**PROPOSITION**

Shall the City Council of American Fork City, Utah (the "City"), be authorized to issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) (the "Bonds") for the purpose of paying all or a portion of the costs of constructing road improvements and related improvements including improving and repairing related municipal water system, sewer system, and storm drain system facilities, and for payment of expenses reasonably incurred with the construction of said facilities and the authorization and issuance of the Bonds; said Bonds to be due and payable in not to exceed twenty-one (21) years from the date of issuance of the Bonds?

**Property Tax Cost of Bonds:** If the Bonds are issued as planned, an annual property tax to pay debt service on the Bonds will be required over a period of twenty (20) years in the estimated amount of \$80 (approximately \$7 per month) on a \$91,000 residence and in the estimated amount of \$146 on a business property having the same value.

As has been done for other outstanding general obligation bonds of the City, the City Council may mitigate the property tax impact to meet debt service payments on the Bonds by using water, sewer and storm drain user fees towards the water, sewer and storm drain portions of the bond project.

The foregoing information is only an estimate and is not a limit on the amount of taxes that the City may be required to levy in order to pay debt service on the Bonds. The City is obligated to levy taxes to the extent provided by law in order to pay the Bonds.
