Proposed Changes to the Public Pool Regulation

Findings of Fact:

The **Public Pool Regulation** was adopted by the Davis County Board of Health in 1964 to create standards regarding the design, installation, operation, and maintenance of public pools in order to protect public health.

The changes to the **Public Pool Regulation** include removing requirements on private pools, procedural language, and the Licensed Pool Operator (LPO) requirement with its associated fee. The changes also include a revision of the fees for the seasonal and annual pool permits and the addition of a late fee which is consistent with other Department programs.

1. The proposed changes and the new Davis County Regulation are not in conflict with Federal Law, State Statute or Rule.
2. The Board of Health provided a public hearing as required by law. The hearing was held on December 10, 2020, and written comments were received until December 18, 2020.

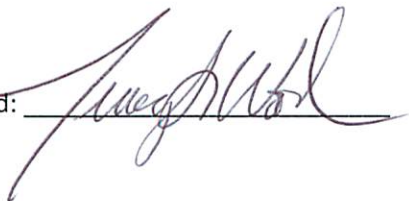
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### Conclusions of Law:
