Call to Order and Roll Call

Mayor Dustin called the Monday, July 19, 2021, Nibley City Council meeting to order at 12:04 p.m. Those in attendance included Mayor Shaun Dustin, Councilmember Tom Bernhardt, Councilmember Norman Larsen, Councilmember Nathan Laursen and Councilmember Kay Sweeten. Justin Maughan, Nibley City Manager was also present.

Councilmember Bernhardt moved to approve the July 19, 2021, meeting agenda. Councilmember Larsen seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously 4-0; with Councilmember Bernhardt, Councilmember Larsen, Councilmember Laursen, and Councilmember Sweeten all in favor.

Discussion & Consideration - Amendment to Resolution 21-17: A Resolution Regulating the Use of Fireworks in Nibley City

Mayor Dustin described that there was a business in town that wanted to put on fireworks show that was licensed and insured for the July 24th holiday. When the original resolution was passed, it was limited to the Nibley City Heritage Days fireworks show. The City Council would need to adjust the Resolution to allow licensed and insured fireworks shows in Nibley.

Councilmember Bernhardt move to approve the amendment to Resolution 21-17: A Resolution Regulating the Use of Fireworks in Nibley City. Councilmember Sweeten seconded.

Councilmember Bernhardt said he liked this amended Resolution better. If someone was willing to take the effort to license and insure their fireworks, it seemed okay to him.

The motion passed unanimously 4-0; with Councilmember Bernhardt, Councilmember Sweeten, Councilmember Larsen, and Councilmember Laursen all in favor.
