

FY16 Title II Funding Expenditure Recommendation

Background: The Title II Formula Grant is offered through the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) to ensure State is in compliance with the core requirements of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDP) of 1974, as amended in 2002. Utah Board of Juvenile Justice manages the fund by identifying areas of focus and set priorities. Funding recommendations are based on those priorities.

<p><i>Utah Board of Juvenile Justice</i></p> <p>Compliance Monitoring Program</p>	<p>The Utah Board of Juvenile Justice of the Utah Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice requests funding to support the Compliance Monitoring Program. The fund is to be expended on salary for Compliance Monitor to carry out the program's objective. The objective of the grant is to improve the juvenile justice system in Utah by monitoring and reporting on the secure confinement of youth statewide, as required by the JJDP, to prevent the inappropriate confinement of youth thus enable Utah's compliance with the JJDP. The Act's mandates include deinstitutionalization of status offenders and nonoffenders/DSO; removal of juveniles from adult jails and lockups; and the sight and sound separation of juvenile offenders from adult offenders. Programmatic activities include monitoring secure confinement of youth statewide in adult jails, municipal lockups, and juvenile care facilities. Utah must monitor and annually report on the state's level of compliance with each of these mandates in order to receive Title II funding. Juvenile confinement data will be compiled by the Compliance Monitor into a OJJDP Compliance Reporting Tool, which will be submitted to OJJDP of the U.S. DOJ as required by the Act.</p>	<p><i>On-going</i></p>	<p>\$95,729</p>
<p><i>Local Law Enforcement Agencies</i></p> <p>Jail Removal Program</p>	<p>The Utah Board of Juvenile Justice on behalf of rural Law Enforcement Agencies requests funding to support the Juvenile Jail Removal Program. Objective of the program is to prevent the inappropriate confinement of youth in Utah's adult jails and municipal lockups and to enable Utah's compliance with the JJDP.</p> <p>The Compliance Monitor will make arrangements with the Kane County Sheriff's Office to provide nonsecure supervision for youth at Lake Powell for the 2017 Memorial Day, 4th of July, and Labor Day weekend. Incidents that occur during this holiday weekend jeopardizes Utah's compliance with the JJDP Act, therefore, nonsecure supervision arrangements are essential to facilitate the release or transfer of youth to appropriate juvenile care facilities during this momentous holiday weekend.</p>	<p><i>On-going</i></p>	<p>\$22,000</p>

	The Compliance Monitor will also make arrangements with rural law enforcement officials (Roosevelt PD, Millard Co. Sheriff's Office, and Kane Co. Sheriff's Office) to transport youth to juvenile care facilities (as needed) throughout the grant period of Oct, 1 2016 through September 30, 2017, to prevent the inappropriate confinement of youth in Utah's adult jails and municipal lockups.		
<i>Utah Board of Juvenile Justice</i> Disproportionate Minority Contact Coordinator	The Utah Board of Juvenile Justice seeks on-going funding to support the position of the DMC Coordinator. The DMC Coordinator serves as staff to the DMC Subcommittee and local working groups. The Coordinator will provide assistance with meeting planning, coordination, and staff logistic and administrative support to the Subcommittee. The Coordinator will provide relevant information and research, national and local, on the issues to keep the subcommittee abreast of the latest trends, proposed plans and recommendations in the juvenile justice field. Additional, the DMC Coordinator will oversee the development and implementation of the State DMC Compliance plan, act as grant administrator relevant to DMC Programing, provide training and technical assistance to appropriate stakeholders, and conduct public education, coordination, and outreach relevant to DMC issues. DMC Coordinator carries out activities and objectives as directed by the Subcommittee. Future works will also include coordination with local working groups to implement their strategic plans.	<i>On-going</i>	\$93,287
<i>Utah Juvenile Court</i> JJDPA Compliance - CARE Database Portal Development	The Utah Board of Juvenile Justice seeks one-time funding to pay for Juv. Court's staff time to develop CARE Database Portal for CCJJ staffs (Compliance Monitor and Juvenile Justice Specialist) access to the necessary data for annual report to the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. The purpose is to ensure Utah is in compliance with the core protections as provided under the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, as amended in 2002.	<i>One-time</i>	\$20,000
