
Calls For Service By Source




Calls for Service by Priority

RE: **CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION, WEEKLY PUBLIC WORKS REPORT**

PUBLIC WORKS TRANSITION:

- See attached Chart: The chart shows what was originally planned during the initial transition phase. Staff will review with the City Council the line items on this chart.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES:

- With the leaves dropping from the trees, there has been a great deal of street sweeping and grate cleaning to keep the storm drain system clear of debris.
- Crews have been doing cold patching on the main roads throughout the city.
- Tree trimming has been occurring throughout the city where trees are overhanging into the roads. This allows trucks (snow plows, garbage, and delivery trucks) to navigate through the neighborhoods without getting damaged or having to drive down the center of the roads creating a safety issue.
- Crews are training in their snow plow areas. They are driving their assigned truck with snow plows and sander box. Where there is a less experienced driver, a seasoned driver is along for the ride to point out ideas of the best ways to snow plow and area.
- City Hall Assisting
- Snow plow bits on the three new trucks
- Sign repair and maintenance
- Blue Staking and right of way permitting

UDOT PROJECT UPDATES:

- **Wasatch Blvd:** The paving is completed on this project so night work has concluded. The remaining work is completing the UDOT punch list items and final pavement markings through the corridor.
- **Knudsen Corner (Hydro-Demolition on I-215):** In speaking with the UDOT Public Information Officer, she has informed me that the hydro-demolition will be completed by the end of the month. All other work

to finalize the project will be completed by the end of November. I was informed that this is about a month ahead of the schedule.

- **Wasatch Blvd. High-T Intersection:** UDOT has hired an engineering firm to work on the final design of the project. Staff has met on numerous occasions with UDOT to express our concerns about the issues from the City's point of view, i.e. the continuous right hand turn to the west, the traffic pattern for the trucks delivery to the treatment plant, and the backup of traffic during peak times. Staff met as early as last week with UDOT and their engineer and has another appointment for tomorrow to once again express our interest in the how we feel the project should look. The engineer hired for this project is Parsons Transportation Group
- **Fort Union Pedestrian Crossing:** The project has been bid and Acme Construction has won the bid based on a low bid process. They have received their notice to proceed and we expect a 30 day project.
- **Fort Union and Highland Drive Intersection Widening:** This project is still in the right of way acquisition phase. We are working with various property owners to finalize agreements for the project. A construction engineering management company has been selected through the UDOT process and we are in the contract negotiation phase. The company chosen is PEC Engineers and they will be working with the design engineers, the city, the public information team, and the contractor to ensure the project is completed per the specs and contract agreements.

OTHER PROJECTS IN THE CITY:

- **Cottonwood Improvement Sewer Line Upgrade:** This project goes from 3000 East to Pippin Drive. This is approximately 4,000 ft. sewer line upgrade. The contractor is aware that they need to be off of the road before snow comes. It is their intention to be off of the road with final asphalt by November 1st. If weather allows though, they will continue to get as far as they can. What they don't complete this year they will finish in the spring of 2017. Contract is taking longer than expected with the intersection of Ft Union and 3000 East and so many utility conflicts that were an unknown.
- **Questar Gas:** Wasatch Blvd: at the Green Hill subdivision. This is an upgrade in size to the gas line. Services are being added to the new line.
