# Endorsement to Utah: Funeral Directors

## Utah Statute: 58-9

### Qualifications:

Each applicant for licensure as a Funeral Director by Endorsement shall:

- Has completed 5 years of lawful and active practice as a licensed funeral service director and embalmer (or equivalent as indicated) within the 10 years immediately preceding the application.
- Have passed a national examination determined by the Division
- Demonstrate competency of the laws and rules of the state by obtaining a passing score on the Utah Laws and Rules Exam for Funeral Directors.

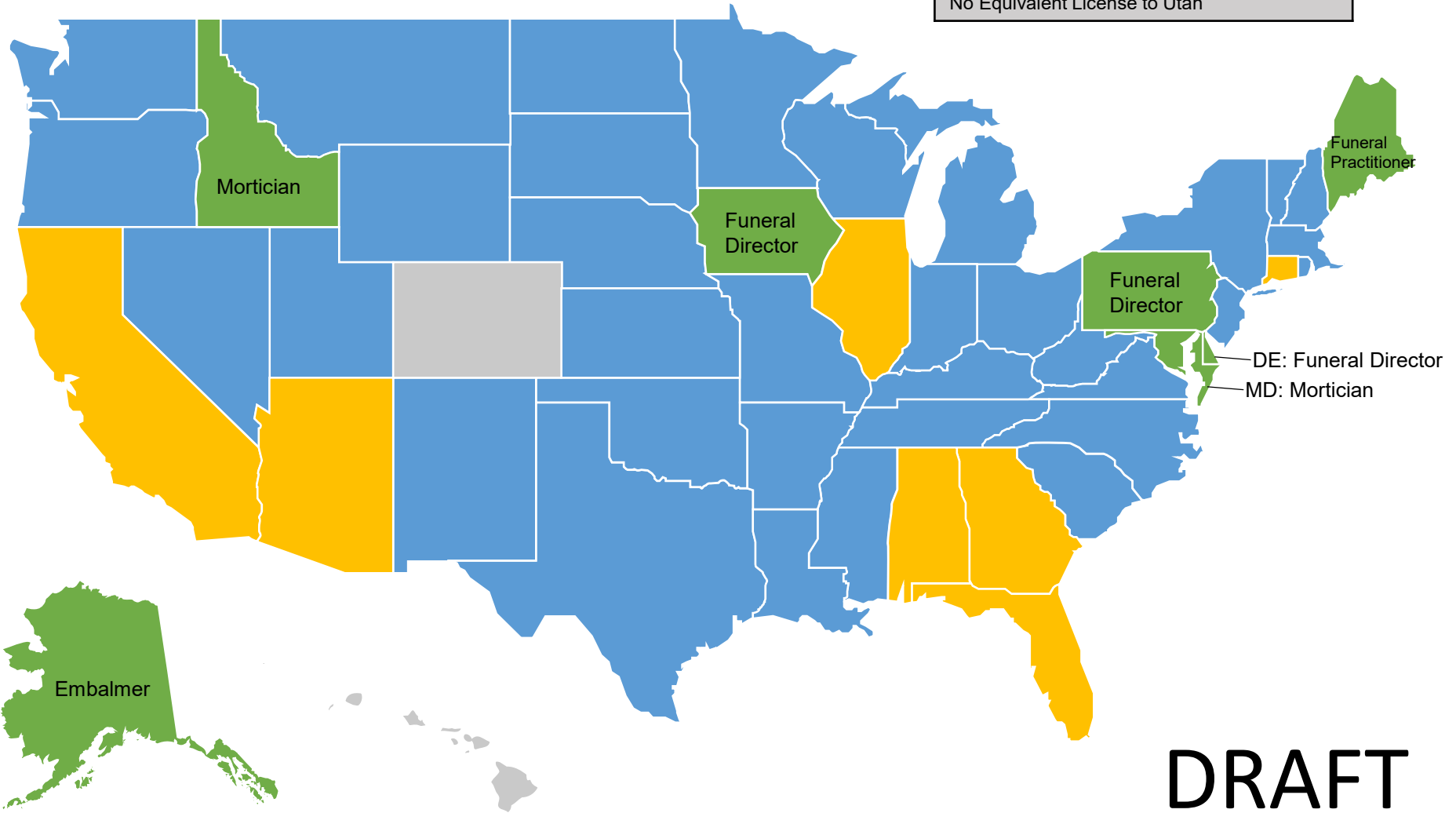

### Scope

**FUNERAL DIRECTING.** The practice of directing or supervising funerals, the practice of preparing dead human bodies for burial by means other than embalming, or the preparation for the disposition of dead human bodies; the making of funeral arrangements or providing for funeral services or the making of financial arrangements for the rendering of these services; the provision or maintenance of a place for the preparation for disposition of dead human bodies; or the use of the terms funeral director, undertaker, mortician, funeral parlor, or any other term from which can be implied the practice of funeral directing; or the holding out to the public that one is a funeral director or engaged in a practice described in this subdivision.

"mortuary science" means embalming of dead human bodies, taking charge of the remains of those dead of a communicable disease, or preparing dead human bodies for shipment, directing or supervising funerals;

#### **Scope and conduct of examination for a license to practice mortuary science.**

The department shall examine applicants for an embalmer's license; the examination may include any or all of the following subjects:

- (1) theory and practice of embalming;
- (2) anatomy;
- (3) pathology;
- (4) bacteriology;
- (5) hygiene, including sanitation and public health;
- (6) chemistry, including toxicology;
- (7) restorative arts, including plastic surgery and demi-surgery;
- (8) funeral service arts and sciences, and funeral service administration, including accounting, funeral law, psychology, funeral principles, directing and management;

"Embalmer" means a person who is licensed pursuant to this chapter and who is engaged in embalming. "Funeral directing" means arranging, directing or providing a service in the disposition of dead human bodies for compensation.

**EMBALMER** - A person required to be licensed to practice the Science of Embalming under the laws of this State who disinfects or preserves a dead human body, entirely, or in part, by the use of chemical substances, fluids, or gases, in the body, or by introduction of same into the body by vascular or hypodermic injection, or by direct application into the organs or cavities.

**FUNERAL DIRECTOR** - A person required to be licensed to practice the business of funeral directing under the laws of this State, who meets the public, displays and sells or offers to sell funeral merchandise or supplies; who plans details of funeral services with members of the family and minister or any other person responsible for such planning, or who directs, is in charge, or apparent charge of, and supervises such service in a funeral home, church or other places; who enters into the making, negotiation or completion of financial arrangements for funerals, including, but not limited to, the sale

— A funeral director is a person engaged in or conducting, or holding himself or herself out as engaged in any of the following:

- (a) Preparing for the transportation or burial or disposal, or directing and supervising for transportation or burial or disposal of human remains.
- (b) Maintaining an establishment for the preparation for the transportation or disposition or for the care of human remains.
- (c) Using, in connection with his or her name, the words "funeral director," or "undertaker," or

facilities and pre-need)

— “Funeral directing” means the business, practice or profession, as commonly practiced, of (A) directing or supervising funerals, or providing funeral services; (B) handling or encasing or providing services for handling and encasing dead human bodies, otherwise than by embalming, for burial or disposal; (C) providing embalming services; (D) providing transportation, interment and disinterment of dead human bodies; (E) maintaining an establishment so located, constructed and equipped as to permit the decent and sanitary handling of dead human bodies, with suitable equipment in such establishment for such handling; (F) conducting an establishment from which funerals may be held; (G) engaging in consultations concerning arrangements for the disposition of human remains, including, but not limited to, arrangements for cremation or alkaline hydrolysis; (H) casketing human remains; (I) making cemetery and cremation arrangements; and (J) preparing funeral service contracts, as defined in section 42-200; (Note: a funeral director cannot perform the embalming, but must employ a licensed embalmer per sec. 20-221)

—“Licensed embalmer” means an embalmer holding a license as provided in this chapter;

— Embalming, care and disposal of bodies restricted. No person, except a licensed embalmer, shall inject any fluid or substance into any dead human body, except that a registered student embalmer may, even if not in the presence of a licensed embalmer, make such injection or perform any other act under his instruction; and no person, firm or corporation shall enter, engage in, carry on or manage for

“Funeral director” shall mean a person engaged in the care of human remains or in the disinfecting and preparing by embalming of human remains for the funeral service, transportation, burial, entombment or cremation, and who shall file all death certificates or permits as required by Chapter 31 of Title 16.

497.372 Funeral directing; conduct constituting practice of funeral directing.—

(1) The practice of funeral directing shall be construed to consist of the following functions, which may be performed only by a licensed funeral director:

(a) Selling or offering to sell funeral services, embalming, cremation, or other services relating to the final disposition of human remains, including the removal of such remains from the state, on an at-need basis.

(b) Planning or arranging, on an at-need basis, the details of funeral services, embalming, cremation, or other services relating to the final disposition of human remains, including the removal of such remains from the state; setting the time of the services; establishing the type of services to be rendered; acquiring the services of the clergy; and obtaining vital information for the filing of death certificates and obtaining of burial transit permits.

(c) Making, negotiating, or completing the financial arrangements for funeral services, embalming, cremation, or other services relating to the final disposition of human remains, including the removal of such remains from the state, on an at-need basis, except that unlicensed personnel may assist the funeral director in performing such tasks.

(d) Directing, being in charge or apparent charge of, or supervising, directly or indirectly, a visitation or viewing. Such functions shall not require that a licensed funeral director be physically present throughout the visitation or viewing, provided that the funeral director is readily available by telephone for consultation.

(e) Directing, being in charge or apparent charge of, or supervising, directly or indirectly, any funeral service held in a funeral establishment, cemetery, or elsewhere.

(f) Directing, being in charge or apparent charge of, or supervising, directly or indirectly, any memorial service held prior to or within 72 hours of the burial or cremation, if such memorial service is sold or arranged by a licensee.

(g) Using in connection with one's name or employment the words or terms "funeral director," "funeral establishment," "undertaker," "mortician," or any other word, term, title, or picture, or combination of any of the above, that when considered in the context in which used would imply that such person is engaged in the practice of funeral directing or that such person is holding herself or himself out to the public as being engaged in the practice of funeral directing; provided, however, that nothing in this

"Embalmer" means a person who practices embalming or uses in connection with that person's name the words "embalmer," "licensed embalmer," "undertaker," or "mortician" or offers or holds himself or herself out as offering such services.

"Funeral director" means a person who practices funeral directing or uses in connection with that person's name or with a picture of that person the words "funeral director," "licensed funeral director," "undertaker," or "mortician" or offers or holds himself or herself out as offering such services.

"Practice of embalming" means disinfecting or preserving or attempting to disinfect or preserve dead human bodies by replacing certain body fluids with preserving and disinfecting chemicals.

"Practice of funeral directing" means making or directing, at need or preneed, arrangements for the

"Embalm" means the injection of fluid or agent of sufficient strength and quantity to accomplish a thorough disinfection and preservation of a dead human body, the fluid or agent being injected arterially in addition to cavity injection.

"Funeral services" means arranging for or providing for pick up of human remains, embalming, placing the same on display, or otherwise providing for final disposition of human remains

"Embalming" means the disinfecting, preparing or preserving for final disposition of dead human bodies, in whole or in part, or any attempt to do so, by the use or application of chemical substances, fluids or gases on the body, or by the introduction of the same into the body by vascular or hypodermic injection or by direct introduction into organs or cavities, or by any other method or process.

"Funeral director" means any person engaged in or conducting, or holding himself out as engaged in or conducting, any of the following activities:

- (a) Directing or supervising the burial, cremation or disposal of dead human bodies.
- (b) Arranging for funeral services for dead human bodies.
- (c) Selling funeral goods and services to the public.
- (d) Conducting, directing or supervising a funeral service.

--Funeral director services do not include embalming. .

"Mortician" means any person engaged in or conducting, or holding himself out as engaged in or conducting, any of the following activities:

- (a) Caring for or preparing dead human bodies for burial, cremation or disposal.
- (b) Disinfecting or preparing dead human bodies by embalming, or otherwise, for funeral service, transportation, burial, cremation or disposal.

"Funeral director and embalmer" means a person who is licensed and qualified to practice funeral directing and to prepare, disinfect and preserve dead human bodies by the injection or external application of antiseptics, disinfectants or preservative fluids and materials and to use derma surgery or plastic art for the restoring of mutilated features. It further means a person who restores the remains of a person for the purpose of funeralization whose organs or bone or tissue has been donated for anatomical purposes..

"Embalming" means the process of sanitizing and chemically treating a deceased human body in order to reduce the presence and growth of microorganisms, to retard organic decomposition, to render the remains safe to handle while retaining naturalness of tissue, and to restore an acceptable physical appearance for funeral viewing purposes.

"Funeral director" means a person, known by the title of "funeral director" or other similar words or titles, licensed by the Department who practices funeral directing.

Funeral directing; definition. Conducting or engaging in or representing or holding out oneself as conducting or engaged in any one or any combination of the following practices constitutes the practice of funeral directing:

(a) The practice of preparing, otherwise than by embalming, for the burial, cremation, or disposition and directing and supervising the burial or disposition of deceased human remains or performing any act or service in connection with the preparing of dead human bodies. Preparation, direction, and supervision shall not be construed to mean those functions normally performed by cemetery and crematory personnel.

(b) The practice of operating a place for preparing for the disposition of deceased human bodies or for caring for deceased human bodies before their disposition. Nothing in this Code shall prohibit the ownership and management of such a place by an unlicensed owner if the place is operated in accordance with this Code and the unlicensed owner does not engage in any form of funeral directing. An unlicensed owner may interact with consumers while a licensed funeral director is present in

Embalming" means the temporary preservation and disinfection of human remains by the internal or external application of chemicals or by other methods in preparation for disposition.

Funeral services" As used in this chapter, "funeral services" means:

- (1) accepting, holding, caring for, or preparing human remains for a funeral or final disposition, including embalming (where authorized) and the practice of restorative arts;
- (2) at need counseling of survivors of a deceased individual on:
  - (A) the services, methods, and alternatives for final disposition of human remains; and
  - (B) the requirements of federal and state law applicable to the sale of funeral services and merchandise;
- (3) arranging, supervising, or conducting a funeral service in conjunction with the memorialization or the disposition of human remains, (however, "funeral services" does not include interment services performed in a cemetery by cemetery personnel), including attendance at services held in cemeteries or crematories where third persons are directly responsible for the physical acts associated with interment or final disposition of human remains;
- (4) selling or offering to sell funeral merchandise described in IC 30-2-13-8 to a consumer at the time of need or in advance of need;
- (5) selling or offering to sell funeral services described in IC 30-2-13-8 at the time of need or in advance of need;
- (6) managing a funeral home or branch location licensed under IC 25-15-4-1 or IC 25-15-4-1.1; and
- (7) arranging for the final disposition of human remains in compliance with public health and safety laws

"Mortuary science" means the engaging in any of the following:

- a. Preparing, for burial or disposal, or directing and supervising burial or disposal of dead human bodies except supervising cremations.
- b. Making funeral arrangements or furnishing any funeral services in connection with disposition of dead human bodies or sale of any casket, vault, urn, or other burial receptacle.
- c. Using the words "funeral director", "mortician", or any other title implying that the person is engaged as a funeral director as defined in this section.

"Funeral director defined; business name. (a) A "funeral director" is a person engaged in or conducting, or holding oneself out as engaged in or conducting, the business of:

- (1) Preparing dead human bodies, other than by embalming, for disposition; or
  - (2) Meeting with families for the purpose of making at-need funeral arrangements; or
  - (3) Directing, arranging for or supervising the disposition of dead human bodies whether by burial or cremation; or
  - (4) Providing or maintaining a funeral establishment, branch funeral establishment or crematory.
- (b) A funeral director shall, in connection with such person's name or business, use the words "funeral director," "undertaker," "mortician," or any other title implying that such person is engaged in the business herein described.

Note: There is not statutory definition of the practice of embalming; however, the filling is defined as

"Embalmer" means a person who preserves, restores, and disinfects dead human bodies by the application of chemical substances either externally or internally, or both;

"Funeral director" means a person who, for profit, engages in or represents himself or herself as engaged in the supervision, direction, and arrangement of funeral services, transportation, burials, and disposals of dead human bodies;

"Embalming" means preparing, disinfecting, and preserving, either hypodermically, arterially, or by any other recognized means, the body of a deceased person for burial, cremation, or other disposition.

"Funeral directing" means the operation of a funeral home, or, by way of illustration and not limitation, any service whatsoever connected with the management of funerals, or the supervision of hearses or funeral cars, the purchase of caskets or other funeral merchandise, and retail sale and display thereof, the cleaning or dressing of dead human bodies for burial, and the performance or supervision of any service or act connected with the management of funerals from time of death until the body or bodies

"Funeral service profession" means the aggregate of all funeral service licensees and their duties and responsibilities in connection with the funeral as an organized, purposeful, time limited, flexible, group centered response to death.

"Practice of funeral service" means the engagement of a person in the care or disposition of the human remains or in the practice of disinfecting and preparing by embalming or otherwise the human remains for the funeral service, transportation of human remains to the place of burial or cremation, or the practice of helping to meet the emotions and disposition of the bereaved or the practice of funeral directing or embalming as presently known, whether under these titles or designations or otherwise.

"Practice of funeral service" also means making arrangements for funeral services or selling funeral supplies to the public or making financial arrangements for the rendering of such services or the sale of such supplies. "Practice of funeral service" does not mean the ownership or operation of a cemetery, crematorium, mausoleum or columbarium or any other facility used for burial of human remains.

"Practice of funeral service" does not include the transportation of human remains by an authorized person.

A license for the practice of funeral service as used in this chapter is the license given to a person who

"Funeral director" means an individual who is licensed by the Board to practice all aspects of mortuary science except for embalming. .

"Mortician" means an individual who practices mortuary science. (1) "Practice mortuary science" means:

- (i) To operate a funeral establishment;
- (ii) For compensation, to prepare a dead human body for disposition; or
- (iii) For compensation, to arrange for or make final disposition of a dead human body.

"Practice mortuary science" includes:

- (i) The practice of funeral direction; and
- (ii) Disinfecting or preserving a dead human body or any of its parts by arterial or cavity injection.

"Practice mortuary science" does not include:

- (i) The pickup, removal, or transportation of a dead human body, if the unlicensed individual is acting under the direction of a licensed mortician or funeral director; or

"Embalming", the business, practice, science or profession, as commonly practiced, of preserving, disinfecting and preparing in any manner dead human bodies for burial, cremation or transportation.

"Funeral directing", the business, practice or profession, as commonly practiced, of (a) directing or supervising funerals or providing funeral service; (b) handling or encasing, or providing services for handling or encasing, dead human bodies, and preparation of dead human bodies, otherwise than by embalming, for burial or disposal; (c) providing embalming services; (d) providing transportation, interment and disinterment of dead human bodies; and (e) maintaining an establishment so located, constructed and equipped as to permit the decent and sanitary handling of dead human bodies with suitable equipment in such establishment for such handling.

"Embalmer", any person engaged, or holding himself out as engaged, in the business, practice, science or profession of embalming, whether on his own behalf or in the employ of a registered and licensed funeral director.

"Funeral Director", any person engaged, or holding himself out as engaged, in the business, practice or profession of funeral directing. A FD must be qualified to prepare such death certificates and other documents as are required by the department of public health for the protection of the general public in

—"Practice of embalming" means the disinfecting or preserving of a dead human body, entirely or in part, by the use of a chemical substance, fluid, or gas in the body or by the introduction of the chemical substance, fluid, or gas into the body by a vascular or hypodermic injection, or by direct application into an organ or cavity.

—"Practice of funeral directing" means engaging in or representing oneself as engaging in the supervising of the burial and disposal of a dead human body; maintaining a funeral establishment for the preparation, disposition, and care of a dead human body; or using, in connection with the user's name or funeral establishment, the word "funeral director", "funeral service professional", "undertaker", or "mortician", or any other title embodying the words "mortuary science" or otherwise implying that one is engaged as a funeral director.

—"Practice of mortuary science" means the practice of embalming or the practice of funeral directing, or both.

--"Embalming" means the process of disinfecting and preserving a dead human body by chemically treating the body to reduce the presence and growth of organisms, to retard organic decomposition, and to restore an acceptable physical appearance..

--"Funeral director" means any person who, for compensation, arranges, directs, or supervises funerals, memorial services, or graveside services, or engages in the business or practice of preparing dead human bodies for final disposition by means other than embalming.

--"Mortician" means any person who, for compensation, practices the art of embalming and arranges, directs, or supervises funerals, memorial services, or graveside services, or engages in the business or practice of preparing dead human bodies for final disposition.

--"Mortuary science" means the study and practice of preparing dead human bodies for final disposition and providing funeral services. Mortuary science includes any conduct or action associated with the removal, preparation, transportation, arrangements for disposition, or final disposition of dead human bodies, including the actions and duties of a mortician or a funeral director.

—"Embalming" means the disinfection of the dead human body by replacing certain body fluids with preserving and disinfecting chemicals.

—"Practice of funeral service" means:

- (i) Providing shelter, care and custody of the human dead;
- (ii) Conducting immediate post-death activities;
- (iii) Preparing of the human dead by embalming or other methods for burial or other disposition;
- (iv) Being responsible for the transportation of the human dead, bereaved relatives and friends;
- (v) Making arrangements, financial or otherwise, for the providing of such services;
- (vi) The sale of funeral merchandise; or
- (vii) The practice or performance of any function of funeral directing and/or embalming as presently known, including those stipulated herein.

"Practice of embalming", the work of preserving, disinfecting and preparing by arterial embalming, including the chemical preparation of a dead human body for disposition. Practice of embalming includes all activities leading up to and including arterial and cavity embalming, including but not limited to raising of vessels and suturing of incisions of dead human bodies for funeral services, transportation, burial or cremation, or the holding of oneself out as being engaged in such work;

(8) "Practice of funeral directing", engaging by an individual in the business of preparing, otherwise

"Embalming" means:

- (a) obtaining burial or removal permits or assuming other duties incidental to the practice of embalming;
- (b) disinfecting and preserving or attempting to preserve dead human bodies in their entirety or in parts by the use of chemical substances, fluids, or gases ordinarily intended for that use by introducing the chemical substances, fluids, or gases into the body by vascular or hypodermic injection or by direct introduction into the organs or cavities; and
- (c) restorative art

"Funeral directing" includes:

- (a) supervising funerals;
- (b) the making of preneed or at-need contractual arrangements for funerals;
- (c) preparing dead bodies for burial, other than by embalming) maintaining a mortuary for the preparation, disposition, or care of dead human bodies; and
- e) representing to the public that one is a funeral director.

"Mortician" means a person licensed under this chapter to practice mortuary science.

"Mortuary science" means the profession or practice of funeral directing and embalming.

Funeral Directing is:

- (a) Counseling families or next of kin in regard to the conduct of a funeral service for a dead human body for burial, disposition, or cremation or directing or supervising burial, disposition, or cremation of dead human bodies. Cremation shall be considered as a final disposition of a dead human body the same as interment,
- (b) Providing for or maintaining a funeral establishment, or
- (c) The act of representing oneself as or using in connection with one's name the title of funeral director, mortician, or any other title implying that he or she is engaged in the business of funeral directing.

Embalming is: the practice of preparing a dead human body for burial or other final disposal by a licensed funeral director and embalmer or an apprentice, requesting and obtaining burial or removal permits, or assuming any of the other duties incident to the practice of embalming. Any person who publicly professes to be a funeral director and embalmer or an apprentice shall be deemed to be practicing embalming. The performance of the following acts shall also be deemed the practice of embalming:

- (a) The disinfection and preservation of dead human beings, entire or in part; and
- (b) The attempted disinfection and preservation thereof by the use or application of chemical

1. "Funeral director" means a person engaged in, conducting the business of or holding himself or herself out as engaged in:

- (a) Preparing or contracting to prepare by embalming or in any other manner dead human bodies for burial, cremation or disposal, or directing and supervising the burial, cremation or disposal of dead human bodies.
- (b) Directing, supervising or contracting to direct or supervise funerals.
- (c) The business of a funeral director by using the words "funeral director," "mortician" or any other title implying that the person is engaged in the business of funeral directing.

2. The term does not include:

- (a) A licensed embalmer, a funeral arranger or a person whose duties are limited to conducting direct cremations or immediate burials.
- (b) An owner of a funeral establishment or direct cremation facility, unless the owner engages in any

"Embalmer" means any person engaged, or holding oneself out as engaged, in embalming, whether on the person's own behalf or in the employ of another, and shall include any person who uses, in connection with the name, the word "embalmer," or any other word or title intending to imply or designate the person as an embalmer, or as one engaged in embalming. No person shall embalm dead human bodies or engage or hold himself out as engaged in embalming, whether on his own behalf or in the employ of another, unless he (meets the requirements for embalmers)

Embalming" means the business, practice, science, or profession of preserving, disinfecting, and preparing in any manner dead human bodies for burial, cremation, or transportation.

"Funeral directing" means the business, practice, or profession of:

(a) Directing or supervising funerals;

(b) The preparation or disposal of dead human bodies;

(c) Conducting or maintaining a preparation room or establishment equipped with necessary drainage and ventilation, which contains the necessary instruments and supplies for the preparation and embalming of dead human bodies for burial, cremation, or transportation; or

—"Embalming" means the disinfecting or preservation of a dead human body, entirely or in part by the use of chemical substances, fluids or gases in the body, or by introduction of the same into the body by vascular or hypodermic injection, or by direct application into the organs or cavities.

—"Funeral directing" means (1) the engaging in or conducting or holding oneself out as being engaged in or conducting the preparation (other than embalming) for burial or disposal and the direction or supervision of burial or disposal of dead human bodies; or (2) maintaining, using or operating a mortuary; or (3) in connection with one's name or mortuary using the words "mortician" or "funeral director" or "undertaker" or any other words or title of like import or signification.

—"Funeral directing" also means the engaging in or making, or holding oneself out as being engaged in or making, funeral arrangements, including at need funeral arrangements or preneed funeral arrangements; or the offering or holding oneself out as offering the opportunity to purchase or enroll in a prepaid funeral agreement. As used in this definition, "funeral arrangements," "at need funeral arrangements," "preneed funeral arrangements" and "prepaid funeral agreement" shall have the same meaning as they are defined in section 1 of P.L. 1993, c.147 (C.45:7-82).

—"Mortuary science" means embalming and funeral directing, as the same are herein defined.

—"Embalmer" means a qualified person who practices or engages in embalming, as the same is herein defined.

—"Funeral director" includes "undertaker" and "mortician" and means a qualified person who practices or engages in funeral directing, as the same is herein defined.

—"embalmer" means a person licensed to engage in embalming and preparing a dead human for funeral service at a funeral establishment that is licensed pursuant to the funeral service act;

—"embalming" means the disinfection, preservation and restoration, when possible, of a dead human body by a licensed funeral service practitioner or a licensed funeral service intern under the supervision of a licensed funeral service practitioner;

—"funeral arranger" means a person licensed to engage in arrangements and directing of funeral services at a funeral establishment that is licensed pursuant to the Funeral Services Act;

—"funeral service practitioner" means a person licensed to engage in the practice of funeral service at a funeral establishment or commercial establishment that is licensed pursuant to the Funeral Services Act;

—"funeral service practitioner" means a person licensed to engage in the practice of funeral service at

(a) "Funeral director" means a person to whom a valid license as such has been duly issued.  
(b) "Undertaker" means a person to whom a valid license as such has been duly issued.  
(c) "Embalmer" means a person to whom a valid license as such has been duly issued.  
(d) "Funeral directing" means the care and disposal of the body of a deceased person and/or the preserving, disinfecting and preparing by embalming or otherwise, the body of a deceased person for funeral services, transportation, burial or cremation; and/or funeral directing or embalming as presently known whether under these titles or designations or otherwise.  
(e) "Undertaking" means the care, disposal, transportation, burial or cremation by any means other than embalming of the body of a deceased person.

(d) "Embalmer" means any person engaged in the practice of embalming.  
(e) "Embalming" means the preservation and disinfection or attempted preservation and disinfection of dead human bodies by application of chemicals externally or internally or both and the practice of restorative art including the restoration or attempted restoration of the appearance of a dead human body. Embalming shall not include the washing or use of soap and water to cleanse or prepare a dead human body for disposition by the authorized agents, family, or friends of the deceased who do so privately without pay or as part of the ritual washing and preparation of dead human bodies prescribed by religious practices; provided, that no dead human body shall be handled in a manner inconsistent with G.S. 130A-395.

(f) "Funeral directing" means engaging in the practice of funeral service except embalming

(g) "Funeral director" means any person engaged in the practice of funeral directing

(i) "Funeral service licensee" means a person who is duly licensed and engaged in the practice of funeral service.

(j) "Funeral service" means the aggregate of all funeral service licensees and their duties and responsibilities in connection with the funeral as an organized, purposeful, time-limited, flexible, group-

— "Funeral directing" means the care and disposal of the body of a deceased person; the preserving, disinfecting, and preparing, by embalming or otherwise, the body of a deceased person for funeral services, transportation to a point of final disposition, burial, or cremation; or arranging, directing, or supervising a funeral, memorial service, or graveside service

— "Funeral practitioner" means a person licensed by the board to practice funeral directing and embalming.

— "Intern embalmer" means a person registered with the board to engage in learning the practice of

(A) "Embalming" means the process of chemically treating the dead human body by any of the following to reduce the presence and growth of microorganisms, to temporarily slow organic decomposition, and to restore acceptable physical appearance:

(C) "Funeral directing" means the business or profession of directing or supervising funerals for profit from one or more funeral homes licensed under this chapter, the arrangement or sale of funeral services, the filling out or execution of a funeral service contract, the business or profession of preparing dead human bodies for burial by means other than embalming, the disposition of dead human bodies, the provision or maintenance of a place for the preparation, the care, or disposition of dead human bodies, the use in connection with a business of the term "funeral director," "undertaker," "mortician," or any other term from which can be implied the business of funeral directing, or the holding out to the public that one is a funeral director or a disposer of dead human bodies.

(E) "Embalmer" means a person who engages, in whole or in part, in embalming and who is licensed under this chapter.

(F) "Funeral director" means a person who engages, in whole or in part, in funeral directing and who is licensed under this chapter.

-- "Embalmer" means a person who disinfects or preserves dead human remains, entire or in part, by the use of chemical substances, fluids or gases in the remains, or by the introduction of same into the remains by vascular or hypodermic injection, or by direct application into organs or cavities;

-- "Funeral director" means a person who:

- a. is engaged in or conducts or represents themselves as being engaged in preparing for the burial or disposal and directing and supervising the burial or disposal of dead human remains,
- b. is engaged in or conducts or represents themselves as being engaged in maintaining a funeral establishment for the preparation and the disposition, or for the care of dead human remains,
- c. uses, in connection with the name of the person or funeral establishment, the words "funeral director" or "undertaker" or "mortician" or any other title implying that the person is engaged as a funeral director,
- d. sells funeral service merchandise to the public, or
- e. is responsible for the legal and ethical operation of a crematory;

-- "Directing a funeral" or "funeral directing" means directing funeral services from the time of the first call until final disposition or release to a common carrier or release to next of kin of the deceased or the

"Funeral services" means services customarily provided by a funeral service practitioner including, but not limited to, care and preparation of human remains for final disposition, professional services relating to a funeral or an alternative to a funeral, transportation of human remains, limousine services, use of facilities or equipment for viewing human remains, visitation, memorial services or services that are used in connection with a funeral or alternative to a funeral, coordinating or conducting funeral rites or ceremonies, and other services provided in connection with a funeral, alternative to a funeral or final disposition of human remains.

— An Embalmer license relates specifically to the hands-on preparation of human remains.

— A Funeral Service Practitioner license is required when the practitioner is engaged directly or

The term "funeral director" shall include any person engaged in the profession of a funeral director or in the care and disposition of the human dead, or in the practice of disinfecting and preparing by embalming the human dead for the funeral service, burial or cremation, or the supervising of the burial, transportation or disposal of deceased humanbodies, or in the practice of funeral directing or embalming as presently known, whether under these titles or designation or otherwise. The term "funeral director" shall also mean a person who makes arrangements for funeral service and who sells funeral merchandise to the public incidental to such service or who makes financial arrangements for the rendering of such services and the sale of such merchandise.

"Embalmer" means any person who has completed:

- a. An internship;
  - b. Full course of study at an accredited mortuary science school;
  - c. Has passed the national board examination and the practical examination administered by the Board;
- and
- d. Is engaged in the practice or profession of embalming, as defined by this Part.

17. "Embalming" means the practice, science or profession of preserving, disinfecting, and preparing in any manner, dead human bodies for burial, cremation or transportation.

"Funeral directing" means:

- a. Conducting funeral services; or
- b. The arrangement for disposition of dead human bodies, except in the case of any religion where the preparation of the body or the provision of funeral services should be done according to religious custom or belief;
- c. Only funeral directors/embalmers, working for a licensed funeral establishment, shall be allowed to meet with families for the purpose of arranging funerals.
- d. Any person who assumed an ownership interest from one's spouse or any widow or widower of a licensed funeral director who, as of November 1, 1995, has been meeting with families to arrange for

"Embalmer" means a person licensed by the board to disinfect and preserve or attempt to disinfect and preserve the dead human body, entirely or in part, by the use of application of chemicals, fluids, or gases, externally or internally, or both, by their introduction into the body by vascular or hypodermic injections, by direct application into the organs or cavities, or by other method and includes the restoration or attempted restoration of the appearance of the dead human body.

"Embalming" means the disinfection of the dead human body by replacing certain body fluids with preserving and disinfecting chemicals.

"Funeral director" means a person licensed by the board to engage for hire or profit in the profession of arranging, directing, or supervising funerals.

"Practice of funeral service" means:

- (a) engaging in providing shelter, care, and custody of the human dead;
- (b) the practice of preparing the human dead by embalming or other methods for burial or other disposition;
- (c) arranging for the transportation of the human dead;

— "Embalmer," any person engaged in or conducting, or holding the person out as engaged in or conducting, the business of disinfecting, preserving, or both, or attempting to disinfect or preserve, or both, or cremate, dead human bodies, in whole or in part by use of chemicals externally, internally or by other methods, as approved by the department of health;

— "Funeral director," any person, partnership, limited liability company, corporation, association, or organization engaged in or conducting or holding that person out as engaged in or conducting, at a funeral establishment, the business of preparing, other than embalming, for burial or disposal, and supervising the burial or disposal of dead human bodies, or who shall, in connection with the person's

"Embalming" means the preservation and disinfection, restoration or attempted preservation or disinfection of dead human bodies by the application of chemicals externally or internally, or both;

"Funeral directing" means the:

- (i) Practice of directing or supervising funerals or the practice of preparing dead human bodies for burial by any means, other than by embalming, or the disposition of dead human bodies;
  - (ii) Making of arrangements to provide for funeral services or the making of financial arrangements for the rendering of funeral services;
  - (iii) Provision or maintenance of a place for the preparation for disposition or for the care or disposition of dead human bodies;
  - (iv) Use of the word or term "funeral director," "undertaker," "mortician," "funeral parlor," "funeral chapel" or any other word or term from which can be implied the practice of funeral directing; or
  - (v) Holding out to the public that one is a funeral director or engaged in a practice described in this subdivision (6);
- (B) For the purposes of this chapter, the following are exempted from the definition of "funeral directing":
- (i) The sale, maintenance and beautification of grave spaces;
  - (ii) The sale, installation and maintenance of permanent grave or crypt markers;
  - (iii) The opening and closing of a grave or crypt and the provision of the necessary grave or crypt

— "Embalmer" means a person licensed under this chapter who for compensation, wholly or partly, disinfects or preserves a dead human body by:

(A) using chemical substances, fluids, or gases, including by introducing those substances, fluids, or gases into the body by:

- (i) vascular or hypodermic injection; or
- (ii) direct application into the organs or cavities; or

(B) another method intended to disinfect or preserve a dead human body or to restore body tissues and structures.

— "Funeral director" means a person licensed under this chapter who engages in for compensation, or represents to the public as being engaged in for compensation, the preparation, other than by embalming, of a dead human body for burial or other disposition.

— "Funeral directing" means acts associated with or arranging for the disposition of a dead human body, performed by a person for compensation, from the time of first call until:

- (A) inurnment, interment, or entombment services are complete; or
- (B) the body is permanently transported out of this state.

— "Funeral director" means a licensed person who is the owner, co-owner, employee, or manager of a licensed funeral establishment and who, for compensation, engages in the practice of funeral service.

— "Practice of funeral service" means arranging, directing, or providing for the care, preparation, or disposition of dead human bodies for a fee or other compensation. This includes:

- (A) meeting with the public to select a method of disposition or funeral observance and merchandise;
- (B) entering into contracts, either at-need or pre-need, for the provision of dispositions, funeral observances, and merchandise;
- (C) arranging, directing, or performing the removal or transportation of a dead human body;
- (D) securing or filing certificates, permits, forms, or other documents;
- (E) supervising or arranging a funeral, memorial, viewing, or graveside observance;
- (F) holding oneself out to be a licensed funeral director by using the words or terms "funeral director,"

"Embalmer" means any person engaged in the practice of embalming.

"Embalming" means the process of chemically treating the dead human body by arterial injection and cavity treatment or, when necessary, hypodermic tissue injection to reduce the presence and growth of microorganisms to temporarily retard organic decomposition.

"Funeral directing" means the for-profit profession of directing or supervising funerals, preparing human dead for burial by means other than embalming, or making arrangements for funeral services or the financing of funeral services.

"Funeral director" means any person engaged in the practice of funeral directing.

"Funeral service licensee" means a person who is licensed in the practice of funeral services.

"Practice of funeral services" means engaging in the care and disposition of the human dead, the preparation of the human dead for the funeral service, burial or cremation, the making of arrangements for the funeral service or for the financing of the funeral service and the selling or making of financial

-- "Embalmer" means a person engaged in the profession or business of disinfecting and preserving human remains for transportation or final disposition.

-- "Funeral director" means a person engaged in the profession or business of providing for the care, shelter, transportation, and arrangements for the disposition of human remains that may include arranging and directing funeral, memorial, or other services

— "Embalmer" means a person licensed to practice embalming.

— "Embalming" means the practice of introducing chemical substances, fluids or gases used for the purpose of preservation or disinfection into the vascular system or hollow organs of a dead human body by arterial or hypodermic injection for the restoration of the physical appearance of a deceased.

— "Funeral service licensee" means a person who has met the requirements to be a funeral director and an embalmer. Upon the effective date of this rule, where ever the terms which refer to the act of being a funeral director and an embalmer are used, the term "funeral service license" or "funeral service licensee" shall apply. Where ever the term "embalmer" is use, the term "funeral service licensee" shall apply. Where ever the term "funeral director" is used, the term "funeralservice licensee" shall also apply but not replace the term "funeral director."t.

— "Funeral directing" means the business of engaging in the following:

- (1) The shelter, custody or care of a deceased;
- (2) The preparation of a deceased for burial or other disposition;
- (3) The arranging or supervising of a funeral or memorial service for a deceased; and

— "Embalming" means disinfecting or preserving dead human bodies, entire or in part, by the use of chemical substances, fluids or gases in the body, or by the introduction of same into the body by vascular or hypodermic injection, or by direct application into the organs or cavities for the purpose of preservation or disinfection.

— A "funeral director" means any of the following:

(a) A person engaged in or conducting, or holding himself or herself out, in whole or in part, as being engaged in any of the following:

1. Embalming or otherwise preparing for the burial or disposal of dead human bodies.

(xiv) "Embalming" means the disinfecting, preparing or preserving for final disposition of dead human bodies, in whole or in part, or any attempt to do so, by the use or application of chemical substances, fluids or gases on the body, or by the introduction of the same into the body by vascular or hypodermic injection or by direct introduction into organs or cavities, or by any other method or process;

(xv) "Funeral director" means a person who assumes the responsibility for the operations of a particular funeral establishment or multiple funeral establishments, or crematory or multiple crematories, or a chemical disposition facility or multiple chemical disposition facilities, who ensures that the funeral establishment, crematory or chemical disposition facility complies with this chapter and all other laws under which the funeral establishment, crematory or chemical

disposition facility is operated, who is permitted by law to perform funeral directing and who:

- (A) Has been licensed prior to July 1, 2014 by the board of embalming as a funeral director; or
- (B) Is a licensed funeral service practitioner.

(xvii) "Funeral service practice," means the all encompassing combined practice of funeral directing or undertaking, and embalming, and includes the practice of conducting and overseeing all activities related to the disposition of human remains. "Funeral service practice" includes all of the following unless exempted from this act pursuant to W.S. 33-16-529:

- (A) Counseling individuals, families or next of kin about the final disposition of human remains;
- (B) Directing or supervising funerals;
- (C) Providing for or maintaining a funeral establishment;
- (D) Making pre-need or at-need contractual arrangements for funerals, memorial services, celebrations of life, wakes or any similar service or activities;
- (E) Removal and transportation of dead human bodies from the location of death or any other location for the purpose of final disposition;
- (F) Preparing dead human bodies for viewing or final disposition, other than by embalming, cremation or chemical disposition;

Practice of funeral directing - the care, preservation, disposal, or preparation of human remains for funeral services, burial, cremation, or transportation, including the provision of these services pursuant to a preneed contract.

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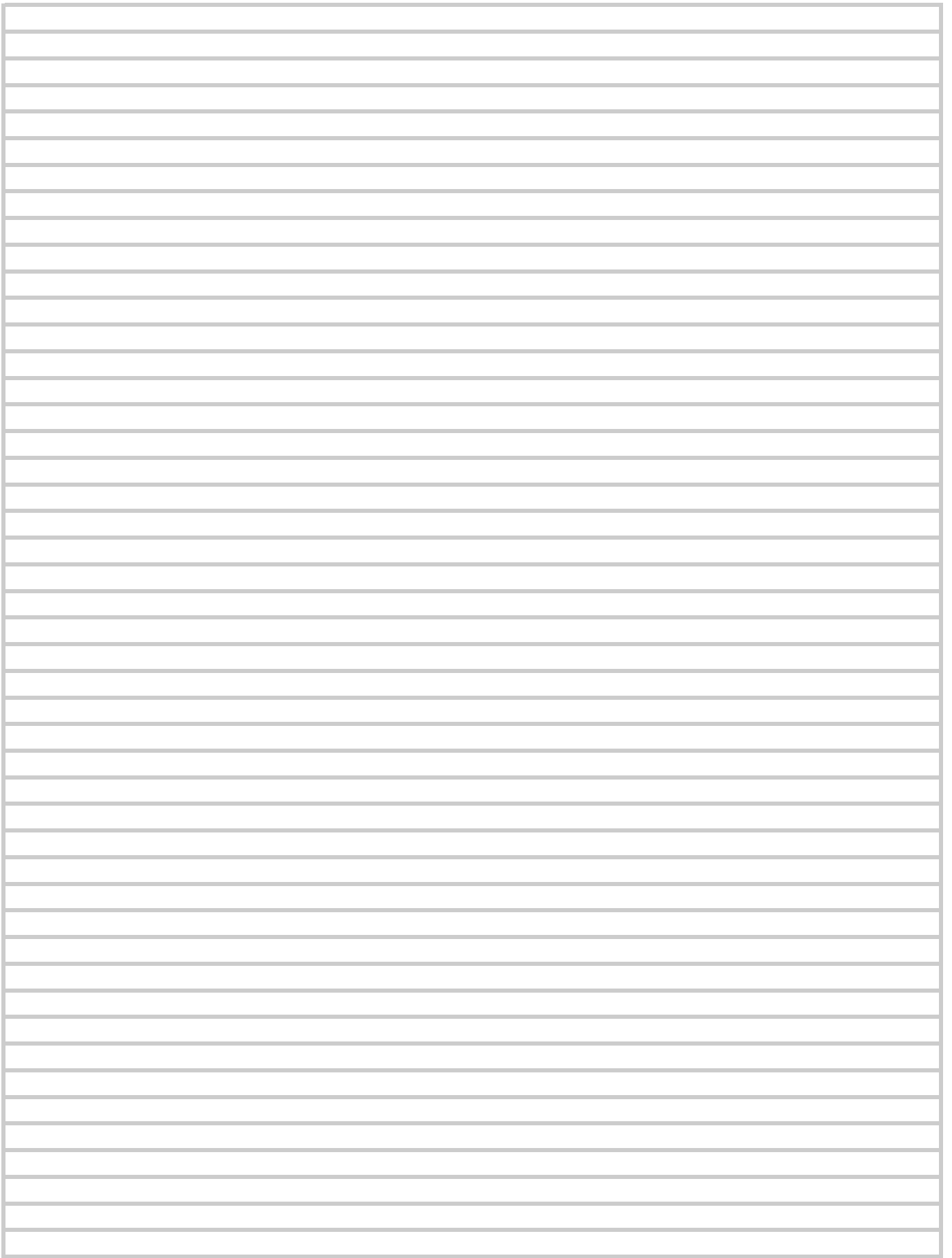
