Senior Meals: \$550,000



One-time funding for meals is expiring which eliminates 66,650 meals in FY19.

Add \$550,000 in on-going funding to the base budget of the Division of Aging and Adult Services for Meals on Wheels and Senior Center meals so we can continue to serve seniors who rely on these meals.


Seniors receiving meals report fewer falls. In 2013 senior falls in Utah cost \$105 MILLION.²



We provided more than 1.8 million meals in FFY16 in Utah, helping 31,696 seniors continue to live at home.


