Matters for Discussion

- **1. Poly Platform Presentation**. Representative of Poly Platform, Kamel Greene, presented information to the Council. A copy is attached and incorporated by this reference.
- 2. Green Waste Discussion. Urban Livability Director, Sharen Hauri, said City staff recently had a discussion with Ace Disposal about what it would take to get a green waste program started in South Salt Lake. She talked about what Ace offers and whether or not green waste disposal would work in the City. A survey was done to see how many residents are interested in this program. She discussed the number of residents that responded to that survey and added this survey was done three years ago and it may need to be revisited.

Finance Director, Kyle Kershaw, said Ace would require a 60-75% participation rate from City residents in order to offer curbside green waste service. He discussed the cost of this service and what factors that entails.

The Council discussed alternative possibilities for green waste and also conducting another survey for green waste.

3. Visioning – Budget Priorities Discussion. Consultant, Lindsey Ferrari, led the budgeting conversation and shared the Council's top budget priorities. A copy is attached and incorporated by this reference.

The Council had a lengthy discussion on what they feel the top budget priority should be. A majority of the Council thinks the creation of a storm water utility fee is the number one priority for this year's budget. Another top priority was employee raises and keeping up with the steps for public safety.

There was more discussion on the other items on the top priorities list and what may or may not belong on the list.

The budget discussion will be continued to a future meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 7:05 p.m.


