Take Care Utah, a Utah Health Policy Project initiative, is a network of non-profit organizations all across Utah focused on helping people navigate the health care system



Who is Eligible for Medicaid?

- Utah Residents
- Age 19 through 64
- U.S. citizen or legal resident
- Meet income requirements, which vary by household size:
- Income limit: 133% of FPL
 - HH 1 \$1467
 - HH 2 \$1982
 - HH 3 \$2497

Medicaid and CHIP are open for enrollment all year!



Eligibility Rules Vary Depending on the Medicaid Program

How to Qualify for TAM:

- Not be eligible for any other Medicaid program
- No income over 5% (\$ 54) of the Federal Poverty Level
- No children or custody of children
- Meet qualifications for one of the TAM sub groups
- Referral form must be completed by an approved agency

Importance of Targeted Adult Medicaid (TAM):

- Continuous coverage for
 1 year
- Dental benefits IF in a substance use treatment program
- Fee for Service Model

Why Medicaid Is Important

- If met with before release, there is less paperwork to fill out on release day
- The client will be able to access providers and prescriptions with 3-5 days of release when Medicaid is approved
- Will have help from an enrollment assister who can advocate for client and belo access and understand recourses
 - help access and understand resources
- No monthly premiums, no copays for visits or prescriptions (TAM)

Enrollment Process with the State Prison

During Receiving & Orientation, give out Medicaid Application

Once collected send to UHPP team to hold application until release

Attend Release Fair weekly to collect applications, answer questions, etc. Start the case management process for enrollment process with weekly released individuals



Jail Enrollment

Salt Lake Metro Jail

- Go to arraignment court to present on Medicaid
- Have clients sign list and pass out applications
- Go back through professional visiting to collect applications
- Submit to Department of Workforce Services (DWS) once released
- Start case management process with client

Jail Enrollment

Weber County Jail

- Weekly appointments through professional visiting to complete Medicaid application
- Collect application at weekly re entry fair
- Submit applications to Department of Workforce Services (DWS) once released
- Start case with client
- Start case management process

2,967 people reached at Criminal Justice partner sites

2,667 Medicaid applications submitted to DWS

2,181 people approved for Medicaid
