circulation in the District, with the first publication being at least 14 days prior to the date set for the public hearing and (b) on the Utah Public Notice Website (as of the date of this Resolution, <http://pmn.utah.gov>) at least 14 days prior to the date set for the public hearing.

Section 7. After the adoption of this Resolution and at least 75 days before the Bond Election, a certified copy hereof, which includes the ballot title and the ballot proposition, shall be furnished on behalf of the Board by Farnsworth Johnson PLLC, as bond counsel, to the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Utah and to the election officer.

Section 8. The Business Administrator and the County Clerks of Utah County, Utah and Salt Lake County, Utah (collectively, the “*County Clerks*”) are hereby authorized and directed to perform and do, and to cause to be performed and done, all things necessary to conduct the Bond Election in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution, Chapter 14, Title 11 of the Utah Code, and Title 20A of the Utah Code, each as election officer (each individually and collectively the “*Election Officer*”).

Section 9. The Bond Election shall be held in the same voting precincts and at the same polling places as those established for the regular election held on Tuesday, November 8, 2016 (the “*Election Day*”). The voting precincts and polling places shall be specified in the notice of the Bond Election, the form of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit 1*. The Election Officer is hereby requested, authorized and directed to make all preparations and take all actions necessary for the conduct of the Bond Election or required pursuant to the Election Code, Title 20A of the Utah Code.

Section 10. Notice of the Special Election shall be provided (a) by publishing once a week during at least 3 consecutive weeks a notice of election, signed by the Business Administrator, the first publication to be not less than 21 days nor more than 35 days before the Election Day, in *The Daily Herald*, a newspaper of general circulation in the District and (b) on a website established and maintained by the collective efforts of Utah’s newspapers (currently,

www.utahlegals.com) for the 3 weeks that immediately precede the Special Election. The notice shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as *Exhibit 2*.

*Section 11.* The officers and employees of the Board are authorized and directed to prepare and mail a voter information pamphlet or a notification thereof, including a plan of finance in compliance with Section 53A-18-102 of the Utah Code. The officers, employees and members of the Board are authorized and directed to prepare and submit to the Election Officer an argument and rebuttal argument in favor of the ballot proposition set forth in Section 4 hereof, in compliance with the Transparency of Ballot Propositions Act, Title 59, Chapter 1, Part 16 of the Utah Code.

*Section 12.* The Board shall meet as a board of canvassers no sooner than seven days and no later than 14 days after the Election Day, and if the majority of the votes cast at the Special Election are in favor of such proposition submitted, then the Board shall cause an entry of that fact to be made upon its minutes, and thereupon the Board shall be authorized to issue such bonds.

*Section 13.* The officers and employees of the Board are authorized to take such action as they may deem necessary in order to assure that the Bond Election does not violate any applicable state or federal law, including laws regarding the use of the electronic voting devices.

*Section 14.* This Resolution is a declaration of official intent under Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-2. In satisfaction of the requirements thereof:

(a) The Board is planning to make expenditures relative to the Project from the Capital Outlay Fund (the "*Fund*").

(b) Expenditures relating to paying the costs of the Project (i) have been paid within 60 days prior to the passage of this Resolution or (ii) will be paid on or after the passage of this Resolution (the "*Expenditures*").

(c) The Board reasonably expects to reimburse the Expenditures with proceeds of general obligation school building bonds, if any, authorized at the Bond Election, to be issued by the Board.

(d) The maximum principal amount of such bonds expected to be issued for the Expenditures to be made from the Fund is \$387,000,000.

*Section 15.* All acts and resolutions in conflict with this Resolution or any part thereof are hereby repealed.

*Section 16.* It is hereby declared that all parts of this Resolution are severable, and if any section, clause or provision of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid and unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of any such section, clause or provision shall not affect the remaining sections, clauses or provisions of this Resolution.

*Section 17.* Immediately after its adoption by at least two-thirds majority of the members of the Board, this Resolution shall be signed by the President or the Vice President and the Business Administrator, shall be sealed with the seal of the Board and shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose and shall take immediate effect.

**PROPERTY TAX COST OF BONDS**

The District has other outstanding bonds for which a tax decrease would occur upon the retirement of such bonds, which may not occur if the Bonds are issued. However, these outstanding bonds reduce over time such that it is expected that there will be no incremental property tax increase on residences and businesses within the District from current annual levels after the Bonds are issued.

If the Bonds are issued as planned, without regard to the existing taxes currently paid for existing bonds that will reduce over time, a property tax sufficient to pay debt service on the Bonds will be required over a period of twenty (20) years in the estimated amount of \$195.05 per year on a \$275,000 primary residence and in the estimated amount of \$354.64 per year on a business or secondary residence having the same value.

**GRANT OF EASEMENT  
(ACCESS)**

THIS GRANT OF EASEMENT is made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2016, by BOARD OF EDUCATION ALPINE SCHOOL DISTRICT (“**Grantor**”) to and for the benefit of CORPORATION OF THE PRESIDING BISHOP OF THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY SAINTS, a Utah corporation sole (“**Grantee**”). Grantor and Grantee are sometimes referred to herein individually as “**Party**” and collectively as “**Parties.**”

**RECITALS**

A. Grantor is the owner of certain real property located in the City of Orem, Utah County, Utah, identified as Tax Parcel No. 17:071:0055 and more particularly described on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein (the “**Grantor Property**”).

B. Grantee is the owner of certain real property located in the City of Orem, Utah County, Utah, identified as Tax Parcel No. 17:071:0002 and more particularly described on Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein (the “**Grantee Property**”). The Grantee Property is immediately adjacent to the Grantor Property.

C. Grantee has requested, and Grantor has agreed to grant to Grantee, a perpetual non-exclusive easement over and across a portion of the Grantor Property to provide for vehicular and pedestrian access to and from the Grantee Property.

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

NOW, THEREFORE, for the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Grantor hereby grants, conveys and warrants as follows:

1. **Grant of Easement.** Grantor grants, conveys and warrants to Grantee a perpetual non-exclusive easement (the “**Easement**”) on, over, and across that certain parcel described on

Exhibit C attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein (the "Easement Parcel"), for the purpose of providing pedestrian and vehicular access to and from the Grantee Property. The Easement Parcel is depicted on Exhibit D attached hereto.

2. **Access.** Grantee and its agents, employees, contractors, guests, invitees, and successors and assigns shall have the right at all times to enter on the Easement Parcel and otherwise make use of the Easement Parcel for the purposes permitted by this Grant of Easement. Grantor agrees not to obstruct Grantee's use of the Easement Parcel as granted herein.

3. **Maintenance.** The Parties anticipate that Grantor will maintain the Easement Parcel for its use as an access to the Grantor Property. Grantee, with written approval from the Grantor and at its own expense, may provide additional maintenance for the Easement Parcel which may include filling, grading, paving, patching, marking, sealing, snow plowing and/or snow and ice removal.

4. **Run with the Land/Successors.** The easement granted herein is perpetual and shall run with the land described herein, and the terms and conditions of this Grant of Easement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Parties, their successors and assigns.

5. **Miscellaneous.**

5.1. **Entire Agreement.** This Grant of Easement and any addenda or exhibits attached hereto and made a part hereof, contain the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the matters covered hereby, and no other agreement, statement or promise with respect to the subject matter hereof made by any Party, or to any employee, officer or agent of any Party, which is not contained herein or in another writing signed by the Parties, shall be binding or valid.

5.2. **Enforcement.** The Parties acknowledge that damages may not constitute an adequate remedy for a breach of this Grant of Easement. Accordingly, in addition to all rights and remedies available at law, the rights and obligations of Grantor and Grantee hereunder shall be enforceable by specific performance, injunction, and other equitable remedies.

5.3. **Attorneys' Fees.** In the event any Party, its successors or assigns, brings or commences legal proceedings to enforce any of the terms of this Grant of Easement, the prevailing party in such action shall have the right to recover reasonable attorneys' fees and costs from the other party, to be fixed by the court in the same action. The phrase "legal proceedings" shall include appeals from a lower court judgment. The phrase "prevailing party" shall mean the party that prevails in obtaining a remedy or relief which most nearly reflects the remedy or relief which the party sought.

5.4. **Waiver.** No failure by Grantor or Grantee to insist upon the strict performance of any covenant, duty, agreement or condition of this Grant of Easement or to exercise any right or remedy for a breach hereof shall constitute a waiver of any such breach or of such right or remedy or of any other covenant, agreement, term or condition.

5.5. **No Public Use/Dedication.** Nothing herein is intended to create any public rights in or public access to the Grantor Property. The Grantor Property and the Easement Parcel are and will at all times remain the private property of Grantor.


