



THEN AND NOW

Information from Historic Preservation Committee



One of the most famous Taylorsville gathering places long ago was the S & M Skating Rink, located at 3950 South Redwood Road. This parcel of land is now out of Taylorsville City's boundaries, however, long ago it was the place to hang out, to be seen, and to see who could impress others with their skating prowess. Many local Taylorsville/Bennion residents frequented the skating rink for fun and good times, some who ended up marrying each other later on in life.

The rink was built in 1947 and was in operation for 40 years. The "S" stood for Stan, and the "M" stood for Myrl. Their last name was Todd. Stan was an entrepreneur who also had other business ventures. Later their son, Dean, and his wife, Jessie, were the owners/operators.

Originally the land belonged to Abraham and Ann Tofts Todd, who homesteaded approximately 75 acres of land bordering Redwood Road. There have been several owners since the 80's, two of them being a reception center and a boutique. Today, the building is the Landmark Apostolic Church.


traffic.


CALLING ALL HAM OPERATORS:
