Request for ideas

RFI to be released to the Stakeholders and other community groups not represented on the Stakeholders Council

Committee and CWC Board could follow two-step process

1. Request for Ideas
2. Request for Proposals with criteria for evaluation
 - a. Budget (max amount)
 - b. Matching amount from applicant
 - c. Immediate action (shovel-ready or program-ready)
 - d. Consistency w/ Mountain Accord
 - e. Partnership opportunities

Deliverables and action items

- Draft an RFI, with criteria for evaluation
 - Send the draft RFI to the committee for its review on January 10, 2020.
 - RFP will be discussed during the January 15th Stakeholders Council meeting

- Contact Sandy City and re engage Unified Police on police bus escort/bus priority
- Government and private foundation program-based grant research
