

MINUTES OF THE STUDY SESSION – APRIL 13, 2021

The Board of Education of the Alpine School District met in a study session on Tuesday, April 13, 2021 at 4:00 P.M. at the Alpine School District Office. The meeting was live streamed to the public.

Board members present: Board President Mark J. Clement, Vice President Sarah L. Beeson, Stacy M. Bateman, Amber L. Bonner, Sara M. Hacken, Julie E. King, and Ada S. Wilson.

Also present: Interim Superintendent Dr. Shane J. Farnsworth, Business Administrator Robert W. Smith, and members of the administrative staff.

FY22 M&O Budget

Business Administrator Rob Smith and Budget Director Randy Upton presented the FY22 M&O budget that has been reviewed by the budget committee and the administrative cabinet. They reported that there were more requests than money available, but the decisions made were based on board priorities. The budget documents and the meeting presentation are available to the public on the district website, <https://alpineschools.org/business/>.

Tax Increments

Director of Accounting Steve Reese presented information regarding tax increments. He explained that the target needed to maximize our state guarantee is 20 increments between the board and voted levy. Currently, ASD is at 21.8 increments. In FY20, there was an increase of two tax increments and it was used to provide a 1% salary increase to our employees. In FY18 there was an increase of 1.6 tax increments which was used for capital, facility maintenance, to catch up on some deferred maintenance, as well as additional resources in the M&O budget for resources in social, emotional, wellbeing (SEW) support initiative. One tax increment equates to approximately \$3.45 million annually. If the average home value is \$377,300, one tax increment is 1.5% or \$1.73 monthly. Two increments would be 2.9% or \$3.46 a month and three increments would be a 4.4% increase or \$5.19 a month. Some of the needs that would be addressed through an increase in tax increments would be to address the decrease in state funding from the capital fund. The budget team has estimated we will realize a \$4 million decrease in that allotment this year. Another need is the deferred maintenance. Since 2016, approximately \$82.5 million of maintenance has been deferred on district facilities. Lastly, another need is property acquisition. With the increase in property costs, the district is paying approximately \$250,000 an acre. The budget team's recommendation is that the board consider an increase of three increments in the capital local levy, which would generate approximately \$10.3 million annually. Steve Reese and Rob Smith addressed questions from the board members.

RTL Update

Assistant Superintendent Dr. John Patten gave the board members an update on the status of the Return to Learn plan. Teacher and principal focus groups have been conducted to gather input that was reviewed by the elementary and secondary outcome teams and the K-12 leadership team. A survey will go out to parents, employees and students next week. Dr. Patten also reviewed the USBE waiver of the 990 hour seat time for this year. The 180 days are still required.

Consolidation Study

The decision to consolidate Geneva and Suncrest elementary schools was an action item in the April 13th board meeting.

Board Governance

Board member Amber Bonner led a discussion on chapter 6 of *The Governance Core*.

Community Comments

The following written comments were received and read by the board members:

Sarah Leavitt: I believe that school should remain on the modified schedule for next year. Whether COVID is a concern or not, I have not heard a negative thing about the mid-week break. It could be a remediation day for students who need the extra help. It gives students room to breathe and does wonders for mental health, which is something the district needs.

Susan Turner: Please stop requiring masks for students. There is no evidence that school children are spreaders of COVID-19. All teachers and high risk individuals in Utah have had the opportunity to vaccinate. Anyone high risk who has not been vaccinated can take precautions of their own. Do it for the mental and emotional health of the students. Masks are dehumanizing and demoralizing. My

15 year old child has struggled with depression, anxiety and isolation this year. He has been unable to make friends, largely due to masks, which make casual conversations and interactions impossible. I'm begging you to please do the right thing and allow people to choose whether they mask up or not. The governor and the health department do not have the authority to do this.

Emily Gunnell: I am a mom of four kids. Two in elementary and two in middle school. I would really like to see a return to full-time in person school. As a mom of 2 middle schoolers who are high performing no matter the situation, they are crossing their fingers for a full time return. Wednesday in its current format as an

"online day" is like a Saturday in the middle of the school week; there is not a whole lot of homework they are getting done that day, and their teachers aren't pushing them as hard. I'm not sure if this is a district decision or not, but all of the extra days off at the end of term have also been pointless. The school says it's for the kids who are struggling, but what are Wednesday online days, and late bus Tuesdays for?

For my two elementary school kids, this shortened schedule has been difficult. For my kindergartener, can I just say, the shorter days are the worst and leave it at that. For my 3rd grader, she struggles a bit more with school and she often has been asked to stay in from recess to finish her work because the day is shorter and the teacher doesn't have any wiggle room with her schedule. Just bring it all back to full time for 2021-2022 school year please.

Marnee Lemon: Please go back to the full time schedule. I feel like the shortened day and Wednesday online were helpful for teachers struggling with both online and in person students. But Alpine has said that there will be no online next year, so that extra time that was provided in response to COVID and overworked teachers, should not be necessary. I feel like the Wednesday online/at home became a play day for my secondary students. They either slept in and did 1-2 hours of work during the day or went to work and then did their usual amount of homework. I know many teachers who have said that they have not been able to cover close to what they have in the past because of the shortened schedule. I would like my children to be able to learn how to use time wisely and be prepared for the workforce- most adults don't get a day off in the middle of the week to "catch up." I know a lot of people have said that it had been good for remediation for students but other sources have told me there are more failing students this school year than in years past. Please help our students and put them back in school full-time.

Amber Young: It has been brought to my attention that there is discussion about a four day week and/or shortened days being presented by teachers for next year. I wanted to voice my opinion on the matter as a parent and say that I disagree with this proposal. I think these kids need to be back in school and even have lunch with their peers. I know that this year has been different and we all learned to adjust but I don't see any reason why we should be cutting back on children and their education. I think these kids need to be back in school the regular amount of hours so that we can help them learn, grow and be prepared for college years so that they can be successful.

4. Alpine Foundation Report

The latest Alpine Foundation report was included for the Board's review.

Interim Superintendent Farnsworth recommended the approval of the routine business.

Sarah Beeson made the motion, Julie King seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.

ACTION ITEMS

1. Consolidation of Suncrest & Geneva Elementary Schools & Boundary Changes for Suncrest, Geneva, Aspen, and Orem Elementary Schools

Assistant Superintendent Dr. John Patten reviewed the survey results for the consolidation and boundary changes. He said that 60% of parents and 75% of parents were in favor of option 2. Ada Wilson, Board

Member for the area, said that the community is prepared for the consolidation and change in boundaries.

Sara Hacken made the motion to approve option 2 for the consolidation of Geneva and Suncrest with the boundary changes. Ada Wilson seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

2. Naming the Potentially Consolidated Suncrest/Geneva Elementary

Principal John Shelton reviewed the final three choices for the consolidated Suncrest/Geneva elementary:

- Parkside
- Parkview
- Heritage

Sara Hacken made the motion to name the school Parkside Elementary, Stacy Bateman seconded it and the motion passed unanimously.

3. Naming the new elementary school in Saratoga Springs

Principal Katie Bowman reviewed the final three choices for the new elementary school in south Saratoga Springs:

- Harbor Point
- Desert Springs
- Cove Point

Julie King made the motion to name the school Harbor Point, Amber Bonner second it and the motion passed unanimously. Principal Bowman said the mascot will be the Pelicans.

4. Naming the new elementary school in Vineyard

Principal Gioviani Guzman reviewed the final three choices for the new elementary school in Vineyard:

- Lake Front
- Trailside
- Station Bay

Ada Wilson made the motion to name the school Trailside Elementary. Amber seconded it and the motion passed unanimously.

5. 2022-23 School Calendar

David Stephenson reviewed the three calendar options for 2022-23:

Option 1- school begins on August 16th and ends on May 25th. April 3rd is the teacher comp. day and the 4th-7th is spring break.

Option 2 – school begins on August 16th and ends on May 26th. The teacher comp. day is moved to February 17th so it is closer to parent teacher conferences, and April 3-7 is spring break.

Option 3 – school begins on August 10th and ends on May 19th.

Julie King made the motion to accept option 2 for the 2022-23 school calendar. The motion was seconded by Sarah Beeson. Board members said they were in favor of option two because it aligns the teacher comp day with parent teacher conferences and allows for a longer Presidents' Day weekend. **The motion passed with a unanimous vote.**

6. Proposed Boundary Adjustment for Cedar Ridge & Deerfield Elementary Schools

Dr. Patten reviewed the proposed boundary adjustments for Cedar Ridge and Deerfield elementary schools. He explained that there are new planned developments coming into the area and these adjustments will not affect any current students. The new boundary will allow for more students to attend Deerfield over time. **Amber Bonner made the motion to approve the boundary adjustment**

for Cedar Ridge and Deerfield elementary schools, Julie King seconded it and the motion passed unanimously.

7. Proposed Boundary Adjustments for Alpine, Ridgeline & Westfield Elementary Schools

Dr. Patten reviewed the proposed boundary adjustment for Alpine, Ridgeline and Westfield elementary schools. The area between Ridgeline and Westfield have proposed future developments. The proposed adjustment will capture future growth into Westfield Elementary. The existing boundary between Alpine and Westfield elementary schools does not make sense with the future development of the area. The new boundary will follow the development. According to Skyward, the boundary adjustment will not affect any current students because they are already attending out of area to the school of their choice and it will now become their boundary school. All three communities have been communicated with about the changes. Three Falls Road will also be boundaried into Westfield Elementary. **Amber Bonner made the motion to accept the Alpine, Ridgeline, and Westfield boundary changes, with the exception of keeping Three Falls Road and the roads that extend from it into the Westfield boundary. Julie King seconded it and the motion passed unanimously.**

8. Student Trip Requests

Secondary Supervisor Jeff Schoonover explained that the American Fork High School football team is requesting to go to San Diego next fall. It will be contingent upon COVID restrictions and the money paid for the trip will be refundable. **Sarah Beeson made the motion to accept the student trip request for the American Fork football team. The motion was seconded by Sara Hacken and it passed unanimously.**

9. Resolution 2021-006 Interlocal Agreement with Eagle Mountain City

Business Administrator Rob Smith presented information about Project Fremont in the Sweetwater Industrial Park. The proposed project will be on 327.85 acres adjacent to the Facebook facility. The original proposal requested a 75% tax increment on real property, 100% personal property. This was negotiated down to 67.5% on real property which will benefit the taxing entities, particularly Alpine School District. The base value of the property is \$3,283, and ASD currently receives \$17 per year in property tax. By approving this project ASD will see a net economic benefit of \$700,000 annually. **Based on this information and the Eagle Mountain City Council's unanimous approval, Business Administrator Rob Smith recommended the board's approval. Julie King made the motion to approve Resolution 2021-006 – Interlocal Agreement with Eagle Mountain City, and Sarah Beeson seconded.** Several board members discussed their opposition to RDA's, but acknowledged that the school district does have to play a part in economic development. The companies that come in help pay for road, sewer, water and other infrastructure that would otherwise be left to the schools to cover the costs. Julie King said she was pleased with her research about the company and the partnerships they have developed with education entities. Eagle Mountain Mayor Tom Westmoreland addressed the board. He said ASD is preparing for the future and providing opportunities for students to receive a positive education so they are prepared to take on the challenges in their lifetime. Bringing in fortune 400 companies will help our students have the best tools. Rob Smith thanked the Project Fremont team for being receptive to the school board's concern and requests. **The motion passed unanimously.**

REPORTS

1. Membership Report

Interim Superintendent Farnsworth reported that district enrollment increased by 443 students since October 1.

BOARD MEMBERS' AND SUPERINTENDENT'S INFORMATION ITEMS

Ada Wilson reported on the policy review committee she attended. She also recognized Superintendent Sam Jarman and Assistant Superintendent Rhonda Bromley for their leadership through the pandemic.

Sara Hacken reported on the virtual National School Boards Association conference. She commented that ASD shines among other districts throughout the country that have not opened and have not accomplished what our teachers and staff have achieved.

Stacy Bateman asked that students be encouraged to finish the school year strong.

Mark Clement commented about how excited students are to have prom and he thanked everyone for their efforts in planning an in-person graduation.

On motion by Julie King and seconded by Sarah Beeson, the meeting adjourned into closed session at 7:20 P.M. with Mark Clement, Sarah Beeson, Stacy Bateman, Amber Bonner, Sara Hacken, Julie King, and Ada Wilson voting in favor.

MINUTES OF THE CLOSED SESSION – APRIL 13, 2021

The Board of Education of the Alpine School District met in a closed session on Tuesday, April 13, 2021 at 7:30 P.M. The meeting took place at the Alpine School District Office.

The purpose of the closed session was to discuss personnel, property, litigation, and collective bargaining.

ADJOURNMENT

On motion by Sarah Beeson and seconded by Sara Hacken, the meeting adjourned at 9:12 P.M.

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Also present: Interim Superintendent Dr. Shane J. Farnsworth, Business Administrator Robert W. Smith, and members of the administrative staff. The public joined the meeting through live stream.

Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA)/Redevelopment Agency (RDA) Criteria Review

Business Administrator Rob Smith presented information about the criteria for tax increment financing. The district has fiduciary responsibility to taxpayers, and considers the following guiding principles: Minimize taxpayer impact, maximize funding available for students and develop key strategic partnerships to support student learning. He noted that the state policy has shifted and there is increasing responsibility for local school boards to increase property tax to fund education. Over a ten year period, Alpine School District's tax rate has decreased as property values have increased. In 2010, ASD's tax rate was .008220 and the current rate is .00635.

Currently, ASD's Board of Education has participated in key Tax Increment Funding (TIF) projects that have met the currently adopted criteria:

- Grow wealth in the community from investment outside the state
- High paying jobs from businesses that offer above county average wages
- No retail projects
- Support from all entities, Government Office of Education Development (GOED), county, city, etc.
- Increase assessed value while minimizing the impact on education services required
- Partnership opportunities that are supportive of public education and investing in the community

Rob reviewed the current CRA/RDA projects, the base year value vs. the actual and percentage of completion. He also shared the projects budget increment vs. actual. There was discussion about possible criteria that could be added to those listed above. This information will be reviewed and brought back to the board for possible action in the future.

Consolidation Preliminary Study

Kimberly Bird presented a process and timeline that would begin the annual consolidation study in April with action being taken by the board in August. The timeline criteria will be put on the district website on a page created for capital planning. The intent is to focus on transparency, time and making the study comprehensive.

There are many variables to be considered when moving a school to an informal study, i.e. socio-economic status, percentage of IEPs, Acadience scores, professional teacher experience, specialty programs, school size/performance trends, etc. The following schools had multiple variables and Kimberly requested that the board support moving them to an informal study: Aspen, Bonneville, Cedar Ridge, Cedar Valley Elementary, Deerfield, Forbes, Hidden Hollow, Lehi Elementary, Mountain Trails, Northridge, Orchard, River Rock, Segó Lily, Sharon, Shelley, Valley View, Westfield, Westmore, and Windsor. The Board was supportive of moving these schools to an informal study.

Board Governance

Board Member Sara Hacken led the discussion on board governance.

Principal Darrin Johnson gave the following school report:

In the past year Cascade Elementary has gone through a big transformation. Last year at this time our school was located at Hillcrest Elementary while Cascade's permanent home was being rebuilt. The new building is the gem of the district. It is modern with all new technology. The building is beautiful. The classrooms are bright and welcoming and the hallways are wide and bright. We are a Chinese immersion school. This means that half of our student body receives approximately 50 percent of their instruction in Chinese. The other half of the student body is taught only in English. There is a richness that the immersion brings to a school. All of our students benefit from this experience. Recently we held our annual Chinese lantern festival. The entire student body made over 6,000 individual lanterns that hung from the ceiling. It was a beautiful sight to see. Our school placed in the top ten district-wide in the Knowledge Bowl. They also took second place in the Battle of the Books. This is due to the help from many people. Brenda Roundy, our librarian, headed up the Battle of the Books. She was so positive all year that we would be able to hold the event, even when caseloads skyrocketed she didn't waver. Chandi Allen and Lyndsey Embly are both parents that went the extra mile to ensure the kids were prepared. The culture of Cascade is one of trust and learning. When you trust your teachers and help them find resources that are needed at the school, your teachers excel. We have solid teachers at Cascade who have a desire to learn and become even better in their craft. This year we started by hiring aides that love their students and are willing to try new ideas. We built into our schedule 30 minutes once per week where our coaches train our aides on how to more effectively help students who are struggling to read. The aides and the teachers have reported back to us that this small training is helping our aides become much more focused on how to best help with interventions. Hope Squad is new this year to Cascade Elementary and has been a great success. Grade-level teachers nominated 17 student members who are receiving training from the school counselor. Hope Squad has brought unity to the school with a school-wide donut day, recess games each Friday, and a huge Christmas food drive. Our food drive brought in over 4,500 individual items for the Utah Food Bank. We look forward to next year when Hope Squad will have a more significant impact school-wide.

COMMUNITY COMMENTS

Talia Clifton, an eighth grade student at Willowcreek Middle School, represented other students in her comments. She shared the students perspective about not returning to the same school schedule we had prior to the pandemic. Talia said that the Wednesday online day has been great for teachers, students and families. She quoted a University of Missouri study that shows that when a teacher is stressed, stress of students increases. With the shorter schedule, students have focused on what is important. The Wednesday

online day has benefited students who suffer from depression and teachers are able to do video calls with students who are struggling. Talia proposed having Wednesday as an online day, but also allow students to come to school if they need help and can't stay home. Another option she shared was to make Wednesday a half day, but to not return to the pre-COVID traditional schedule.

Jace Helean thanked the Board for making sure students were taught face to face this year. He spoke about his daughter and the change in behaviors when she doesn't have to wear a mask. As her parents, they decided it was not necessary for her to wear a mask any more. Mr. Helean referred to the updated health order and how it relates to wearing masks. He said the current mask exemption form is not correct and that parents need to be able to make these decisions without the permission of a medical doctor.

Scott Fuller commented that in considering the plans for next year, we need to remember why we made the changes in the first place. Are those conditions still true? In person learning is an important part of a student's education. Is it safe to go back to regular school next year? Are there things we need to do to mitigate risk? Safety, cleaning, and time for teachers to prepare lessons have been addressed. In March, the CDC said that in person learning has not been the place where COVID is spreading. Some of the measures taken to protect teachers is having a negative effect on students. The changes made last fall do not need to continue. The negative effects on students are real.

Kevin Tams is a Highland resident and has students in elementary, middle, and high school. He is grateful for what has been done to keep students learning and safe this year. The curriculum and time in school was minimized and students are not succeeding as they have in previous years. Please help students catch up and don't cut their chance for success.

Alicia Johnson addressed masks being worn in the schools right now. The mask mandate is over and she doesn't understand why students are still required to wear them. They can go to stores and restaurants and take their masks off. She knows a student who relies on lip reading due to a hearing impairment. These students are being discriminated against. Masks are for the unhealthy, not the healthy. Students are rarely affected by the virus like a compromised adult. Masks should only be prescribed by a doctor. The governor or health department doesn't have the right to make a law, only the legislators. Students should not be harassed for not wearing a mask. We need to get back to normal and honor our rights as Americans and citizens. If someone feels unsafe, they should wear a mask. If not, they should not wear one. It restricts airways and is not healthy.

Stephanie Grant said it is wrong to make students wear masks and to do so is spreading propaganda. It is changing the relationships teachers have with students. Three school districts have taken the mask mandate away. She said to let the parent's write their own exemptions. It is not healthy to make students wear masks and we should not make teachers force them to keep them on.

Laura Haacke said the Board should allow parents to attend in person in future meetings. In reference to Talia's comments, Laura said if the new normal is a hybrid, homeschool version of school, parents should be able to opt their portion of property tax to pay for computers and other supplies for their students. There are plenty of online options other than the one offered from the schools, and parents should be able to opt out of paying property tax to the district. Another option is to return to a traditional school schedule. Parents need the right to choose their own medical freedom and school schedule.

Tiffany Barker said to get the masks off of our children. If her child is not wearing a mask, she is not allowed to be by her friends. This is not the children's fight. She quoted some studies about children and how they are not affected by COVID and should not be required to wear masks.

The following written comments were submitted and read by the Board of Education:

Ammie Gillespie I am very grateful that our school district has had in person school all of this year. I am also very grateful for the teachers and staff that have shown up this year and worked super hard keeping our students safe! This year with Wednesday online learning for the middle/high school has been disappointing. We have struggled with online learning. We have one student in high school that is self-motivated until this year. It's been a struggle to get him on and especially getting the teachers to communicate back to him if there are any questions or concerns with assignments or tasks. We have one student in middle school that has learning disabilities and no motivation to complete tasks. My husband and I have sat for hours this year on Wednesdays to help complete his assignments. We have dropped this student off for extra math help on a few Wednesdays thanks to a wonderful math teacher Mrs. Hogan. The other classes the teachers are in are very difficult to get a hold of on Wednesdays. My elementary students have struggled with their siblings that are off all day. They think it unfair that their brothers are sleeping in and relaxing most of Wednesdays. As I have run errands on Wednesday mornings I've seen high school students loaded up with ski heading to resorts. I have seen large groups of kids at the grocery stores or at the outlets. They are not home learning online! This last Tuesday evening at dark I was driving with a friend and we were bombarded with the Jell-O bomb on our front windshield. We called the policeman as we saw the high school students driving away. The policeman said it happens a lot on Tuesday evening. We need our kids in school every week day. It's much better on their young bodies and minds to have a consistent schedule. Please vote for school learning every day!

Tiffany Petty I loved the schedule this year and the break for my kids if I'm being honest. I am grateful for the opportunity to stay open as a school and also district. I think social interactions and learning was good, but I am concerned about the depth of content reached and the amount of engagement from students. Is there a need to have a break in the middle of the week still? Did this create any lag in reaching all curriculum for the year? I think the online platform canvas is amazing and organized. Likely, kids will use it in college. A great tool to learn early. Is there enough hands on learning for kids to grasp certain concepts. For instance wood shops online are probably not as engaging as in person. The way that kids take in information for core subjects is probably great with canvas, but is there anything missed with less time in person? I feel less time has to translate somewhere. Are test scores reflecting anything different from our learning before? I would love your input and I look forward to see how education evolves and hope we can learn from the simplicity and gain a solution for well-rounded learning. This has been a monumental year and I will continue to feel grateful for a district who places the importance of kids maintaining mental, physical, and intellectual health.

Lynn Topham I'm worried that we won't go back to the full time school schedule. My kids have really struggled with keeping up with school and being engaged. They have said that it's the extended lessons and the fun activities that the teachers have cut out, and those are the things that keep their interest and what makes the classes enjoyable. I've also noticed how hard having Wednesday off has been, my kids act like it's the weekend and then have a hard time going back on Thursday.

Jana Bird I would like my kids to go to a full day of school. I would like them to go to school on Wednesdays. They need that extra time with the teachers. My son struggles in math sometimes and there is not enough time in class for him to receive that help. Please make the schedule how it was before covid.

Marya Johnson In the last month I have provided Alpine School District superintendent and assistant superintendent medical and expert mental documentation why my children should not be required to wear masks or face shields in school. Yet, despite several medical and mental experts Alpine School District has chosen they were more qualified to make these decisions for my children than the medical and mental experts recommendations I was in fact told that their medical and mental complications were not a "valid" reason for an exemption. This was done despite the fact that they do not have the qualified education nor the legal right to make these decisions for my children. The Alpine School District and its employees are now liable for any harm that my children face by continuing to wear masks or face shields, despite documentation which proves otherwise. Additionally, Alpine School District employees suggested treating my children differently due to these medical/mental conditions which is against the American Disability act. at this point Alpine School District has broken several federal laws, state laws, disability laws, and anti-discrimination laws. Not one of the Alpine District employees including yourselves know my children's specific medical or mental condition and have no such ability or right to determine what is in their best interest. I am not asking for you or any other Alpine School District employees permission to do what is medically and mentally necessary for the benefit of my children. I am writing this to help other children. Stop and research what you are saying. The assistant to Richard Saunders (Dr. Michelle Hoffman, deputy director, Cindy Dixon, superintendent, Mark Watterson, department of health), stated in the Utah Legislation Rules Review Committee on Thursday 22 April 2021 that "a doctor's note was not required, a parent was able to write the exemption for their children." I highly recommend you discontinue the law and discontinue the lie that "mass mandate for K-12 is Law", because it's clear it's not. Start telling the truth and discontinue restricting the rights of parents! As a mother I will never stop fighting for my children's medical and mental health. I am not asking your permission, I am telling you what my children need medically, mentally, and emotionally. I will ensure these recommendations from experts are adhered to.

Laralee Proctor I can work with whatever schedule you decide, but please have all schools, elementary and secondary, on the same schedule!

Mike Carpenter This never ending denial of the facts must end. There is no fact based reason why our children were ever subjugated to this demoralizing and demeaning scam, in fact the only excuse I can find is one of greed. The former and current governor have unleashed this fraud on the citizenry in an attempt to gain funds from the feds and other questionable sources. Many other districts have already come to their senses and ended this scam, it's time for Alpine to follow suit. Nothing is preventing those concerned from wearing the masks to "protect" themselves if they feel the need. There is overwhelming evidence that masks are actually making you more susceptible to illness by weakening your immune system and providing a landing point for germs. Let's stop the nonsense and avoid the guaranteed lawsuits that we the taxpayers are going to be footing the bill for.

Laura Eliason My son is a Kindergartner at Northridge Elementary School in Orem. I am very concerned that the school board is considering shortening the school day district-wide. The shortened school day this year has meant less time than even the little time a half-day allows teachers to teach 23 5-6 year olds how to read, and perform basic math functions. Children, especially those in the lower grades, need to be in person to learn effectively for many reasons. One reason I hope the board takes into consideration is that while some children have parents, guardians, or other family members at home to fill in for lost classroom time many do not. One hour less in a classroom does not mean that that hour will be completed at home. It means less education time for these children. It also means more expense and struggle for working parents who plan their jobs and careers around a longer school day. Many school districts around the country already have longer school days than even the typical ASD school day. (7 hours instead of the typical ASD close to 6 hours). If anything the district should be doing everything in its power to extend the school day,

especially after the instruction hours lost due to this past year due to COVID-19. One of the main purposes of even having a school district is for students to be in a classroom. Before cutting back classroom hours due to a budget concern, extracurricular activities should be scaled back or cancelled. For example, I'm not sure that an elementary school (Northridge) needs to have a ballroom dance team. Yes, it's nice. But if there is a choice between having a ballroom dance team and having and losing classroom time it should be a no-brainer. Thank you for your time. I plead with you to consider the essential functions of the United States schooling system which is classroom instruction. The pandemic has not changed the basic need for children to connect with teachers, and peers, in the classroom.

Lindsey Nielsen I want to know why we as parents who know our children best are not given the transparency on being able to have mask exemptions for our children. There have been numerous studies that have shown children are not high risk, the mask mandate is lifted. They should have the option to choose whether they want to continue wearing a mask or not.

Alicia Woolsey In regard to the school schedule for the upcoming 2021 - 2022 school year, I am all for having a shortened, 5-day a week schedule for elementary school. I do not have older children and I know secondary schools are a different challenge than elementary aged children, so my comment is not in regards to their specific secondary schedules, but only relates to the elementary school schedule. I am a part of the PTA Board at my children's elementary school, and in speaking with our principal, we discussed a possible schedule for next year that I feel is a great compromise to the many views and concerns regarding scheduling, and it offers a nice balance and blend to the varying scheduling concerns. The idea is to reduce the AM and PM track times by 15 minutes each, thus reducing the school day by only 15 minutes for individual students, but then providing for an additional 30 minutes of preparation time for the teachers each day. This allows for a nice blend of a slightly shortened day for the elementary students that are still so young and tire easily, additional prep time for teachers, while also maintaining the main instructional block during the day when all students are at school. It also does not shift the day dramatically for any 1 individual student, so parents who want their children at school longer would only have 15 minutes of additional non-school time to figure out, rather than the additional hour of this year. And, those parents who want to have their kids home earlier, also get a little bit of extra time with their children home. Additionally, it re-introduces an additional 45 minutes of instructional time (as compared to this year) to help those students who need more instructional time. The proposed schedule would be as follows: AM Track from 8 am - 2 pm, and PM Track from 9 am - 3 pm. Additionally, under this model, we would propose to keep a 1 hour early out day one day a week. As we discussed this model with our principal, I very much appreciated the compromise, balance, and out-of-the-box thinking that this scheduling idea brings. It feels like it comes a little way to meet each of the needs/concerns of parents, teachers, and students; while also not completely ignoring or trampling on the needs/concerns of any one group. As the Board considers new scheduling options for next year, I hope you will seriously look at this option to shorten each of the elementary track times by 15 minutes each day and provide teachers with 30 minutes of additional prep time each day. It feels like a win-win-win situation for teachers, students, and parents. Thank you for your time and consideration of this elementary scheduling proposal!

Laura Redford I am concerned by the survey recently sent out by the district and possible changes to the school schedule. The questions about teacher prep time were very poorly worded, did not provide enough context, and seemed to be leading to answers the district wanted to collect. Also, it was difficult to answer questions for multiple education levels. What works in middle school might not be good for elementary levels. I want there to be more transparency in the decisions the board is making about school schedules for the coming year. I am also concerned as a parent of students at Northridge Elementary that our schedule

will be so altered that we lose the meat of the specialty programs that are important for student learning, engagement, and joy without any parent involvement in the decisions that have to be made.

Heather Andreason I would like to endorse an alternative schedule option that they have developed that was not listed on the survey sent out this past week. I feel this proposed schedule addresses many of the needs that are being considered at this time. It will ensure both (1) a return to more instructional time that both students and teachers need while also (2) preserving increased teacher preparation time that has also been beneficial in many ways for both students and teachers. This solution centers around minimally decreasing the time spent in track times while protecting the main instructional block of the day that has been so significantly affected this year. This proposed schedule would decrease track time each day by only 15 minutes while adding 30 more minutes of individual prep time for teachers at the end of the day. This is in addition to their 1 hour of collaboration time on the early-out day. The schedule would look as follows:

Regular Schedule:

A Track 8:00am - 2:00pm

B Track 9:00am - 3:00pm

Early Out Schedule:

A Track 8:00am - 1:00pm

B Track 9:00am - 2:00pm

Kindergarten (possible option, though might need to be tweaked)

AM Session: 9:00-11:40

PM Session: 12:10-3:00, with an early out at 2:00pm on Mondays

I feel that this proposal should be considered by the School Board in its upcoming discussions about next year's schedule. It best meets the needs of both students and teachers while compromising between those who want to go back to the regular schedule and those who like the shortened school day.

Lachelle Thompson As a parent, I've seen many benefits of the adjusted COVID schedule (early out each day and a weekly distance learning day), especially at the junior high and high school levels.

- teachers focus on the essentials during the shortened class time
- students have more opportunities for extra help after school and on Wednesday
- students have time to do homework before sports and other extracurricular activities
- students can get more sleep
- I can schedule music lessons, doctor appointments, and more during the day on Wednesdays.
- teachers can do grading, planning and collaboration during their contract hours
- teachers won't get burned out as quickly
- I really like knowing A days and B days are always set days of the week.

Julie Saliby As educators, do you believe that students ages 5-18 are at all compromising the efficacy of their face coverings? Do you believe face coverings are safe for students who suffer from asthma, allergies, anxiety, autism, heart conditions...etc. Please answer this... What are the long term effects on mask wearers?*such as headaches arising from impeded breathing. Do the masks shed substances or fibers that are harmful when inhaled? Supporting continued face covering policy without knowing the answers to the above questions is irresponsible. As educators will you apply critical thinking to your decision or will you be complacent? End the fear. End the face covering policy. Children are not at risk.

And as educators, YOU have all had the opportunity to partake of the MRNA experimental trial It's time to free our children and allow them to breathe and interact freely!

Jamie Jensen I am a concerned parent about the recent survey conducted by ASD. Elementary school and secondary schools should NOT be included in one lump survey. They are much too different to generalize in the questions posed. The questions were much too guided, making me feel trapped and like ASD can now put their hands up and say 'well we sent out a survey.' It feels like there is a cost for these questions and information and we won't know until it's too late what the survey supposedly determined. For example, the questions concerning teaching prep and collaboration. Of course I want ample time for that, however not at the expense of an early/late start track. Small groups are where so much progress happens in literacy and math intervention. Our students will fall even further behind if they are in a class with 25+ kids all the time. Many families have secondary and elementary kids, and work. What are parents (especially those who work) supposed to do with children starting school at 8 and 9? Music, Art, PE, all specialties help to teach and nurture the WHOLE child, giving them a more complete education and learning experience. The benefits of these on their ability to learn, master, and memorize reach far beyond science into their social and emotional stability and education. Now more than ever, we need this WHOLE child approach. The open ended question at the end of the survey is impossible to quantify. I would like to see more transparency in deciding a school schedule and model for specialties BEFORE it is decided or dictated to us.

Cathy Owens A recent study coming out of Stanford confirms that face masks do not stop viral transmission, but they do cause significant physical and psychological harm to those who wear them. This is their conclusion: "The existing scientific evidences challenge the safety and efficacy of wearing facemask as preventive intervention for COVID-19. The data suggest that both medical and non-medical face masks are ineffective to block human-to-human transmission of viral and infectious disease such as SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19, supporting against the usage of facemasks. Wearing facemasks has been demonstrated to have substantial adverse physiological and psychological effects. These include hypoxia, hypercapnia, shortness of breath, increased acidity and toxicity, activation of fear and stress response, rise in stress hormones, immunosuppression, fatigue, headaches, decline in cognitive performance, predisposition for viral and infectious illnesses, chronic stress, anxiety and depression. Long-term consequences of wearing facemask can cause health deterioration, developing and progression of chronic diseases and premature death. Governments, policy makers and health organizations should utilize proper and scientific evidence-based approach with respect to wearing facemasks, when the latter is considered as preventive intervention for public health.

Have you read The Great Barrington Declaration? Written by infectious disease epidemiologists and public health scientists, it explores the damaging physical and mental health impacts of the prevailing COVID-19 policies, and they therefore recommend an approach called "Focused Protection."

The most compassionate approach that balances the risks and benefits of reaching herd immunity, is to allow those who are at minimal risk of death to live their lives normally to build up immunity to the virus through natural infection, while better protecting those who are at highest risk. A recent meta-analysis of 65 studies on the effects of mask-wearing has concluded that there is now a conglomeration of symptoms called Mask-Induced Exhaustion Syndrome—including headaches, fatigue, and neurological disturbances among other symptoms, happening in those forced to wear masks.

Covid has a 99.98% survival rate for young people. For teachers, all those who want it can now get a vaccine. There is no need, and no reason to keep masking our children. The physical and psychological

harms continue to increase the longer we mask them. Please do not mask our innocent children any longer. They cannot speak for or defend themselves. We must speak for them. This can go on no longer.

Aubree Rasmussen I am frustrated with the recent survey sent out by the district regarding school schedules. It is pretty difficult to answer the same questions for elementary level schools AND secondary schools at the same time. What works for one, may not work for the other. I also feel like the questions concerning teacher prep time/collaboration were only there for the district to get the answer that they want. Of course parents are going to want teachers to have plenty of time to collaborate and prep and of course teachers are going to want the same thing. BUT, at the expense of what? Losing the early/late track and having the one track starting at 9:00? A later start time doesn't work for a lot of working parents. More importantly to me though would be the loss of opportunity for SMALL group learning. Math and literacy intervention works best in these smaller groups and losing that is a huge disadvantage to our students. Last, as a parent of 4 students at Northridge Elementary (also an alumni myself) I am disheartened to learn that we are losing our specialty programs next year. We started attending Northridge from out of the area specifically for these programs. They are so beneficial to learning and providing for the WHOLE child. Why isn't the local community (in the actual school zone) input being considered when making these decisions? Where is the transparency? What works for a school in Eagle Mountain may not work for a school in Orem.

Lindy Milne Everyone in the state has the option to choose whether they wear masks or not except our children. Their classrooms have less than 50 people and we should be able to decide as parents whether or not our children need a mask. Give parents back their rights!

Kristen Fife Shortening the school day for elementary school kids would have a harmful effect. Both intellectually and emotionally. Since moving here 2 yrs. ago from another state, I feel my kids are going backwards with their learning. The schools are already crammed in recess and lunch as well as arts, library etc., so there is hardly any hard learning before leaving at 1. Kids also need the children's interaction. For some, this is their only child interaction. After a screwy couple of years, our kids deserve normal school times. However, for secondary schools...the Wednesday off is great!!

Myla Johnson It bothers me that my child cannot go to school without a mask on. It also really bothers me that the school district thinks they know better about what my child needs during the day than I do. Please change this to allow parents to write their own mask exemptions. We should not have to prove to anyone else what we already know to be best for our own child. We should not have to get a doctor to sign a note telling the school district what we already know. As the parent of my child, I can currently tell the school that my child has an egg/peanut/anything allergy that may result in a rash and therefore should be given different treats if someone brings treats in the classroom, or may need to sit in a different spot at lunchtime so they don't get contaminated with the food that will affect them adversely. That's not questioned at all, and some of the lovely teachers keep treats in their classrooms for those situations, and there are tables provided in the lunchroom for peanut-free kiddos. If my child has a behavior problem, I can work with the teacher to create a reward system so they are encouraged to make better choices (again, kindness of teachers prevails). There are accommodations made every day for the needs of different children, both physical and mental. I don't understand why having a mask on every child's face doesn't have exemptions possible. Now that we know more about the virus (how it's passed and not), now that we're past flu season and Christmas break, now that all teachers/staff who wanted the vaccines have been able to receive them, there is NO REASON LEFT to keep our kids wearing them. If people want to still wear masks, that's fine. But my child shouldn't have to wear a mask if it's not the best thing for my child. And I, as the parent of my child, should be listened to when it comes to their health and well-being. When will my voice matter to the

school district? How sad that I have to petition for that. This issue should be treated just like any other issues: anxiety, asthma, depression, rashes, diabetes, etc. These are all treated situationally with the parents and teachers working together to figure out what's best for the child. I find it very ironic that the mission of Alpine School District is "Educating all students to inspire learning and to protect our freedoms." Freedoms? What freedoms? Which ones? My child cannot currently choose to not wear a mask as the policy is run in the schools my children attend. And I cannot choose to let them not wear a mask. Whether my child wears a mask to school should not be in the hands of the school district, who doesn't know them, live with them or love them. I know what's best for my child. Why am I trusted with that responsibility when it comes to any other issue but this one? Please allow parents to write their own mask exemptions. Parents don't need proof from anyone else, and neither should you.

Cheyenne Olsen I have submitted medical mask exemptions for both of my students who attend Hidden Hollow Elementary. They have been denied in person attendance until a personalized healthcare plan is received and accepted by the school nurse. This is highly inappropriate. Why are personalized healthcare plans required along with the medical directive? Does the district nurse have the authority to deny a personalized healthcare plan? Will I be able to walk into the school and pull this personalized healthcare plan after masks are no longer required at school? My children are hurting mentally and physically with this mask mandate at school. Mandates are suggestions not laws. I am demanding that my parental rights are respected and medical directives are honored. Please advocate for my children to be able to learn in person without a mask for the remainder of this year as well as next year. If you look at the numbers and science you can tell this is a political issue not a health issue. My children have a right to a public education and I have a right to parent my children as I see fit. Please respect that. We live in the United States of America and do NOT cover our faces for any reason if we choose not to!

Laci Brewer I am concerned with what I am hearing from different schools and parents that specialties and am/pm may be taken away next year. As a parent I do not see many pros for this type of setting (except a teacher getting more prep time). Eliminating the am/pm schedule limits the one-on-one/small group setting for my child to get more academic focus during track time, which helps her succeed when there is a full classroom of students. I also do not understand the elimination of specialties--students need more than academics (English, math, science, social studies, writing) to grow and enjoy learning. I understand that you as a school district added the SEW - social emotional wellness element to your vision/mission; so to be decreasing creative outlet through music, art, PE where a child may feel less anxious and be able to decompress seems to be very counterintuitive to the SEW element both to the students and teachers. The elimination of am/pm and specialties should not be done away with until further input is brought to the table from the parents and a serious discussion and voting is taken place.

Stacey Holcombe I appreciate the time you are taking to read the concerns of the parents of Alpine School District. I have 4 children in the district. I am also a preschool teacher and used to teach some of the lower grades in elementary. I have done extensive research throughout my 20 year career and 100% agree with all findings that immersion in the arts enhances almost every aspect of a child's education. I know this to be true for all children, but as I have a daughter with dyslexia, I have found that it is even more important for students that need to learn through different modalities. She was a failing student below grade level. I moved her to Northridge because I learned of their unique model of allowing the children to spend a good portion of their days in the arts. It is counterintuitive that missing out on that much academic time would improve my daughter's academic understanding, but that is exactly what happened. It only takes a few moments of research to discover how many times this has been validated by the top education sources as well as universities. Not only did she move up to grade level, but just as importantly, she began to love education. I now run my preschool as an art and music based preschool and have seen the most amazing

results. Children have a much better chance of learning when all areas of their brains are being activated. They retain more information, reading comprehension improves, math scores improve, a sense of community is established, self-esteem is gained and on and on. My daughter is now in the 9th grade and has received almost straight A's throughout jr. high school. She is also in Honors English. I am positive these results can be attributed to her experience at Northridge Elementary. Please reconsider taking these programs from Northridge. Thank you for your time.

Sara McArthur-Pierce Mask mandates violate the relationship between child and parent guardian. Masks are considered a medical device and regardless of your belief in their efficacy all medical choices for children by law must be made by the parents and or guardians. Parents and guardians are held responsible and liable for their child's health and wellness and during this pandemic schools have deferred to other institutions who have provided unclear instructions and no chain of command to be held liable. If school boards, principals and teachers continue to keep parents uneducated about their responsibility to be in full charge of their child's medical health then the intent of the school board must be that they themselves wish to be held responsible and or notified for liability of intent to cause harm to minors. Please consider this when giving instruction to the school leadership in your jurisdiction where hundreds of affidavits citing physical, emotional, mental harm and learning difficulty and disruption, who would be held liable. Per my understanding the mandate states and Utah code states it would fall on the local school board and local principals of schools.

ACTION ITEM

1. Student Trip Requests

Interim Superintendent Farnsworth recommended the approval of the student trip requests.

Amber Bonner made the motion, Sarah Beeson seconded it and the motion passed unanimously.

DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

1. Schedule Plans for the 2021-2022 School Year

Dr. Farnsworth thanked Dr. John Patten, Dr. Joel Perkins and Dr. Analis Ruiz who have been working with a team to put together some possible school schedules for the next school year. In January and February of this year we worked on some Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) federal grants to provide remediation for learning loss. The plan was to return to a regular five day a week schedule next year and mitigate the learning loss. On March 11, 2021, the Utah State Board of Education suspended the 990 hour instruction requirement for the next school year, but retained the 180 day requirement. With the suspension of the 990 hour requirement, it allowed the leadership teams to look at some adjustments to the school day schedule based on the things learned this year and desired accomplishments for this coming school year. The leadership team sought input from various stake holder groups. From the feedback received, the team put together some proposals and then prepared a survey for parents, students and employees to get their input regarding variables associated with those proposals. David Stephenson reviewed the data from the survey. He said there were 21,154 respondents. The results indicated parents and educators were in favor of returning to school five days a week with minor modifications to the schedule.

Dr. Analis Ruiz shared the guiding principles used in creating a plan that would achieve high levels of learning for every student.

- Innovate to optimize student learning
- Support connection and wellbeing
- Maintain physical safety

Dr. Ruiz explained that when the district learned that the 990 hours of instructional time had been waived, the leadership team began studying ways to innovate and leverage the good things happening prior to the pandemic and the great learning that we have done this year.

Assistant Superintendent Dr. John Patten shared one option of a possible elementary school schedule with approximate times:

- 8:00 student start time
 - 7:30 – 8:00 a.m. – Teacher personal preparation
 - 8:00 a.m. – School starts (all students)
 - 10:45 a.m. – Morning kindergarten ends
 - 11:30 a.m. – Afternoon kindergarten begins
 - 2:15 p.m. – School ends (all students)
 - 2:15 – 3:15 p.m. Teacher professional learning
 - 3:15-4:00 p.m. Teacher personal preparation

- 9:00 student start time
 - 7:30 – 8:00 a.m. – Teacher personal preparation
 - 8:00-9:00 a.m. – Teacher professional learning
 - 9:00 a.m. – School starts (all students)
 - 11:45 a.m. – Morning kindergarten ends
 - 12:30 a.m. Afternoon kindergarten begins
 - 3:15 p.m. School ends (all students)
 - 3:15-4:00 p.m. Teacher personal preparation

Dr. Patten explained that professional learning refers to work space needed for teachers to identify curriculum essentials, prepare for meaningful Tier 1 instruction and assessment, analyze evidence of student learning and prepare for interventions and extensions. This work is primarily done with others in teacher teams, with the school intervention team, and in coordination with other support personnel. With this additional time, teacher teams will be asked to meet for at least two hours per week (instead of one hour per week, as is the current practice.) The board's first priority is student achievement. This schedule would add one hour per week for instructional time to improve literacy and math teaching in the current extended day schools, as well as decrease the amount of time for transitions. The board's second priority is teacher effectiveness. This option would allow for professional learning time from one hour per week to five. Teachers would have one hour and 15 minutes for personal preparation time. Teachers currently teaching in a traditional school would move to extended day pay. Dr. Patten noted that if this plan were selected, schools would have to be on different start times because of transportation. Board members expressed concerns about the affect this schedule could have on specialty teachers and emphasized the important role those classes play in the lives of students.

Dr. Joel Perkins shared some possible options for secondary schools:

Option 1: Five in-person days following the A/B schedule (four full days, one early-out day)
Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday (potential 75 min. classes with 30 min. "flex")

- 7:45 a.m. to 2:15 p.m. high schools (also Oak Canyon & Canyon View)
- 8:15 a.m. to 2:45 p.m. junior highs

Wednesday early-out (potential 57 min. classes; all four classes held before lunch)

- 7:45 a.m. to 11:45 p.m. high schools (buses run at 12:15 p.m.)
- 8:15 a.m. to 2:45 p.m. junior highs

In terms of student achievement, the board's first priority, this option would encourage innovation at the school level as site-based leadership teams design or refine within their schedule embedded time for intervention, consultation, extension, connection and wellbeing time, based on school goals and research-based practices. This option would support the board's second priority, teacher effectiveness by providing a larger block of time (2+hours) for teacher team collaboration. This would allow for added time for more intense work to support student learning, and would better facilitate the needs blended teams have to physically gather for collaboration. Selecting Wednesday as the early-out day would provide a midweek early out reprieve, establish good timing for teacher teams, ensure that collaboration time can be utilized by our teams effectively, and would preserve the integrity of instructional time on the shortened day.

Option 2: Five in-person days following the A/B schedule (early release on all five days) All 4 classes would be held prior to lunch.

Monday through Friday (potential 63 min classes with 30 min "flex")

- 7:45 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. high schools, OCJH and CVJH (buses run at 1:15 p.m.)
- 8:15 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. junior highs (buses run at 1:45 p.m.)

All 4 classes would be held prior to lunch.

Board members shared the input received from junior and senior high teachers and students. There was some concern about the difference in schedules between elementary and secondary. Dr. Farnsworth commented that this is just a first step in determining secondary options.

2. School Resource Officer Interlocal Cooperation Agreements

Interim Superintendent Farnsworth recommended that we postpone the School Resource Officer Interlocal Cooperation Agreement to a future board meeting. A state statute change requires us to make some adjustments to the agreements.

3. Resolution 2021-007 – Adopting the 2017 Mountainland Assoc. of Governments (MAG) Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Summit, Utah and Wasatch Counties

Assistant to the Superintendent Kimberly Bird explained Resolution 2021-007 to adopt the 2017 MAG Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Summit, Utah and Wasatch Counties agreement to the board members. She clarified that it does not tie the hands of the board in anyway, but would allow the district to apply for federal grants that would help with capital projects that have hazardous concerns (flood, fire, earthquake). **Julie King made the motion to approve Resolution 2021-007 – Adopting the 2017 Mountainland Assoc. of Governments (MAG) Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan summit, Utah and Wasatch Counties. Ada Wilson seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.**

BOARD MEMBER COMMITTEE REPORTS

Ada Wilson reported on the policy review committee. They discussed a Memo of Understanding (MOU) protocol that will put a framework in place to communicate with professional organizations when there is policy that will affect them.

ADJOURNMENT

On motion by Mark Clement and seconded by Stacy Bateman, the meeting adjourned into closed session at 8:47 P.M. with Mark Clement, Sarah Beeson, Stacy Bateman, Amber Bonner, Sara Hacken, Julie King, and Ada Wilson voting in favor.

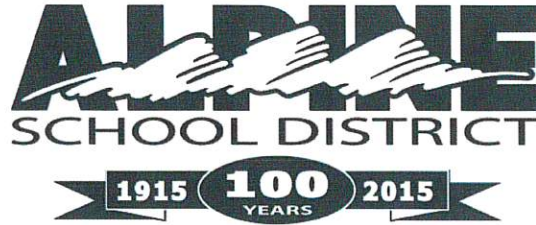



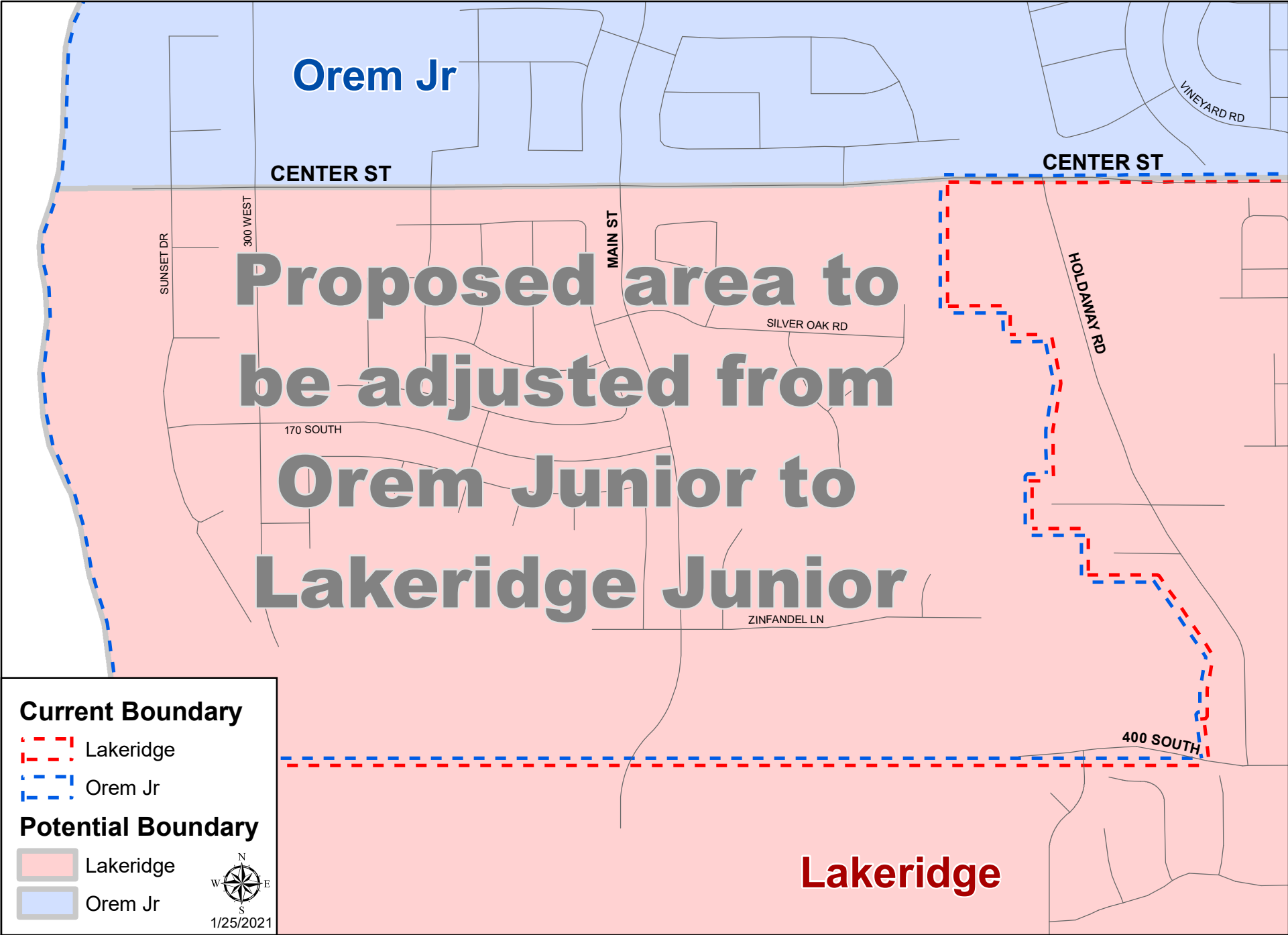

2. Alpine School District agrees to fund step and lane. (Benefits equal to 1% on salary schedule)
3. Alpine School District agrees to fund insurance increase on base plan (Plan 4). (Benefits equal to 1% on salary schedule)
4. Alpine School District agrees to a 1% one-time employee payment in November (bonus).
5. Alpine School District agrees to move onsite tech position to professional salary schedule (Lane A-C)
6. Alpine School District agrees to move onsite tech to a 220 contract day position.
7. Alpine School District agrees to a base and potential of one lane movement based on education/certification for the following positions on classified schedule: Plumber, electrician, refrigerator & equipment specialist, HVAC (16-17), Assistant Lead (18-19), Lead Formam (20-21)
8. Alpine School District agrees to continue to work with the association to consider other jobs on classified schedule and recommending lane movement based on education/certification.
