What is a Children's Justice Center?

The Children's Justice Center (known as a children's advocacy center in other states) is a child-focused, home like facility that brings together professionals from law enforcement, child protective services, prosecution, mental health, medical services, and victim advocacy to work together on child abuse cases.



STATS

- 873 Kids Interviewed
- 36% Identified as Male
- 64% Identified as Female
- 77% of interviews were for concerns of sexual abuse

2019

- 982 Kids Interviewed
- 31% Identified as Male
- 69% Identified as Female
- 75% of interviews were for concerns of sexual abuse




Utah Code 67-5b-103 Appropriation and Funding

(1) *Funding for centers under this section is intended to be broad-based, provided by a line item appropriation by the Legislature to the attorney general, and is intended to include federal grant money, local government money, and private donations* (*Emphasis added)

(2) The money appropriated shall be used to contract with the county responsible for the operation and accountability of a center in accordance with Section 67-5b-102.

(3) The money appropriated may be used by the program to provide resources and contract as needed to support the development of the program and the implementation of evidence-based practices and requirements.





- Designs approved. Waiting on permits to begin construction.






How is VOCA funded?

Federal revenues deposited into the Crime Victims Fund come from the following sources:

- Criminal fines, with exceptions for funds related to certain environmental, railroad, unemployment insurance, and postal service violations.
- Forfeited appearance bonds.
- Special forfeitures of collateral profits from crime.
- Special assessments that range from \$25 on individuals convicted of misdemeanors and from \$400 on corporations convicted of felonies.
- Gifts, donations, and bequests by private parties, as provided by the USA PATRIOT Act 2001, which went into effect in 2002.

The U.S. House and U.S. Senate are finalizing their fiscal year 2021 funding bills. The Senate's version of the funding bill includes a MASSIVE (40%) cut to the amount of funding released from VOCA, while the House would keep the same amount they released last year. The proposed 40% cut in the Senate bill is on top of a 25% cut made last year.

Impact of VOCA Cuts on Victim Services

Year 1: 10% Cut = \$93,091.35

Eliminate Clinical Coordinator Position (Care Process Model Administrator)

Year 2: 15% Cut = \$125,673.32

Eliminate 3 MSW paid intern positions, trainings, emergency funds, interpretative services

25% reduction = \$218,764.67



COMMISSIONER LEE - WHAT IS THEIR REASONING FOR THIS CUT?

REBECCA MARTELL - THEY DON'T HAVE AS MANY FUNDS GOING INTO IT BECAUSE DEFERRED AND NON-PROSECUTION AGREEMENTS ARE GOING INTO THE GENERAL TREASURY RATHER THAN GOING INTO THIS CRIME VICTIM FUND.

SO, THERE IS A PROPOSED BILL THAT WILL HOPEFULLY FIX THAT BUT AS IT STANDS RIGHT NOW, ALL OF THAT MONEY IS GOING INTO THE GENERAL TREASURY.

What is Child Traumatic Stress?

Child traumatic stress is when children and adolescents are exposed to traumatic events or traumatic situations, and when this exposure overwhelms their ability to cope.

When children have been exposed to situations where they feared for their lives, believed they could have been injured, witnessed violence, or tragically lost a loved one, they may show signs of traumatic stress. The impact (or any given child depends partly on the objective disrupts partly on his or her supportive reaction to the events, and partly on his or her age and developmental level).

If your child is experiencing traumatic stress, you might notice the following signs:

- Difficulty sleeping and nightmares
- Refusing to go to school
- Lack of appetite
- Bed wetting or other regression in behavior
- Irritability with developmental milestones
- Anger
- Getting into fights at school or fighting more with siblings
- Difficulty paying attention to teachers at school and to parents at home
- Avoidance of scary situations
- Withdrawal from friends or activities
- Self-criticism or shame
- Intrusive memories of what happened
- Play that includes reenacting the event



How To Get Involved






