Project Description/Scope of Work

Panguitch City is applying for a grant/loan to replace a 1991 Pierce D-8000 pumper fire truck. The Panguitch City Volunteer Fire Department protects Panguitch City and the surrounding area in Garfield County which covers approximately 350 square miles, dispatching to all automobile accidents, wildland fires and structure fires. The 17 volunteer fire fighters provide protection to all Panguitch City residents and provide aide to all surrounding areas, including Garfield Memorial Hospital, Garfield County Courthouse, Garfield County Correctional Facility, Panguitch City Office, Panguitch City Library as well as State and Federal buildings.

What is this project's intended purpose and impacts to the community?

Purchase of a 2022 1050 Pierce Custom Enforcer PUC. Panguitch City has committed \$100,000 towards the purchase of the 1050 Pierce Custom Enforcer PUC. Garfield County has committed \$100,000 towards the purchase with an additional \$100,000 in contingency if needed. The city has been awarded a \$200,000 CDBG grant. A FEMA grant has also been applied for.

How does the project ease the burden on public infrastructure, public finance, federal land, employment, or safety issues?

It would significantly increase the amount of capabilities they can arrive on scene with. The truck they have is becoming obsolete and getting harder to find parts for. The current ISO rating for Panguitch is 4 and this truck could help reach a benchmark of 3 or less.

The information shall include the financial impact to the public as user fees, special assessments, or property taxes. (The Board has adopted a funding matrix tool to assist reasonable consistency regarding grant/loan award.) The CIB may require further public hearings if it determines the applicant did not adequately disclose to the public the possible financial impact of the financial assistance. Projects will not be placed on a CIB agenda until a public hearing has been held.
