Councilor Frazier made a motion to pay the bills. Councilor Wilmoth seconded the motion, all voted in favor

3. NEW BUSINESS

A. Tara Ames – Kamas Valley Youth City Council

Tara is forming a Kamas valley youth council. The council will consist of youth that are high school age. They will pick youth from incorporated and unincorporated areas of Summit County. This would introduce the younger generation of how government works. It would also give them a voice to express concerns they have. There are youth councils from all over the State of Utah. They are required to attend at least on City Council meeting a year. Once a year they have the opportunity to go to the State Capital and meet with legislators. Tara is asking for Oakley City's support of the Council. She has met with Kamas City and Francis; both Cities have given their support for the council. They would need at least one representative from the City Council to be a contact person for the youth council.

The Mayor and the Council think it's a good idea. Councilor Frazier agreed to be the contact person. Tara stated they hope to have their first meeting by the end of September.

B. Tom Smart – update on UORG grant and plans to finish trail

49 Councilor Smart said the trail around the park is almost finished. They used 30 loads of roto-mill
50 around the park. There is a part on the north side that needs 2 more loads of roto-mill. Councilor
51 Smart is talking with Wellers to see if they will be a rodeo sponsor and donate the roto-mill.

52 Joe Santos has been working on the engineering for the camp ground. He handed out an aerial
53 view of the project (see attachment #A). The image shows the tightest circular but can be engineered
54 wider. The Council thought the circular needs to be wider if they have the room. The biggest
55 problem will be getting the grade right.

56 Councilor Smart is pushing ahead on the pavilion with Sun Rock. Three trusses will cost around
57 \$21,000.00.

58 Councilor Smart is also working on a grant from UDOT. This grant is due by October 1st. The
59 grant is between 25,000.00 and \$35,000.00.

60 There was a discussion about refinishing the red barn floor. The cost for that is around
61 \$4,000.00.

63 C. Parking lot at Stevens Grove

64
65 There is an area that has been put aside at the entrance of the grove that would be good for a
66 parking lot. It wouldn't take too much to flatten it out. When things slow down Dallas could level it out.
67 The Council agreed to work towards that.

69 D. Discussion of the Community Dinner

71 Mayor Woolstenhulme reminded the Council of the Community dinner on September 17, 2018.
72 He would like the Council there to start cooking at 5:00. The dinner will start at 6:00 p.m. He asked if the
73 staff would have everything ready for the dinner.
