



1300 West and Bennion STORM WATER CIP



This project will install curb, gutter and sidewalk along the east side of 1300 West between Bennion Blvd and 6460 South, and along Bennion Blvd. between 1530 West and 1300 West. This project has been on our capital improvement plan and is identified in the following map as project #15. This project is currently in design phase and project plans and specifications are scheduled to be done this summer and construction will start spring of 2017.

Storm Drain Inspection

The city is currently having 3d scanning of portions of the storm drain completed in the southwest corner of the city. This location corresponds with SLCO cleaning the storm drain the previous month. The scanning for this project has been completed and linked to the City’s GIS data. Currently the scans are being evaluated for potential areas in the storm drain that need to be addressed.



Park Projects

The city is in the process of planning/coordination and design on park facilities for Cabana Club and Vista Park.

Big T Recreation's quote for the playground equipment was selected for the Vista Park playground project. We are currently working with them and the community council on playground equipment selection and site layout.

Cabana Club is still working through the site layout with the community council.

Street Lighting

The city is in the process of upgrading street lighting at crosswalks within the city. Older street lights are being replaced with more efficient and brighter LED bulbs. Mid-block crossings that correspond with the safe school routes established by the Student Neighborhood Access Program (SNAP) are of particular focus for upgraded or new lighting.


Similar Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacon (RRFB) that were installed on 2700 West next to Bennion Junior High School will be installed on the two mid-block cross walks on 2700 West, one just south of 5280 South and the other just north of Central Park Way.

We have been updating the City's GIS mapping to allow for outages and street light upgrades requests to be performed using GIS handheld mobile devices. This collection method should be implemented this week.



UPCOMING PROJECTS

Storm Sewer System Improvements Project (EPA Grant Program)



In order to effectively manage the storm drainage system to maintain storm water quality, plan for capital improvement projects, and minimize catastrophic events, it is critical to know where the pipes, manholes, boxes, open channels, and other storm drainage facilities are located. The project will use a camera with a GPS locator to find locations of the storm drain in high priority areas; this is based on the age of the infrastructure, knowledge of the system, and areas of past flooding. This information will be used to obtain and maintain infrastructure quality.

This project has multiple benefits for the storm water system that include updated storm water inventory with GIS, removal of silt and debris from the storm water pipes, added maintenance to the storm water system, adding devices to help clean the storm water, disconnecting storm drainage from irrigation systems and reduce flooding in areas.

We are currently identifying locations that need to be investigated based on past GPS/GIS data on the storm drain system. Mapping and specifications for video observation and small construction projects are being prepared.

UDOT UPDATES

Information from UDOT

I-215 reconstruction continues in both directions from 4700 South to S.R. 201. Please be aware of the following project activities and upcoming traffic impacts:

Mainline I-215

- All southbound traffic between 3500 South and 4700 South is now shifted onto the new concrete median and work has begun on the travel lanes in this area.
- Crews are removing existing concrete on southbound I-215 between 3500 South and 4700 South during daytime hours through early next week. Asphalt paving is scheduled to begin Monday, September 26 during overnight hours, at which time **nearby businesses and residents should expect additional noise and vibration**. Concrete paving is scheduled to begin in early October.
- **Southbound traffic will be shifted onto the new concrete median between S.R. 201 and 3500 South** in late October in order for crews to begin reconstruction on travel lanes in that area. More detail about this traffic shift will be provided in the coming weeks.
- From 300 East to Redwood Road, crews will be completing work in the shoulder, adding signage, and finalizing striping this Saturday and Sunday, September 24 and 25. Drivers can expect daytime lane closures on mainline I-215 in this area while this work takes place.

4700 South Interchange

- The westbound 4700 South on-ramp to northbound I-215 is closed through late September for concrete reconstruction. Crews are scheduled to pave the ramp overnight this Saturday, September 24. Nearby businesses and residents should expect additional noise and vibration during this work.
- Crews have completed one half of the southbound I-215 off-ramp to 4700 South and switched traffic to the outside lanes to work on the second half of the ramp last week. Concrete paving is scheduled for Tuesday, September 27.
- Crews are nearly finished with one half of the eastbound 4700 South on-ramp to southbound I-215 and are scheduled to switch traffic and begin work on the second half of the ramp as early as this evening.

- All concrete breaking at the 4700 South interchange will occur during the day, however, nearby businesses and residents should still expect some noise and vibration during both daytime and nighttime hours as ramps are rebuilt.
- Drivers should expect long-term traffic shifts on I-215 ramps and overnight lane closures on 4700 South, beginning at 8 p.m. nightly.
- All work at the 4700 South interchange is scheduled to be complete in October.

S.R. 201

- Crews are scheduled begin work on the eastbound S.R. 201 ramp to southbound I-215 in mid-October. This ramp will be reconstructed one half at a time and will remain open to drivers. Nearby businesses and residents should expect additional noise and vibration during the construction.

3500 South Interchange

- Work continues on the bridge deck on I-215 at 3500 South. Drivers should expect overnight lane closures on 3500 South beginning early next week.

3800 South Bridge

- Crews will begin bridge deck demolition on southbound side of the 3800 bridge structure on Monday, September 26. Drivers can expect lane closures on 3800 South while this work takes place overnight for approximately one week.

As a reminder, travel lanes are open in each direction during daytime hours Monday through Friday and are reduced to two lanes in each direction during nights and weekends. All lanes are shifted and narrower throughout the work zone, so drivers should use caution and adhere to the 60 mph speed limit. ENVIRONMENTAL TRAFFIC STUDY AT BANGERTER 5400 & SOUTH

Upcoming Work

This week, crews are working to remove median barrier in the north side of the intersection in anticipation of a traffic switch. The signal at the 5400 South/Bangerter Highway intersection will be replaced and the intersection will be striped to a new configuration next weekend.

The southbound portion of the Continuous Flow Intersection (CFI) will be restriped to a traditional intersection. Drivers traveling south on Bangerter Highway will use a center

turn lane at the intersection to turn left. Northbound traffic will continue to use the existing CFI to make left turns.

5400 South/Bangerter Highway Jordan Aqueduct Relocation Project Overview

To prepare for the construction of a freeway-style interchange at 5400 South and Bangerter Highway, UDOT will relocate a segment of the Jordan Aqueduct that extends north and south. Work on the aqueduct relocation began September 12 and extend through February 2017.

As part of its efforts to keep traffic moving on Bangerter Highway now and into the future, UDOT will construct freeway-style interchanges at 5400, 7000, 9000 and 11400 South. When completed, the improvements will be similar to the new interchanges on Bangerter Highway at 7800 South and at Redwood Road.

The interchange project requires some homes and businesses to be purchased, and UDOT is currently working to acquire these properties for the interchange work. A Design-Build Contractor will be selected in early 2017 and construction will begin soon after, extending through late 2018.

2016 STATE AND PRESIDENTIAL ELECTIONS

The 2016 General Election will be conducted mainly by mail throughout Salt Lake County. General Election Day is **Tuesday, November 8, 2016**. To see if you are currently registered to vote or to find out how to do so, visit www.GOT-VOTE.org. Salt Lake County will mail ballots to the home addresses of registered voters the week of October 11th and a postage-paid return envelope will be provided. Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked *no later than*

November 7th, the day before Election Day. Ballots returned by mail may be tracked

online to ensure that they are received by Salt Lake County Elections at www.GOT-VOTE.org. Ballots may also be returned in person to other locations throughout the County. For a list of drop-off locations, visit www.GOT-VOTE.org. Early voting will be open at various locations throughout the County on October 26, 27, 28 and November 2, 3, and 4 (Wednesdays, Thursdays & Fridays only). Taylorsville City Hall will be an Early Voting Location on these dates between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. (2600 W. Taylorsville Blvd., Room 110).
