We want to acknowledge and celebrate all of the hard work each one of you has put in for Utah's Zero- eight age population and their families. Despite the onslaught of challenges we all faced in 2020, there was great growth and participation within our Early Childhood Utah Advisory Council. The Executive Committee and five Subcommittees devoted a great amount of time to the goals they selected as well as pivoting to a virtual model to ensure practices and resources could continue to function virtually.

We would like to share a few highlights. Three proposals from our Subcommittee were heard at the Governor's Commission in 2020: Early Care and Education (Professional Development), Data and Research (three data products, including ECIDS) and Health Subcommittee (ASQ screening).

Subcommittees saw great participation and progress. Parent Engagement (framework to incorporate family voices into EC across the state) Mental Health subcommittee's (trauma screening, statewide mental health for providers and the adoption and expansion of an infant and early childhood mental health competencies and endorsement system for the state of Utah).

The ECU Advisory Executive Council met 14 additional times to support the council and subcommittee work, finalizing the rule, bylaws, general membership, subcommittee membership and created a process document (ECU Commission Update and Recommendation Template) to assist the work being done by ECU.
