March 2022 – Discuss and select new Working Groups.




May 2022 – Finalize Working Group membership and deliverables, determine corresponding Interim Committees

#### Water Infrastructure & Environment Priorities

- Elevate water infrastructure to the same level of attention as transportation and other infrastructure – it's existential.
- Identify long-term water infrastructure investments to recommend to the legislature:
  - Working with surrounding states
  - Encouraging cooperation between water conservancy districts
- Remove any remaining water conservation hurdles or opportunities
  - Zoning and land use requirements can sometimes be onerous for conservation
  - State property outdoor water use
  - Municipalities requiring green areas, as well as HOA and municipal landscaping
- Change narrative on "use it or lose it" to focus on efficient use of water, to benefit wise water owners

- Coordinate with federal government for resources
  - Engage federal delegation in these efforts
  - Statewide coordination of federal resources instead of infighting
- In periods of drought, encourage farmers to lease water rights to help residential areas
- Water is crucial to economic development, consider implementing a water offset for projects which consume a lot of water
  - e.g. funds could go into a water use mitigation fund
- Any other items that pertain to water infrastructure and environment.




