

A Meeting of the Nibley City Council held at Nibley City Hall, 455 West 3200 South, Nibley, Utah, on Monday, January 3, 2022.

6:00 p.m.—Mayor-Elect Larry Jacobsen and Councilmembers Kathryn Beus, Tom Bernhardt, Norman Larsen, Nathan Laursen, and Kay Sweeten arrived at various times to have their pictures taken. No official business was discussed or conducted.

Opening Ceremonies

Mayor Dustin said this was not his meeting and he didn't have a lot to say except "thank you." He stated it had been his honor and privilege to serve for the past eight years. Mayor Dustin thanked and welcomed Mayor-Elect Jacobsen. He said he'd been a good friend and mentor and he looked forward to the years of his leadership.

City Recorder, Cheryl Bodily administered the Oath of Office to Kathryn Beus, Norman Larsen, and Larry Jacobsen.

Call to Order and Roll Call

Mayor Larry Jacobsen called the Monday, January 3, 2022, Nibley City Council meeting to order at 6:36 p.m. Those in attendance included Mayor Larry Jacobsen, Councilmember Kathryn Beus, Councilmember Tom Bernhardt, Councilmember Norman Larsen, Councilmember Nathan Laursen, and Councilmember Kay Sweeten. Justin Maughan, Nibley City Manager, Levi Roberts, Nibley City Planner, Darren Farrar, Nibley City Engineer, Steve Eliason, Nibley City Public Works Director, Chad Wright, Nibley City Recreation Director, Quinn Spackman, Nibley City Recreation Coordinator, Amy Johnson, Nibley City Treasurer, and Jamie Gonzales, Nibley City Office Specialist was also present.

Approval of the Previous Meeting Minutes and Current Agenda

Councilmember Beus moved to approve the December 16, 2021, meeting minutes and the agenda as presented. Councilmember Larsen seconded. The motion passed unanimously 5-0; with Councilmember Beus, Councilmember Larsen, Councilmember Bernhardt, Councilmember Laursen, and Councilmember Sweeten all in favor.

Public Comment Period

Mayor Jacobsen opened the Public Comment Period at 6:37 p.m.

Seeing no public comments, Mayor Jacobsen closed the Public Comment Period at 6:37 p.m.

Council and Staff Reports

Councilmember Bernhardt passed along his thanks for all the work the Public Works department had been doing in the last week-and-a-half to clear snow.

Councilmember Sweeten said she was also going to say thank you for the same thing. She said the public works department had done a great job.

Councilmember Beus ditto'd Councilmember Bernhardt and Councilmember Sweeten's comments.

Councilmember Laursen said these were his comments as well. He said he knew they had a lot of newbies, but they were doing a great job.

Councilmember Larsen said "same."

Mayor Jacobsen thanked former Mayor Dustin for his help on transition phasing. He said staff had been great. Mayor Jacobsen discussed moving forward.

Mayor Jacobsen discussed and summarized his proposed mayoral office hours.

Mayor Jacobsen said his role was different as Mayor on the Council as he viewed it as a member of Council, that got to vote. He said his job was to bring well thought out, well researched proposals that challenged the City Council to look at things from a number of points of view. He said the Council might be disappointed that he didn't have more opinions. He was the one who needed to share his opinion last. He wanted to bring the City Council and staff proposals that were well prepared and well thought out.

Mayor Jacobsen said at the next meeting he wanted to discuss and review meeting process and the resolution that was adopted in 2012.

Mayor Jacobsen reported that he and Mr. Maughan had attended elected officials' essentials training.

Mayor Jacobsen reported that he and Mr. Maughan would attend the Great Salt Lake Summit the following Wednesday. He said he would report back to the Council.

Mayor Jacobsen asked former Mayor Dustin to attend the upcoming Logan Wastewater Rate Committee meeting.

Mayor Jacobsen reminded the City Council of Legislatures Day on January 19. He said the Nibley Youth Council and he would be attending, and he invited the City Council to join them.

Mayor Jacobsen reported there was a land use training on the 9th of February at the Cache County Fairgrounds Event Center at 1:30 and 6:00. Mr. Roberts reported that it was the Utah Land Use Institute that was conducting the meeting.

Mayor Jacobsen said Nibley City needed to coordinate with Logan during public hearings at Logan's Planning Commission regarding projects on both ends of 2200 South; a rezone and a design review on a residential development on the Campbell property. Mayor Jacobsen reported that the Logan Planning Commission's public hearing was on January 13th, the same night as Nibley City's next City Council meeting. Mayor Jacobsen asked the City Council to give their comments and he and staff would put something together to send to the Logan Planning Commission.

Mayor Jacobsen said he was proud to be on a such a young, energetic, enthusiastic council and he wanted to keep it this way. He challenged the City Council to attend a Nibley Fit class with him. He suggested a 6:00 a.m. class and asked the City Council to talk about it.

Seeing no objection, the meeting was adjourned at 6:49 p.m.
