Reserve Officers

Section 1

The Wellington City Police Department Reserve Unit is established to supplement and assist the sworn police officers of the Wellington City Police Department with their duties. The Reserve Unit provides professional, sworn volunteer reserve officers who can augment's staffing levels and scheduling demands upon the Wellington City Police Department. Reserve Officers are certified law enforcement officers who function as contemplated by Utah Code Annotated Section 53-13-103 and 53-13-111.

Section 2

A Reserve Officer is an individual who is a sworn and certified peace officer under applicable statutes of the State of Utah. Also, a Reserve Officer meets all basic and in-service training requirements to qualify them as a law enforcement officer as designated in Utah Code Annotated Section 53-13-102. A Reserve Officer will adhere to the policies and procedures in force and effect for the Wellington City Police Department.

Section 3

A Reserve Officer is an individual selected by the Wellington City Mayor to function as a law enforcement officer as indicated in the Job Description with a job title of Reserve Police Officer from time to time as required by Wellington City. A Reserve Officer will be sworn in as a Wellington City Reserve Police Officer and function as a Wellington City Police Officer while on duty specifically for Wellington City. A Reserve Officer while functioning on the job as a law enforcement officer for Wellington City shall have the same duties and obligations imposed upon them as indicated for that job title (Reserve Police Officer) as indicated in the job description therefore.

Section 4

A Reserve Officer shall be compensated in an amount determined by the Wellington City Budget as last submitted by the Wellington City Mayor and adopted by the Wellington City Council. A Reserve Officer will not work more than 6 days per week when their shift with Wellington City is considered with any other work schedule where working as a law enforcement officer. Said compensation will be limited to an hourly rate and shall not include benefits such as vacation pay, holiday pay, retirement or sick
