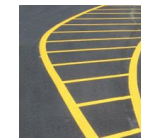


Public Works – 2019 Report



What we do

- Streets
 - Road maintenance (pot holes and small patching jobs)
 - Signage
 - Curb painting
 - Tree trimming
 - Plow fleet management
- Storm Water
 - Storm and land drain system
 - Street sweeping
 - SWPPP, MS4 and General Permit compliance/enforcement
 - Garbage can delivery
- Water
 - Culinary System (tanks, valves, hydrants, pipelines, pumps, PRVs, air vacs etc)
 - Compliance/water quality (sampling, security, reporting, flushing and circulation etc)
 - Water meter reading



How we do it

- Streets
 - 4 full time staff
 - Funding- Roads: Class C funds, active transportation option, road fee, general fund
- Storm Water
 - 4 full time staff
 - Funding- SW Utility Fund
- Water
 - 6 full time staff
 - Funding- Water Enterprise Fund
- Other
 - Public Works and Power Secretaries
 - Admin staff at City Hall
 - Part time staff



Of note in the last year

- Streets
 - 5.25 lane-miles of repaving, over 5 miles of re-striping
 - ~1.5 miles of new roads
 - 11,250,000 SF of preventative treatments (Chip Seal, Slurry, Crack Seal and Seal Coat)
 - 13,800 LF of sidewalk/sidewalk
 - Updating standards and ordinances
- Storm Water
 - Water quality project with Nature Conservancy
 - Over 500 miles of street sweeping
 - LID implementation/updating standards and ordinances
 - Managed SWPPPs for all applicable construction sites
- Water
 - 2,400 LF of water main replaced (~1.5 miles of new water lines)
 - Water quality projects
 - ~50 leak repairs
 - Updating standards and ordinances



...Cont - Of note in the last year

- After hours work
 - ~25 culinary leak repairs
 - ~1,000 hours of plowing
 - 3 rescued duck families
 - 2 accident cleanups
 - 3 illicit discharges
 - Keeping up with day to day operations
- West Davis Corridor coordination
- Highway 89 coordination
- New Water tank design and coordination
