A. Welcome & Introductions: Mayor Woolstenhulme

B. Pledge of Allegiance & Prayer: Pledge by Councilor Rydalch and prayer by Councilor Frazier

C. Approval of Minutes –  
January 29, 2019

*Councilor Rydalch made a motion to approve the minutes as amended of January 29, 2019.  
Councilor Wilmoth seconded the motion, all voted in favor*

D. Report and Approval of Bills to be paid

*Councilor Wilmoth made a motion to pay the bills. Councilor Hoggan seconded the motion, all voted in favor*

**3. NEW BUSINESS**

A. Possible motion to award water improvement bids

Mayor Woolstenhulme explained the City had received 2 bids to re-route the water lines coming out of the Humbug Well. Currently the water goes to the Oakley Artesian bottling plant first. In order to be in compliance with the State water requirements a new line needs to come from the Humbug Well to Oakley's tank. A separate line will then be installed to deliver water to the bottling plant. There were 2 bids received for the project. MC Construction bid the project at \$206,162.00 and England Constructions bid was \$281,605.00. Aqua Engineering certified both bids were equal to the work being done. Most of the construction can be done without shutting down the well.

There was a discussion about how much of the bond money had been used. After this work is completed the City will have spent around \$446,000.00 of the bond money. Councilor Wilmoth asked what further work needed to be done to be in compliance with the State. Chad stated that the 500

47 gallon tank needed to be resurfaced at a cost of approximately \$30,000.00. The fencing around the  
48 cottonwood spring needs to be completed. He and Dallas should be able to complete the fencing.  
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51 ***Councilor Hoggan made a motion to award the water improvement bid to MC Construction***  
52 ***Company. Councilor Rydalch seconded the motion, all voted in favor***  
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B. Ute Football – Mike Osguthorpe

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56 Camille Osguthorpe was at the meeting representing the Ute football. They would like to use  
57 the fields again this year for practice and to hold some of their games. They will start practicing July 29.  
58 2019 and end November 2, 2019. They practice Monday thru Friday 3 to 8 pm with games being held on  
59 Saturday. Games start August 17, 2019, the conference usually hold 5 games up here. They use the 2  
60 fields on the east of the complex and occasionally a third field is needed. If any teams make it to the  
61 playoff they would need the lights turned on for those practices. They will pay the fee to have them  
62 turned on. The Council agreed to let the Ute football teams use the fields.  
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C. Oakley Artesian Water Company

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66 No one was able to attend the meeting. Councilor Frazier said that in reviewing the contract  
67 with the water company it stated that they would pay a \$10,000.00 annual water reservation fee. He  
68 isn't sure they have been keeping up with that. David Church has the contract and hopefully the City  
69 will have some answers when he reviews it.

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D. Travis LeFay – Snow removal in North Bench Farms

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73 Travis stated he has a foot of snow in his driveway that 80% of the neighbors don't have. He  
74 knows it's possible to not leave as much snow in his driveway. He thinks if the snowplow operator would  
75 just turn his blade to the left it would solve the problem.

76 The Mayor explained that the problem is everywhere. When State or County drivers push snow  
77 it ends up in everyone's driveway as well. There is nowhere to put the snow in the subdivision and they  
78 understand the issues, but there just isn't anything they can do.

96 coming out. Councilor Frazier will see if there is more grant money available.
