Delinquent Final Billed Accounts, New Utility Service Application

Treasurer Tresa Skinner informed the Council she had talked to another collection agency. They would take on the delinquent accounts but would charge a higher fee than the other agency. On the overdue but not final billed accounts; Tresa and Lael have been calling them, and getting a

good response.

She gave the new Utility Service Application to the Council, and told them that legally, we can not ask someone to pay an overdue account for the previous owner.

Water Share Lease

Councilmember Giles said that there was an agreement in 2006 that allows residents to lease water shares from the City if they are unable to purchase a share for new connections. The lease is \$108 per year. There would be a time limit on the allowable lease of water shares. This matter will be revisited in July.

The Council decided on a ban except on July 4th at Cheddar Field, The City will provide popcorn, snow cones and music. The office staff will send out a flier.

Kerry Lake said they did not have a meeting last month, and had nothing to report.

Councilmember Johansen asked about the business in the old Alco store. It is a crypto currency mining operation. Mayor Van Wagoner will approach them about a business license.

Maintenance Report

Ignacio Arrien: We have changed out the stop signs for new signs, and will make an order for new ones needed. We are trimming limbs away from stop signs. 250 feet of the ball field fence was switched out. The water problem at the Cemetery is fixed.

Fire Report

Chief Britny Moreno: The Fire Dept has had eight callouts in the last month. Some were for help in other cities. The crews are awesome

We are acquiring materials and fittings for the new bathrooms. The Firetruck should be finished at the end of September.

We are currently recruiting new Firefighters.

Treasurer and Recorder Reports

Treasurer Tresa Skinner reported that Sales Tax for April, received in May was \$33,669, an increase of \$6,274 over last year. Transportation Tax was \$2,985, an increase of \$573.

Transient Room tax was \$384, and \$183

Recorder Lael White reported that business license renewal letters had been sent out. The City received about \$600 in cash awards from the City's Credit Cards.

Council Reports

Councilmember Johansen asked what to do if you observe people watering outside of hours. Do you go talk to them? Mayor Van Wagoner said he will stop and talk to people, and even turn the water off.

Councilmember Jorgensen said he is very impressed with the Fire Department

Councilmember Dorsch informed the Council that the pad for the Ice Rink will be hydroseeded next week. The Recreation District is paying for most of that cost.

Councilmember Giles said the CVSSD had met with the residents who were having water pressure problems. The district has investigated and found out where the problem was. They are monitoring the pressure on the supply lines.

The curb and gutter projects are underway.

The chip and seal is completed and he is pleased with the result.

Councilmember Johansen moved to approve payment of the bills Councilmember Leonard seconded the motion.
