Training:

Annual Advanced Cardiac Life Support testing was the focus in May. All Summit County and Park City EMT/Paramedics are required to pass ACLS testing every other year. A 93% pass rate was seen on the first test attempt with a 100% pass rate on the second attempt. Written and practical testing are part of this process and the goal is to encourage competent and confident providers.

Continue to focus on new hire EMTs and their training needs

Three full time EMT positions were filled which require additional training. Each full time EMT has assumed additional responsibilities which require employee management and program management training.
