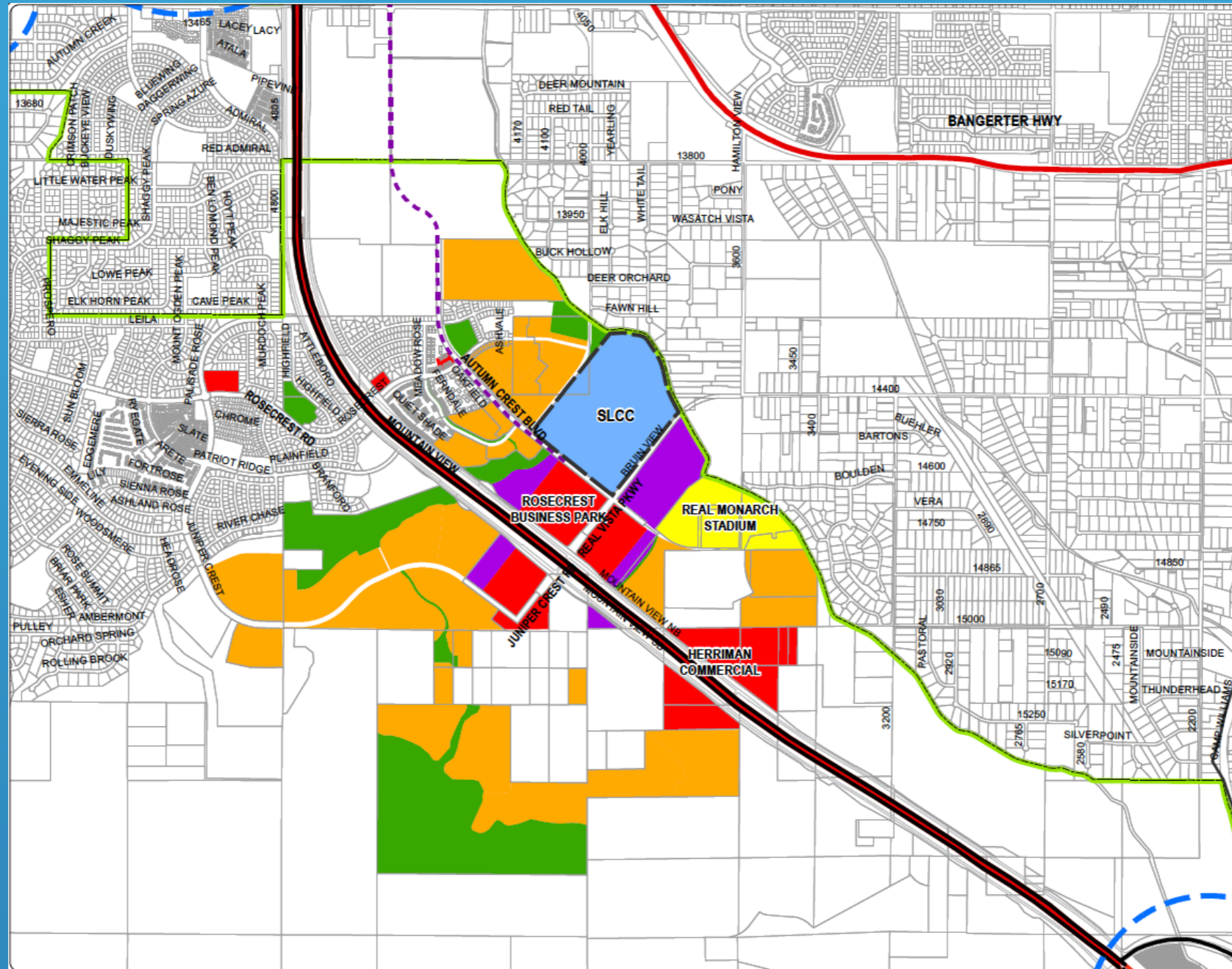

Supports Master Plan

2008

- ▶ Institutional Master Plan approved by Board of Regents (underrepresentation in southwest quadrant of Salt Lake Valley)

2011

- ▶ Approved by Board of Trustees, Board of Regents and Building Board to expand to Southwest quadrant
- ▶ State of Utah appropriation - \$3 million
- ▶ Sorenson Legacy Foundation - 60 acres

2012

- ▶ Master plan for Herriman approved by Board of Trustees and Board of Regents

2015 to present

- ▶ City of Herriman perimeter infrastructure investment for roads and city utilities - \$12 million
- ▶ SLCC Infrastructure Funds - \$10 million
- ▶ Alternative Funding Opportunities:
 - City of Herriman - \$1 million
 - U of U - \$5 million
 - Private donors - \$2.4 million

Supports Essential Local-Community Needs

- ▶ Herriman and South Jordan projected to grow 158% - a population increase of approx. 72,000 to 175,000 between 2010 and 2050
- ▶ 19 high schools and 10 middle schools in proximity to Herriman campus footprint
- ▶ 4,997 9th graders | 4,388 10th graders currently enrolled
- ▶ Current infrastructure at Jordan and Taylorsville campuses cannot support this level of growth

Supports Essential Local-Community Needs

Jordan campus:

- ▶ Currently at capacity
- ▶ Allied Health focus
- ▶ 1,566 FTE | 4,280 Headcount

Herriman campus

- ▶ General Education | (2+2)
- ▶ 1,150 FTE | 2,125 Headcount at opening
- ▶ 3,900 FTE | 6,750 Headcount by 2025

Supports Essential Local-Community Needs

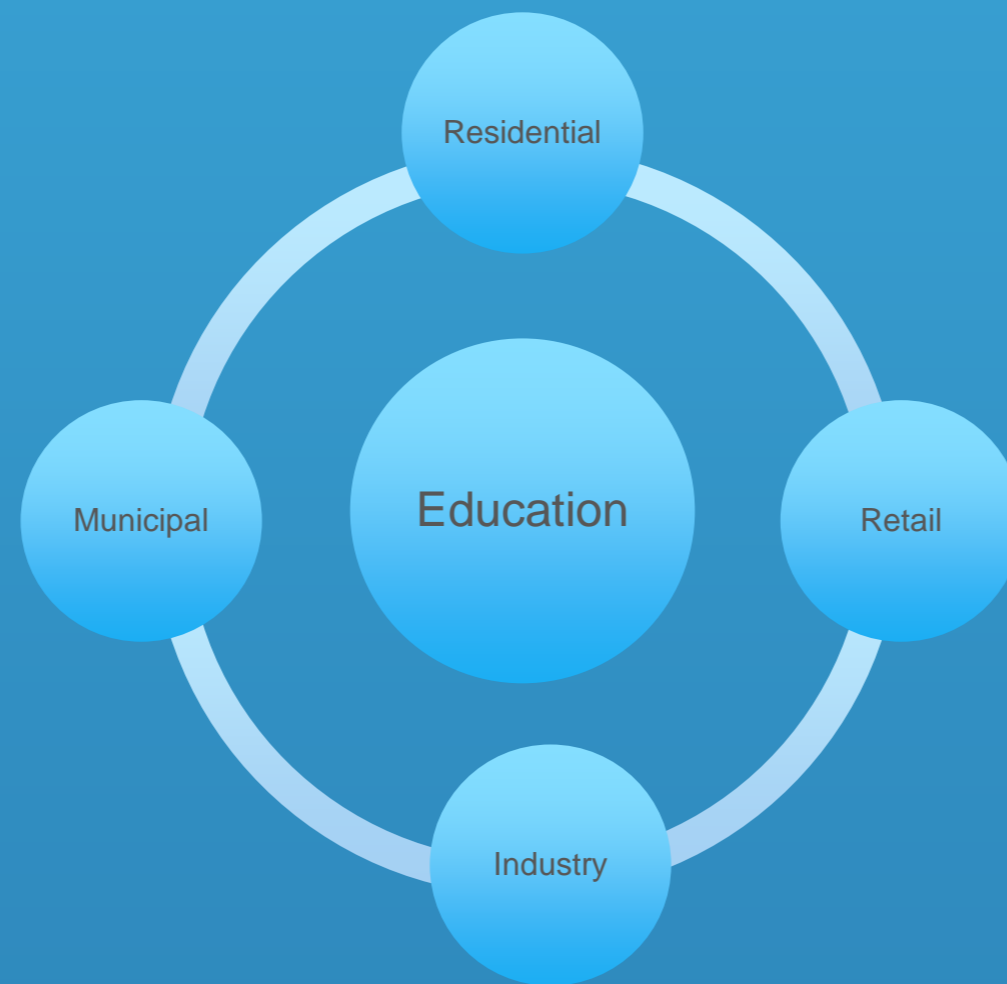

Supports Essential Local-Community Needs



Addresses Critical Academic and Workforce Program Needs

- ▶ Innovative partnership with U of U to co-locate associate and bachelor's degrees; and staff and services in one building
- ▶ Courses offered will include general education and introductory program coursework in three of GOED's targeted industries:
 - ▶ Financial Services
 - ▶ IT & Software Development
 - ▶ Life Sciences
- ▶ Earn certificate or 2-year degree at SLCC - remain on campus for completion of bachelor's degree with U of U (2+2+2)
- ▶ Full range of student support services



Cost-Effective Solutions

- ▶ Consolidation of O&M to serve two institutions leads to economies of scale
- ▶ Water-wise campus and solar electricity generation considered for energy efficiency; building will meet the state's HPBS (High Performance Building Standard)
- ▶ Herriman City infrastructure currently in place
- ▶ Standard design and construction approach
- ▶ Most cost-efficient route for future grads (2+2+2)

Project Costs

Total Project Cost - \$50 million

- ▶ Infrastructure Cost - \$18 million (covered)
- ▶ Building Cost - \$32 million – \$356 per square foot
