Minutes:

1. Administrative updates

a. Board Members Changes –

Alisa asked the new committee members to introduce themselves. Manuel Delgado was the first new committee member to introduce himself. He said he has lived in North Salt Lake for almost 3 years and loves it here. His wife and him have both studied music and has his masters in music business and right now is working at an online marketing manager at Clearlink. Sarah Sargent was the second new committee member to introduce herself. She said she has lived in Foxboro for 5½ years. She's a mom and an inventory manager.

Alisa gave tribute and a gift as a token of appreciation to Lori Seppi who has been a member of this committee since it started in January 2014. Lori's term is up and has been instrumental in many events but especially in the NSL 5K and NSL Reads. The Parks, Trails, Arts & Recreation Board will certainly miss Lori and all her hard work she has given to this committee.

b. Service Hours – Alisa asked everyone who had hours to put it on the sheet she passed around. She reminded the committee that the meetings they go to can count as well as any of family members or friends that help at any NSL Parks and Arts events. Alisa said this committee is supposed to submit a report every year to the city council and this information will be part of that report.

c. NSL Live Logo – David Frandsen handed out different logos that he had worked on. Alisa said she liked the color scheme of the logos. After discussion about the different logos David said he will take some time and work on it for the next meeting. Ryan said he would like to see some large banners where it is event specific that they can put up every year.

d. Social Media Update

Alisa said the poster for the Kite Festival is finished and she will post that on Facebook. Alisa also said that they have three paths into the website. They are through "Community", "Events" and "Recreation". There is some cleaning up that needs to happen which is in the works.

2. Events Update

a. Kite Festival – May 19th

The Kite Festival Event is from ten a.m. to noon. The volunteers should be there to help set up at nine o'clock. The set up entails prepping the tables, laying out the supplies and signs and setting up the sound system. David said he would take care of the sound system and ask the Parks department to help with that. Alisa said she would like to block a section off for the food trucks which will be arriving any time after 10:00 a.m. There will be six trucks which were arranged by the Foxboro Community Fair. Alisa said she will contact James Hood to see if some of the Youth City Council members would volunteer. Some of the volunteers will be assigned to be greeters who will be welcoming guests and directing their attention to where the kites are, helping the children tie their kites and mention the performances and the kite demonstration. The main pavilion will be where the kids will be decorating their kites. The west side of the park will be where the big kite demonstration will be. Starting at 10:20 a.m. the Master Chorale will sing "Let's Go Fly A Kite". The Tae Kwon Do demonstration will take place at 10:45 a.m. At twelve o'clock noon the event will be officially over.

b. Master Chorus – May 19th Concert, 7 PM, City Hall

Ryan Mumford said the Master Chorus came to the last City Council meeting and sounded amazing. The impressive part Ryan mentioned was that there was a large age difference in the chorus as some were in their upper seventies and eighties and some who looked like they were sixteen. Brett Levitre said they have some of the choir members come from as far as Sandy and some who are coming from Farmington. Brett said he has sixty plus people that have contacted him but at least fifty who are participating regularly. The goal was to have a good time and have fun and Brett said that is what is happening. Brett said they are on track for performing at the Kite Festival on May 19th. They will be singing at Woods Cross High and are getting out into the communities.

Brett said he wanted to shoot for a concert sometime in October. Ryan said he would really like to see them have the concert on the Second Sunday which is October 14th. Brett he will plan on October 14th and is going to work on the chorus of the Messiah sing-in and said to count on him conducting that event unless he is told different.

c. NSL 5K – June 30th 7 AM, Legacy Park

Nola Lucke was not able to attend this meeting but Alisa said her event is moving along.

d. Festival of Speed – July 2nd, 7 PM, Eaglewood Golf Course

Bruce Oblad said he would like to talk about how the car show happens that evening. It is quiet with no loud music, the only vendors that are selling and should be there are food vendors and the Youth City Council selling water and pop. Alisa asked if the YCC could also sell little cars as a fund raiser and Bruce said that would be fine with him. Bruce said he is trying to get the paragliders to come.

e. NSL Reads – Wed, Sept 26th, 6:30 PM

Naomi Hall will be chairing NSL Reads and will take over from Lori Seppi. The event will be at the North Salt Lake City hall. Bruce said that if anyone needs to find an author he recommended Congressman Chris Stewart. He would be a great resource.

f. Second Sunday Concert Series

Manuel Delgado will be chairing the Second Sunday Concert Series.

g. Halloween 3K

Sarah Sargent will be chairing the Halloween 3K.

3. City Council Update – Ryan Mumford

Ryan went over the “Davis County Trails and Bike Path” with the committee. Ryan said it’s interesting to see what the county has done. The map did not include a couple of North Salt Lake Parks like Tunnel Springs and Mathis Park. Ryan would like to be better coordinated with Davis County to update the map with some of the areas that are not on the map. David Frandsen said he would help with that.

Ryan said the city budget is almost done. A tentative budget hasn’t been approved by the city

council yet. It was presented that there would be two hundred thousand for park replacement and updating. Until Ryan hears otherwise he feels like that will happen. Another great thing that happened was they allotted one hundred thousand for beautification of Eagleridge. There is a section as you come up Eagleridge to the left that is very barren and ugly. The money is from the RAP tax. There is also seventy five thousand dollars for tree replacement on Center Street. Ryan reminded everyone that even though it sounds like a lot of money for the parks, most of it will go toward the sprinkler system, sod and fence. Ryan said officially there should be access to the budget on July 1st.

4. Parks, Trail Update

a. Laurel Park

David said that he was contacted by Laurel's mother and the date for the dedication of the park will be on June 23rd. The memorial rock is finished.

b. Park Tour Plan

Chris Sonntag and his son Jeff with Sonntag Recreation came and the committee was shown two concept drawings of Palmquist Park. Chris said he did the drawings off looking at Google Maps and so they will not be accurate. David Frandsen said he had not given Sonntag Recreation a budget and so they will have to keep that in mind when they show the drawings. There were different ideas for playground equipment on the slope of the hill but Chris reminded them that they aren't sure at this time if they would work on the slope until the grading is finished. Chris said that the best option is for the pour in place on the hill but can have synthetic turf over compacted aggregate.

The committee was also shown two conceptual drawings of Mathis Park. Chris thought the playground would go well under the shade trees. He also talked about a jogging area with exercise stations.

David said that an e-mail should go out to all the committee with the information so they can take time and look at all the options and make a decision. Alisa asked about a theme type playground. Chris said that they can do almost anything but the custom playground costs more and to keep that in mind. Chris said that they priced the drawings and they run from one hundred twenty thousand to one hundred fifty thousand dollars.


5. Chair Notes

Sherry Llewelyn said she is on the Active Transportation Committee which is made up of all the cities in Davis County plus Davis County. On June 2nd in conjunction with National Trails Day the Wasatch Front Regional Council which includes Weber County, Davis County, Salt Lake County, Utah County, Mountain Land Association of Governments and the Jordan River Commission are holding this event called the "Golden Spoke". This is to celebrate one hundred continuous miles of paved trail which is the longest paved trail in the country. They will have two groups of riders which one group will start in Weber County and one from Bridal Veil Falls. They will meet together at the Jordan River Bridge. They will have stops along the way and one of the stops will be in North Salt Lake. They are asking that we hold an event in conjunction with the Golden Spoke event. They are going to build a monument out of a bicycle wheel and every city that the trail goes through will have a spoke with that cities name on it. As they move through the counties the County Commissioner will carry a quiver and each Mayor will put their city spoke in the quiver which will be transferred to the next county. When it gets down to the bridge they will put all the spokes in and then there will be one golden spoke in the middle. Each one of those

stops the Mayor of that city will join in on the ride or at least a segment of the ride and any council members can also come. The community as well are invited to join in and ride with their Mayor and City Council. They can choose to ride the entire thing or just portions of the trail. Sherrie said she has reserved the pavilion at Legacy Park which is closest to the trail. The Public Works will put out the flags. Davis County Health Department will come and do a Bike Rodeo as well as a helmet safety check for families who want to bring their kids down. Sherrie asked if the committee had any additional ideas or wanted to participate in this event. There were questions about how far you would need to ride. Sherrie said that you can ride as far as you want and then turn back. There will be limited Front Runner passes if you ride into Salt Lake. The event for North Salt Lake will be from ten o'clock am to one o'clock pm. The riders are expected to be in our area from 11:45 to noon. Alisa asked if she could invite someone who sells snow cones and Sherrie said that shouldn't be a problem. Sherrie said it should be a great event to help the citizens learn more about the trails.

Next meeting will be held on May 22nd at 6:00 pm at City Hall.

Alisa VanLangeveld adjourned the meeting at 7:30 pm.
