Funding Provisions. 100 [A.](1) An LEA shall receive a payment designated for each high school from which 101 students graduated before the end of the twelfth grade year. 102 [B.](2) [Payment provisions: 103 -(1) An LEA[s] shall receive payment for one-half of the designated [C]centennial 104 [S]scholarship amount for each student reported as having graduated at the conclusion of 105 the eleventh grade year on the S-3 report in the fiscal year following the student's 106 graduation. 107 ([2]3)(a) An LEA[s] shall receive payment based on a percentage of the 108 [C]centennial [S]scholarship amount for each student reported as graduating during the 109 twelfth grade year. 110 (b) [These students] A student described in Subsection (3)(a) shall also be listed on 111 the S-3 report and payment shall be made to the LEA in the fiscal year following the 112 students' graduation. 113 (c) An LEA[s] shall receive payment for schools operating on the quarter or 114 trimester system for each early graduating student according to the following schedule: 115 ([a]i) [E]end of first quarter of 12th grade year: 75 percent of one-half of the 116 [C]centennial [S]scholarship amount; 117 ([b]ii) [E]end of second quarter of 12th grade year: 50 percent of one-half of the 118 (C)centennial (S)scholarship amount;

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- ([d]iv) [E]end of first trimester of 12th grade year: 67 percent of one-half of the [C]centennial [S]scholarship amount; or
  - ([e]v) [E]end of second trimester of 12th grade year: 33 percent of one-half of the

[C]centennial [S]scholarship amount.

[C.](4) A student who graduates from high school at the conclusion of the eleventh grade year or during the twelfth grade year shall be entitled to a partial tuition scholarship in the form of the [E]early [G]graduation [C]centennial [S]scholarship [C]certificate to be used at a Utah public college, university, community college, [applied technology center]technical college, or any other institution in Utah accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission that offers post-secondary courses.

- (5) The post-secondary institution selected by a student who receives a centennial scholarship shall complete the [E]early [G]graduation [C]centennial [S]scholarship [C]certificate and submit it to the [Utah State Office of Education]Superintendent.
- (6) Upon receipt of the [E]early [G]graduation [G]centennial [S]scholarship [G]certificate, the [Utah State Office of Education]Suprintendent shall verify the information, and reimburse the institution an amount set forth in the following schedule in the fiscal year during which the student enrolls in a post-secondary institution.
- (7) Except as provided in Section R277-703-7, [Ŧ]to be eligible for the scholarship, the student must enroll in an eligible post-secondary institution within one calendar year of graduation.
- ([1]8)(a) [The]A student who graduates at the end of the eleventh grade year shall receive a full [C]centennial [S]scholarship.
- ([2]b) [The]A student who graduates at the end of the first quarter of the twelfth grade year shall receive 75 percent of the [C]centennial [S]scholarship amount.

## R277-703-7. Student Deferrals.

(1) Except as provided in Subsection (5) and as allowed in Subsection

155	53A-15-102(4), a student who is eligible for a centennial scholarship, as described in
156	Subsection 53A-15-102(3) and this R277-703, may make a request to the Board that the
157	Board defer consideration of the student for the scholarship for a set period of time up to
158	five years.
159	(2) The Superintendent shall:
160	(a) create an application for a student seeking a deferral to request the deferral;
161	<u>and</u>
162	(b) make the application described in Subsection (2)(a) available online.
163	(3) A student seeking a deferral described in Subsection (1) shall file a request for
164	deferral with the Superintendent on or before:
165	(a) the second Monday in February for a student who graduated on or before
166	December 31 of a school year; and
167	(b) the second Monday in July for a student who graduated on or before June 15
168	of a school year.
169	(4)(a) If a student's request for a deferral is denied by the Superintendent, the
170	student may request an appeal of the Superintendent's decision.
171	(b) The student's appeal will reviewed by the Law and Licensing Committee within
172	60 days of the student's appeal.
173	(c) The Superintendent shall inform a student requesting appeal of the Law and
174	Licensing Committee's decision.
175	(5) A student's centennial scholarship expires five years from the date the eligible
176	student graduated.
