Matters for Discussion

1. Parental Leave Discussion. Council Member Kindred invited a representative from Salt Lake City and Salt Lake County to attend this evening's meeting to discuss Parental Leave and how they run this program in their organization.

Salt Lake County representative, Nilsa Carter, said the Salt Lake County parental leave policy was passed in August 2017. Their policy allows for six weeks of paid leave upon birth or adoption of a child.

Salt Lake City Representative, Carolyn Campbell, said Salt Lake City's policy was put into place at the beginning of 2017. Their policy is similar to Salt Lake County.

Council Member Kindred asked how parental leave is budgeted for in their entities.

Ms. Carter said Salt Lake County didn't not look at this policy as a budget item. They looked at how this policy would affect business rather than cost. The County didn't feel there would be a financial burden as paid leave would be paid regardless of this policy or not.

Ms. Campbell said Salt Lake City has \$170,000 budgeted for this benefit. Salt Lake City said this benefit is not just an expense but it is a retention tool for the City.

Finance Director, Kyle Kershaw addressed the information sheet given to the Council. A copy is attached and incorporated by this reference. He said this sheet outlines the total possible costs for parental leave. The costs were identified by having to bring in extra help to cover the areas of the City that would be short staffed due to someone being out on leave. Salt Lake County and Salt Lake City have a lot more employees than South Salt Lake so they may not have the problem of being short staffed or having to bring in an extra employee.

Ms. Campbell said that there are certain positions that Salt Lake City has to account for overtime or temporary help. Salt Lake City had to budget accordingly for these instances.

City Staff and the Council discussed where the budgeted amount came from and why that number may be different from Salt Lake City or Salt Lake County.

2. Budget Basics. Mr. Kershaw presented Budget Basics to the Council. A copy is attached and incorporated by this reference.

The meeting adjourned at 7:02 p.m.





Capital Improvements Fund

Used for large equipment acquisitions and infrastructure improvments recommended by General Fund departments.

Reasons to have a Capital Improvements Fund:

- 1. To remove large and/or infrequent expenditures from the General Fund which leads to more consistant comparisons of annual departmental operating costs.
- 2. Large reserves of funds can accumulate to finance large projects and acquisitions. No restrictions on fund balance levels.

Capital Improvement Fund revenue consists primarily of an allocation of sales taxes, grants/assistance, appropriations of fund balance.

Enterprise (Utility) Funds

Used in order to deliver a specific service, or utility, to residents and businesses

Currently the City has three enterprise funds:

Water Utility Fund Sewer Utility Fund Solid Waste Utility Fund

Revenue is generated by assessing fees and rates for services.

Water rates and associated fees Sewer rates and associated fees Solid Waste rates and associated fees

Rate & fee levels should be adequate to fund operating costs as well as future replacement and upgrade costs to the systems.
