SUBJECT:

Award a fencing contract for the Wild West Jordan Playground

SUMMARY:

Award a contract to CN Concrete LLC and authorize the Mayor to execute a contract with CN Concrete LLC for the installation of a 4-foot high black polymer coated steel chain link fence to surround the Wild West Jordan Playground in Veterans Memorial Park.

BACKGROUND DISCUSSION:

At the request of the City Council, staff advertised a bid for a 4-foot high fence to be installed around the new Wild West Jordan Playground at Veterans Memorial Park. The initial request for bids was advertised in the summer; no bids were received. Feedback received from the contractors recommended bidding in the fall when they would be available for work.

The City advertised a second time on the Utah Public Procurement Place website with bids due November 7. The City received one responsive bid from CN Concrete LLC. The City was able to negotiate a decrease in the submitted cost of the 12-foot wide mow strip, reducing the cost of the project by \$5,980.00.



ATTACHMENT A: STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- AUTHORITY: Provisions of this Contract are pursuant to the authority set forth in the West Jordan Municipal Code Section 3-1-2 et seq. Mandatory applicable state and federal law and regulations also apply.
- CONTRACT JURISDICTION, CHOICE OF LAW, AND VENUE: The provisions of this Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of
 Utah. The parties will submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Utah for any dispute arising out of this Contract or the breach thereof.
 Venue shall be in Salt Lake County.
- 3. <u>RECORDS ADMINISTRATION</u>: The CONTRACTOR shall maintain or supervise the maintenance of all records necessary to properly account for the payments made to the CONTRACTOR for costs authorized by this contract. These records shall be retained by the CONTRACTOR for at least four years after the contract terminates, or until all audits initiated within the four years, have been completed, whichever is later.
- AUDIT OF RECORDS: The CONTRACTOR agrees to allow City, State, and Federal auditors, access to all the records to this contract, for audit and inspection, and monitoring of services. Such access will be during normal business hours, or by appointment.
- 5. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: Contractor represents that none of its officers or employees are officers or employees of the City of West Jordan unless disclosure has been made in accordance with City ordinances and policies. Further, contractor certifies that it has not offered or given any gift or compensation prohibited by local, state, or federal law, to any officer or employee of the City of West Jordan to secure favorable treatment with respect to being awarded this Contract.
- 6. <u>INSURANCE</u>: The contractor shall maintain not less than (a) \$3,000,000.00 automobile insurance, (b) \$2,000,000.00 general liability insurance with \$3,000,000.00 general aggregate, and (c) worker's compensation as required by state statute, during the duration of this contract.
- 7. CONTRACTOR, AN INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: Contractor shall be an independent contractor, and as such shall have no authorization, express or implied to bind the City of West Jordan to any agreements, settlements, liability or understanding whatsoever, and agrees not to perform any acts as agent for the City, except as expressly set forth herein. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for the payment of all income tax and social security amounts due as a result of payments received from the CITY for these contract services. Persons employed by the CITY and acting under the direction of the CITY shall not be deemed to be employees or agents of the CONTRACTOR.
- 8. <u>INDEMNITY CLAUSE:</u> The CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify, save harmless, and release the CITY OF WEST JORDAN, and all its officers, agents, volunteers, and employees from and against any and all loss, damages, injury, liability, suits, and proceedings arising out of the performance of this contract which are caused in whole or in part by the negligence of the CONTRACTOR'S officers, agents, volunteers, or employees, but not for claims arising from the City's sole negligence.
- 9. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CLAUSE: The CONTRACTOR agrees to abide by the provisions of Title VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42USC 2000e) which prohibits discrimination against any employee or applicant for employment or any applicant or recipient of services, on the basis of race, religion, color, or national origin; and further agrees to abide by Executive Order No. 11246, as amended, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex; 45 CFR 90 which prohibits discrimination on the basis of age; and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, or the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disabilities. Also, the CONTRACTOR agrees to abide by Utah's Executive Order, dated June 30, 1989, which prohibits sexual harassment in the workplace.
- 10. <u>SEPARABILITY CLAUSE</u>: A declaration by any court, or any other binding legal source, that any provision of this contract is illegal, and void shall not affect the legality and enforceability of any other provision of this contract unless the provisions are mutually dependent.
- 11. <u>RENEGOTIATION OR MODIFICATIONS</u>: This contract may be amended, modified, or supplemented only by written amendment to the contract, executed by the parties hereto, and attached to the original signed copy of the contract.
- 12. **DEBARMENT:** The CONTRACTOR certifies that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction (contract), by any governmental department or agency. If the CONTRACTOR cannot certify this statement, attach a written explanation for review by the City.
- 13. TERMINATION: Unless otherwise stated in the Special Terms and Conditions, this contract may be terminated, with cause by either party, in advance of the specified termination date, upon written notice being given by the other party. The party in violation will be given ten (10) working days after notification to correct and cease the violations, after which the contract may be terminated for cause. This contract may be terminated without cause, in advance of the specified expiration date, by either party, upon 30 days prior written notice being given the other party. On termination of this contract, all accounts and payments will be processed according to the financial arrangements set forth herein for approved services rendered to date of termination.
- 14. <u>SALES TAX EXEMPTION</u>: The City of West Jordan's sales and use tax exemption number is E39555. The tangible personal property or services being purchased are being paid from City funds and used in the exercise of the City's essential functions. If the items being purchased are construction materials, they will be converted into real property by employees of the City.

15. WARRANTY: The contractor agrees to warrant and assume responsibility for all products or services that it licenses, contracts, or sells to the City of West Jordan under this contract for a period of one year unless otherwise specified and mutually agreed upon elsewhere in this contract. Product liability disclaimers and/or warranty disclaimers from the seller are not applicable to this contract unless otherwise specified and mutually agreed upon elsewhere in this contract. In general, the contractor warrants that: (1) the product or services will do what the salesperson said it would do, (2) the product or services will live up to all specific claims that the manufacturer makes in their advertisements, (3) the product or services will be suitable for the ordinary purposes for which such product is used, (4) the product or services will be suitable for any special purposes that the City of West Jordan has relied on the contractor's skill or judgment to consider when it advised the City about the product or services, (5) the product has been properly designed and manufactured, and (6) the product is free of significant defects or unusual problems about which the City has not been warned. Remedies available to the City of West Jordan include the following: The contractor will repair or replace (at no charge to the City) the product or services whose nonconformance is discovered and made known to the contractor in writing. If the repaired and/or replaced product or services prove to be inadequate or fails of its essential purpose, the contractor will refund the full amount of any payments that have been made. Nothing in this warranty will be construed to limit any rights or remedies the City of West Jordan may otherwise have under this contract or provided under the Uniform Commercial Code of the State of Utah.

GENERAL INFORMATION

West Jordan City (OWNER) is seeking bids for a four-foot tall black polymer coated steel chain link fence to enclose the West Jordan Wild West Playground. The base bid is for polymer coated chain link fence with one bid alternates. Bid Alternate #1 is for ornamental iron fencing in place of the chain link fence. As part of the base bid, bidders will include approximately 422 linear feet of 12-inch wide mow strip (located on the west, and the north and east sides of the artificial turf area. See Exhibit #1 at the end of the document for the fence location and quantity.

DETAILED SCOPE OF WORK

Description

The work performed under this section shall consist of

- The base bid includes furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment necessary for the installation of four-foot tall black polymer coated chain link fencing. As part of this bid the contractor will include core drilling or sleeve the posts into a 6-inch-thick, 12-inch wide mow strip. Fencing to be centered in new and existing mow strip (around artificial turf). Posts will be grouted into mow strip to prevent voids from edge of post and core hole. Fence posts will be encased in concrete a minimum of 12" below the mow strip.
- Bid Alternate #1 includes furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment necessary for the
 installation of four-foot-tall black ornamental iron fence in lieu of the black polymer coated chain
 link fencing. Included in the price will be all necessary core drilling or mechanical fasteners
 required to attach the fence to the sidewalk as described in the previous bullet point.

BASE BID - VINYL-COATED CHAIN LINK FENCE

Product Data:

- A. Fabric 48-inch 11COR/8FIN Black EXT. PVC (2" Mesh) KK Chain Link Fabric (9 gage steel).
- B. Coating ASTM F668, Type 2b, polymer coating fused and adhered to zinc-coated steel core wire. Black in color.
- C. Top Rail 1-5/8 O.D. COLOR AP-40 Pipe, 1.83 lbs. per foot. Top rail 21' in length, joined with 1-5/8" COLOR Coated Sleeve.
- D. Line Post 1-7/8" O.D. COLOR AP-40 Pipe, 2.28 lbs. per foot. Line post set a maximum of 10' on center. Post spacing around bends at the corners of the playground may need to be closer to avoid having the fence negatively impact the sidewalk around the corners.
- E. Terminal Post 2-3/8" O.D. COLOR AP-40 Pipe, 3.12 lbs. Per foot.
- F. Tension Wire 9 GA COLOR Coated Smooth Tension Wire attached to bottom of fence fabric with 12 ½ GA. Steel Hog Rings spaced 24" on center.
- G. Fittings COLOR Coated regular brace band & carriage bolt, COLOR Coated Steel Rail End, COLOR Coated steel eye top, COLOR Coated steel cap, 3/16"X3/4" COLOR Coated regular tension band & carriage bolt.
- H. Tie Wire 8-1/2" 12 GA. COLOR Coated tie wire & 6-1/2" 12 GA. COLOR Coated tie wire spaced 15" on center for line posts and 24" on center for rails.

BID ALTERNATE #1 - MECHANICALLY FASTENED ORNAMENTAL STEEL FENCE

- A. Fences: Complete factory-fabricated system of posts and panels, accessories, fittings, and fasteners; finished with electro-deposition coating, and having the following performance characteristics:
 - Capable of resisting vertical load, horizontal load and infill performance requirements for fence categories defined in ASTM F2408.
- B. Electro-Deposition Coating: Multi-stage pre-treatment/wash with zinc phosphate, followed by epoxy primer and acrylic topcoat.
 - 1. Total Coating Thickness: 2 mils, minimum.
 - 2. Color: As selected by Architect from manufacturer's standard range.
 - 3. Coating Performance: Comply with general requirements of ASTM F2408.

 - 1. Size: 4 inches square by 12 gage, 0.1094 inch, with manufacturer's standard cap.
 - Post Cap: Flush plate.
- F. Rails: Manufacturer's standard, double-wall steel channel; 1-1/2 inch square by 14 gage, 0.0747 inch with pre-punched picket holes.
- G. Pickets: Steel tube.
 - 1. Spacing: 3 inch on center.
 - 2. Size: 1 inch square by 14 gage, 0.0747 inch
 - 3. Style: Pickets with finial extend above top rail and curve outward.
 - 4. Finial: blunt or rounded point is acceptable.
- H. Fasteners: ASTM A276/A276M, Type 302 stainless steel; finished to match fence components.
- 1. Tamper-proof security bolts.

SUBMITTALS

- A. Product Data: Material descriptions, construction details, dimensions of individual components and profiles, and finishes for the following:
 - 1. Fence posts, rails, hardware and fittings.
- B. Shop Drawings: Show locations of fence, posts, rails, and tension wires and details of extended posts, extension arms, or other operation, hardware, and accessories. Indicate materials, dimensions, sizes, weights, and finishes of components. Include plans, elevations, sections, gate swing and other required installation and operational clearances, and details of post anchorage and attachment and bracing.
- C. Qualification Data: For firms and persons to demonstrate their capabilities and experience. Include lists of completed projects with project names and addresses, names and addresses of architects and owners, and other information specified.

QUALITY ASSURANCE

A. Source Limitations for Fences: Obtain each color, grade, finish, type, and variety of component for fences and gates from one source with resources to provide fences of consistent quality in appearance and physical properties.

PROJECT CONDITIONS

A. Field Measurements: Verify layout information for fences shown on Drawings in relation to property survey and existing structures. Verify dimensions by field measurements.

INSTALLATION

Contractor shall at all times be responsible for providing and maintaining a clean, safe, and secure working area. Contractor shall be responsible for providing barriers, signage, etc., in order to achieve this secure area.

Install fencing per reviewed submittals and details.

Install fencing as per manufacturer's recommendations and requirements and comply with all applicable playground safety regulations and guidelines

Warranty

The Contractor shall warranty the installation for a period of one-year following substantial completion and acceptance.

The Bidder shall familiarize itself with the nature and extent of the projects requirements, work site, legal requirements including state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, and the conditions affecting cost, progress of performance of the work, and shall make all such independent investigations, as Bidder deems necessary to submit a responsible bid.

DELIVERABLES

Providers and installers of the fencing material must be qualified, licensed, and insured to perform the work. In addition to the bid price, please consider the following as a checklist of requested information and provide the following documentation:

- Proof of a minimum of 5-years of experience installing fencing.
- Provide a minimum of three references of similar scope that has been installed with the same fencing in the last three (3) years.
- Proof that the proposing installation Contractor(s) is properly licensed to conduct business in the State of Utah.
- Copies of installer's liability insurance certificate(s)
- Copy of manufacture's warranties

The work shall be completed within 30 days of the Notice to Proceed. Time is of the essence.




