Councilmember Christensen made a **Motion** to approve Work Orders #2020-01 and #2020-02 for Franson Civil Engineers.

Councilmember Brown Seconded and the motion Passed all in favor.

Reports:

Fire Chief McMullin reported that fireworks have been ordered for the town celebration. Chief McMullin reported that the fire department has been working on getting physicals done for the year. Chief McMullin reported on recent grass fires that have taken place in the area. Chief McMullin suggested that some of the higher grasses along the roadway be mowed down and Councilmember Robison reported that Chris Steele will begin doing this, as well as spraying for weeds. Mayor Larson asked for an update on COVID-19. Chief McMullin reported on a few cases in Santaquin and that precautions will be made when responding to any possible cases.

Lucinda Thomas gave a report on recent action taken by the Planning Commission. Ms. Thomas reported that three site plans were approved last week; two in Stubbs Estates and one in the Bateman Subdivision.

Public Forum:

No public comment was heard.

Agenda Items:

1. Discussion and possible action awarding a bid for the Town's surplus water for the 2020 season.

Mayor Larson asked Councilmember Brown to conduct this item, as he had submitted a bid for the surplus water and will be abstaining from this discussion.

81 Lucinda Thomas reported that three bids were received, which she opened and reported:

Councilmember Brown asked for a motion and stated that the highest bid for Strawberry was from Lynn Fowers.

Councilmember Christensen made a **Motion** to accept Lynn Fowers bid of \$5.09 per inch for all of Strawberry Water.

Councilmember Savage **Seconded** and the motion **Passed** all in favor. (Mayor Larson abstained from voting.)

Joshua Nielson reported on changes that have been implemented. Mr. Nielson reported this is ready to be voted on.

- Councilmember Brown made a **Motion** to approve Ordinance 2020-02 Water Department Ordinance, as amended.
- 110 Councilmember Savage Seconded and the motion Passed all in favor.

3. Discussion and possible action on scheduling events for the Town Celebration and Rodeo.

Mayor Larson voiced concern regarding deposits being placed and not being refundable, if the celebration isn't able to take place.

Councilmember Christensen reported she asked Coby Jones from the Roping Club to give a report on the rodeo.

Coby Jones reported that he had been in contact with Mascaros, the stock contractor for the rodeo, and they are willing to work with the town on changing the dates, if necessary. Mr. Jones reported that other towns are having troubles getting sponsors with everything that's going on. Mr. Jones reported that everything is kind of on hold right now, as far as planning the rodeo and getting sponsors. Mr. Jones indicated he is looking from direction from the council on how to proceed.

 Councilmember Christensen voiced concern on obtaining sponsors, and suggested letting sponsors know that these funds could be refunded if the rodeo does not happen, or bank and earmark it for next year. Councilmember Christensen suggested tabeling this until next month to see if things have changed. Councilmember Christensen voiced concern on if people would come in June, or would they still be practicing social distancing, even though the ban would be lifted.

Councilmember Savage voiced concern over people not wanting to come and spend money, even later in the summer as opposed to June. Mr. Jones stated that Mascaros suggested October as a possible date.

Mayor Larson indicated that Item 4 also has to deal with the town celebration. Mayor Larson stated that deposits would need to be made soon for the blow ups for the town celebration and that the deposit is non-refundable. Councilmember Savage questioned how much the town has budged for the rodeo and celebration and Councilmember Christensen reported that the suggested budget is \$35,000.00. Councilmember Christensen reported last year the committee brought in close to \$26,000.00 in sponsor money.

Councilmember Savage suggested cancelling the town celebration. Councilmember Brown stated we can always cancel and then schedule something at a later time. Councilmember Christensen reported that her gut feeling is to cancel the rodeo in June, and if things open up later hold some kind of celebration and possibly hold a rodeo in October. The council concurred with this suggestion.

Mayor Larson reported that a \$300,000.00 water smart grant was received to help go towards 195 the tank and well. 196

Councilmember Savage reported that the Ms. Genola pageant was cancelled and instead will 198 be doing an online campaign with last year's participants. 199

Councilmember Brown questioned the status baseball registration. Lucinda Thomas reported that applications have been taken but no fees, so they won't have to refund it all. Ms. Thomas stated that the recreation director is still hopeful they will be able to hold a season. Councilmember Brown reported that the grant was received for the fire station asphalt pavement, in the amount of \$75,000.00. Councilmember Brown reported that these funds will be available in July and are available for 18 months. Councilmember Brown questioned invoice for fence lawsuit. Mr. Nielsen gave an update on the pending litigation and reported this has been delayed due to COVID-19 and that discovery is taking place and the next hearing is set for October. Councilmember Robison questioned how much is available for road improvements and Ms. Thomas reported there will be a little over \$100,000.00 available. Councilmember Christensen asked Melissa Scott to report on the rodeo queen contest, which was supposed to be held on Tuesday, April 14. Melissa Scott suggested holding a contest at a later time and then those girls would represent Genola at surrounding rodeos, as well as represent at Genola's rodeo next year. The council concurred with this suggestion. ADJOURN: Councilmember Robison made a Motion to adjourn. Councilmember Brown Seconded and the motion Passed all in favor.
