

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Daggett County Commission/Redevelopment Agency Board held on **Tuesday, December 10, 2019** in the Commission Chambers at the Daggett County Courthouse. Commissioners Randy Asay, Jack Lytle and Matt Tippetts were present. Attorney Niel Lund, Auditor/Recorder Keri Pallesen and Clerk/Treasurer Brian Raymond were also present. The meeting was called to order at 6:06 pm by Commissioner Asay.

Also present: Butch and Pamela Johns, Harriet Dickerson, Sandy Kunkel and Trevor Brooksby, Jordan Mathis of Tri County Health, Mark Wilson of Flaming Gorge Chamber, Mayor Buddy Rogers and his wife Julie Rogers

Public Hearing: Commissioner Asay turned some time over to Commissioner Tippetts to read comments from David B McDonald III saying: "I support the transfer of the Fire Station, Conference Hall and Justice Court over to the Town of Dutch John. The transfer will benefit more than just the residents of Dutch John, but also the rest of the county and the many visitors many of our livelihoods depend on."

Similar emails were received from Amy McDonald, John and Stacey Rauch, plus Sheena Mapps and Cody Patten. All were read for the benefit of those in attendance.

Butch Johns said he supported the resolution for the transfer of the property to the Town for Fire Protection.

Mayor Rogers also said he supported this and thanked the County for widening their fees. Mayor Rogers asked the attorney if he had gotten the latest comments from Dennis Judd. Commissioner Lytle addressed a paragraph that the Town had wanted to enter, but it hasn't all been finalized. Mayor Rogers agreed that you couldn't cover it all.

Sandy Kunkel of the Town Council gave comments in support of this resolution, especially in light of the insurance issues for town residents.

Commissioner Lytle commented that he has been pleased to work with Dutch John to discuss this and work towards making this happen. Commissioner Asay echoed his comments.

Trevor Brooksby said he was happy to see that both sides are willing to sit down together and move forward in a positive way.

Harriet Dickerson, Town Council member said she thought everyone knew where she stood on this and didn't comment further.

With no further comments the hearing was concluded at 6:20 pm.
