

**CITY OF LOGAN, UTAH  
ORDINANCE NO. 13-58**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS OF LOGAN MUNICIPAL CODE  
REGARDING NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCILS**

WHEREAS, the state legislature has granted general welfare power to the City Council, independent, apart from, and in addition to, its specific grants of legislative authority, which enables the City of Logan to pass ordinances as are necessary and proper to provide for the safety, promote the prosperity, improve the peace and good order, comfort, and convenience of the city and its inhabitants, and for the protection of property in the city; and

WHEREAS, the Logan Municipal Code establishes Neighborhood Councils to provide another means of communication between citizens and their elected officials; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the following ordinance is in the City's best interest;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOGAN, UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

Chapter 2.36  
NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCILS

2.36.010: ESTABLISHED:

There is established a neighborhood council consisting of seven (7) voting persons members chosen by the mayor with the advice and consent of the municipal council, six (6) of whom must reside in and be selected from six (6) separate areas or neighborhoods within the city and one representative for the student population of Utah State University who resides student residing in Logan ~~selected represent the student population of Utah State University.~~ Terms of service shall be for three (3) years. Any vacancies occurring by death, disability, removal, or resignation shall be filled by a nomination of the mayor with the advice and consent of the municipal council ~~for the unexpired portion of the term concerned.~~ (Ord. 04-55 § 1, 2004: Ord. 01-71 § 2, 2001: Ord. 99-8 § 1, 1999: Ord. 98-22 § 1, 1998: prior code § 2-12-1(a))

Alternate members for each area will also be assigned to serve in an advisory and support capacity for the neighborhood representative. Alternate members will be selected according to the council's bylaws. Alternate members will typically be non-voting members of the neighborhood council except when one is delegated to vote in the absence of a voting member according to the council's bylaws.

SECTION 2: Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon publication.
