Utah Health Data Committee (HDC) Meeting

1. Welcome

Chair Dave Jackson called the meeting to order after establishing a member quorum.

2. Approval of November 17, 2020 Minutes

3. Sub-Committee Reports

a. Transparency Advisory Group (TAG)

Alan Ormsby reported that the TAG completed most of the 2020 goals and asked to move the unfinished ones to 2021. New goals will be set during the next TAG meeting.

b. Data Use Sub-Committee (DUS)

Carl Letamendi reported that the subcommittee approved three requests from research groups at the University of Utah.

c. Utah Payers Advisory Subcommittee (UPAS)

Stephen Foxley reported that meetings were changed to quarterly (November, February, May and August). The next UPAS meeting is scheduled for February 3, 2021.

d. Utah Healthcare Facilities Subcommittee (UHFS)

Jim Bradshaw reported that the next meeting is scheduled on February 4, 2021.

4. Legislative Updates:

Navina Forsythe presented the <u>Utah Code 26-33a-116</u> on health care billing data and how privacy is protected. She also provided an update on <u>HB117</u>, a vaccine reporting requirement and the restructuring of the Executive Branch which may combine social service agencies such as Human Services, Workforce Services and the Department of Health into a single agency.

Health Waste Calculator

Carl Letamendi updated the committee on HB0195. Milliman will grant access to OHCS the HWC at no cost for 12 months and provide a report summarizing output for 2017 – 2019. OHCS will be able to use the HWC portal to conduct analysis and meet the mandate. The amendment is pending final signature authorities.

Action Item: Carl Letamendi to share the update in the next TAG meeting.

5. DataByte: Flu Vaccination Trends

Brantley Scott shared the recent <u>flu vaccination trends</u> Databyte, which compares 2019 and 2020 claims data from the APCD. Claims for flu vaccines given in a medical setting decreased in October while flu shot claims in pharmacy settings increased. The report shows that children between the age groups of 6-months to four years old had a lower number of claims for vaccines in 2020. Others between the ages of 5 to 12 years-old depict similar trends.

6. Use of APCD for Public Health Purposes

Carl Letamendi asked how the APCD could be used in ways to improve public health. The APCD is a great resource to access data that could benefit citizens of the Utah and their health. Sarah Woolsey asked about the 618 project and how it relates to public health. The project entails six areas with 18 evidence-based interventions which could be used with the APCD to identify gaps of care and produce a cost analysis. An increase in the use of the APCD will require the capacity of data availability and that it is sustainable.

7. Other Business

Sterling Petersen presented proposed trends preventive healthcare claims to monitor on a regular basis.

Sarah Woolsey asked if anyone is interested in Life with Dignity Order to refer to amendment of SB83.

Charles Hawley discussed and provided some background on <u>Section 115 of The No Surprises Act (State</u> All Payer Claims Databases) and another bill at the Federal level which proposes a national APCD.
