D. Secondary Reading Initiative Progress

In September students took the Set Level assessment to determine each individual's Lexile score. Student data was disaggregated by grade level to determine which students were on target for post high school workforce and college reading levels. This information was shared with principals and counselors, then with staff, and parents and students have received information about the progress each individual student and introducing families to the program. Assemblies were held at each school to review the Secondary Reading Initiative with students.

9. Policies

A. Substitute Pay for Extended Leave

Action item

The primary change to the policy includes the following:

Compensation for Long-Term Service for the Same Teacher. Substitute teacher service for no less than 27 days in a 30 or more consecutive school day period for the same regular teacher, shall be compensated at the daily or hourly rate of a first-year teacher. This compensation is for the duration of 30 or more consecutive school days of service. Once the consecutive school days of service ends, future compensation will be paid as indicated on the 2021-22 Substitute Teacher Wage Schedule.

The principal should contact the payroll department and develop a compensation agreement that can be agreed upon by all parties before work begins. The agreement shall state the start and end date for the agreement as well as the first-year teacher hourly rate.

If the teacher does not fulfill the long-term service agreement requirements, their wages will be recalculated to the substitute teacher wage rate. For wages paid over multiple payroll periods, this may include a reduction of wages in the most recent paycheck for already paid first year teacher wages in a prior payroll pay period.

Examples:

The substitute teacher works less than 27 days during a 30 consecutive school day period.

The substitute teacher quits in the middle of the agreed upon work time period and does not fulfill the requirements of the agreed upon compensation agreement and time period.
