These funds cover the costs of over 1,600 members who tutor underprivileged students, restore natural habitats, provide services to the homeless population, connect underserved populations to health care resources, and so much more. Members will leverage volunteers who will be engaged in 1:1 tutoring or 1:1 mentoring to K-12 students



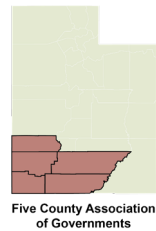

BYU Family, Home and Social Science (Education Award Program) AmeriCorps members support mental health or substance abuse treatment facilities by providing clinical services under the supervision of a licensed mental health professional.



Salt Lake County's Most Vulnerable Populations program helps individuals experiencing homelessness to obtain housing and connect them to services that increase self-sufficiency through supplemental case management.



Five County Association of Governments AmeriCorps members support ongoing efforts in the areas of outreach, screening, education and enrollment of individuals into public benefits to improve overall health, welfare, food security and financial well-being of residents in Beaver, Garfield, Kane, Iron and Washington Counties.



STEM Initiative AmeriCorps Program engages underprivileged youth in the STEM fields. Through tutoring and mentoring, students increase their STEM knowledge and improve their engagement and behavior.



The **Utah Conservation Corps** partners with state and federal land management agencies on projects that include trail maintenance, noxious weed removal, habitat restoration, fuels reduction, and environmental education.



The **Utah Healthcare Corps** provides education around preventative care and insurance enrollment. Members also work to reduce barriers to healthcare and expand services for the medically underserved.



Utah Higher Education AmeriCorps Network (Education Award Program) members from seven colleges and universities support various organizations through direct service and capacity building. Members serve in the areas of tutoring, mentoring, student teaching, nursing, dental hygiene, mental health/counseling, environmental education, economic opportunity, and more.



WabiSabi Moab AmeriCorps members serving with WabiSabi combat poverty through a specialized rural corps dedicated to the needs of Utah's smaller communities. Operating at sites in Moab, Bluff, and Green River, AmeriCorps members address affordable housing and literacy.

Welcome Baby is a free community service designed to promote a healthy, secure, and enjoyable beginning for parents, new babies, and their family members. AmeriCorps members in this program will recruit and manage volunteers to provide home visits to increase child-development support to 580+ new parents.
