

**WASHINGTON CITY  
RESOLUTION R2020-12**

**A RESOLUTION OF WASHINGTON CITY ADOPTING  
LOW IMPACT DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION GUIDANCE**

**WHEREAS**, the State of Utah Department of Environmental Quality Division of Water Quality has mandated that each municipality adopt regulations to prevent the offsite discharge from all rainfall events less than or equal to the 80<sup>th</sup> percentile rainfall event unless it is determined by specific constraints to be infeasible; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Utah Department of Environmental Quality Division of Water Quality has mandated that each municipality adopt regulations that require the evaluation of a Low Impact Development approach for all new development or redevelopment projects to meet retention requirement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Dixie Storm Water Coalition, of which Washington City is a member of, in consultation with JE Fuller, Hydrology & Geomorphology, Inc., has created a guidance document to define methods for calculating and determining feasibility of a Low Impact Development approach to meet the retention requirement in Washington County; and

**WHEREAS**, Washington City is desirous to comply with the state mandate to adopt the regulations pertaining to the evaluation of a Low Impact Development approach for all new development or redevelopment projects to meet retention requirement, and in compliance with, the state mandate and regulations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Washington City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the public and that it promotes the health, safety, and well-being of the community.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of Washington City, Utah, that: Washington City Council hereby adopts the Green Infrastructure/Low Impact Development Application Guidance for Washington County, Utah updated June 12, 2020.

This Resolution shall be effective on the date it is adopted.
