



# 1300 West and Bennion STORM WATER CIP



This project will install curb, gutter and sidewalk along the east side of 1300 West between Bennion Blvd., and 6460 South and along Bennion Blvd. between 1530 West and 1300 West. This project has been identified on our capital improvement plan and is identified in the following map as Project #15. This project is currently in design phase and project plans and specifications are scheduled to be done this summer and construction will start spring of 2017. Initial cost estimate put the combine total of the two projects at approximately \$1 million dollars.

## Storm Drain Inspection


The city is currently having 3d scanning of portions of the storm drain completed in the southwest corner of the city. This location corresponds with Salt Lake County cleaning the storm drain the previous month. The scanning for this project has been completed and linked to the city's GIS data. Currently the scans are being evaluated for potential areas in the storm drain that need to be addressed.



## Park Projects

The city is in the process of planning/coordination and design on park facilities for Cabana Club and Vista Park. Vista Park is on track to be completed in Nov. Big T Recreation was selected to be the playground equipment provider and installer. Strong Solutions and Albretsen's Concrete are on board to do the earthworks and concrete work. Earthworks should start around the 24<sup>th</sup> of this month.

Cabana Club is still working through the site layout with the community council.

## Street Lighting

The city is in the process of upgrading street lighting at crosswalks within the city. Older street lights are being replaced with more efficient and brighter LED bulbs. Mid-block crossings that correspond with the safe school routes established by the Student Neighborhood Access Program (SNAP) are of particular focus for upgraded or new lighting.


Similar Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacon (RRFB) that were installed on 2700 West next to Bennion Junior High School and will be installed on the two mid-block cross walks on 2700 West, one just south of 5280 South and the other just north of Central Park Way. Two additional locations, 3200 West and 5620 South & 4800 South and 1365 West are currently under order with the county to have RRFB placed.

We have been updating the City's GIS mapping to allow for outages and street light upgrades requests to be performed using GIS handheld mobile devices. This collection method should be implemented this week.

Cost Estimates for the replacement of the City's aging street lights have been completed and will be presented to the city council shortly.



### Storm Sewer System Improvements Project (EPA Grant Program)



In order to effectively manage the storm drainage system to maintain storm water quality, plan for capital improvement projects, and minimize catastrophic events it is critical to know where the pipes, manholes, boxes, open channels, and other storm drainage facilities are located. The project will use a camera with GPS locator to find locations of the storm drain in high priority areas; this is based on the age of the infrastructure, knowledge of the system, and areas of past flooding. This information will be used to obtain and maintain infrastructure quality.

This project has multiple benefits for the storm water system that include updated storm water inventory with GIS, removal of silt and debris from the storm water pipes, added maintenance to the storm water system, adding devices to help clean the storm water, disconnecting storm drainage from irrigation systems and reduce flooding in areas.

We are currently identifying locations that need to be investigated based on past GPS/GIS data on the storm drain system. Mapping and specifications for video observation and small construction project are being prepared.

## **UDOT UPDATES**

*Information from UDOT*

I-215 reconstruction continues in both directions from 4700 South to S.R. 201. Please be aware of the following project activities and upcoming traffic impacts:

### **Mainline I-215**

- All southbound traffic between 3500 South and 4700 South is now shifted onto the new concrete median and work has begun on the travel lanes in this area.
- **Southbound traffic will be shifted onto the new concrete median between S.R. 201 and 3500 South** in late October in order for crews to begin reconstruction on travel lanes in that area. More detail about this traffic shift will be provided in the coming weeks.

### **S.R. 201**

- This ramp will be reconstructed one half at a time and will remain open to drivers. Nearby businesses and residents should expect additional noise and vibration during the construction.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL TRAFFIC STUDY AT BANGERTER 5400 & SOUTH**

### **5400 South/Bangerter Highway Jordan Aqueduct Relocation Project Overview**

To prepare for the construction of a freeway-style interchange at 5400 South and Bangerter Highway, UDOT will relocate a segment of the Jordan Aqueduct that extends north and south. Work on the aqueduct relocation began September 12 and extend through February 2017.

As part of its efforts to keep traffic moving on Bangerter Highway now and into the future, UDOT will construct freeway-style interchanges at 5400, 7000, 9000 and 11400 South. When completed, the improvements will be similar to the new interchanges on Bangerter Highway at 7800 South and at Redwood Road.

The interchange project requires some homes and businesses to be purchased, and UDOT is currently working to acquire these properties for the interchange work. A Design-Build Contractor will be selected in early 2017 and construction will begin soon after, extending through late 2018.

The 2016 General Election will be conducted mainly by mail throughout Salt Lake County. General Election Day is **Tuesday, November 8, 2016**. To see if you are currently registered to vote or to find out how to do so, visit [www.GOT-VOTE.org](http://www.GOT-VOTE.org). Salt Lake County will mail ballots to the home addresses of registered voters the week of October 11<sup>th</sup> and a postage-paid return envelope will be provided. Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked *no later than*

*November 7<sup>th</sup>, the day before Election Day*. Ballots returned by mail may be tracked online to ensure that they are received by Salt Lake County Elections at [www.GOT-VOTE.org](http://www.GOT-VOTE.org). Ballots may also be returned in person to other locations throughout the County. For a list of drop-off locations, visit [www.GOT-VOTE.org](http://www.GOT-VOTE.org). Early voting will be open at various locations throughout the County on October 26, 27, 28 and November 2, 3, and 4 (Wednesdays, Thursdays & Fridays only). Taylorsville City Hall will be an Early Voting Location on these dates between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. (2600 W. Taylorsville Blvd., Room 110).
