RESOLUTION No. 22-28

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A TAX RATE FOR THE 2022-2023 FISCAL YEAR

WHEREAS Spanish Fork City will adopt its budget for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023, in accordance with law;

WHEREAS the Spanish Fork City Council is required to adopt a tax rate to impose on real property within Spanish Fork;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 59-2-912, the Spanish Fork City Council desires to adopt a tax rate greater than the certified tax rate as calculated by the Utah County Auditor's office but less than the proposed tax rate (0.001111) adopted by the City Council in Resolution 22-21; and

WHEREAS the City Council has provided public notice and conducted a public hearing as set forth by Utah Code Ann. § 59-2-919 and now desires to set a tax rate for Fiscal Year 2022-2023;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SPANISH FORK CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Tax Rate Adopted. The Spanish Fork City Council hereby sets, establishes, and adopts the tax rate of .001111 for tax year 2022 (2023 fiscal year general fund budget).


Section 2. Report to Utah County Auditor. City staff is directed to report the rate and levy and any other required information to the Utah County Auditor, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 59-2-912.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED TAX INCREASE **Spanish Fork City**

The Spanish Fork City is proposing to increase its property tax revenue.

- The Spanish Fork City tax on a \$461,000 residence would increase from \$222.87 to \$281.69, which is \$58.82 per year.
- The Spanish Fork City tax on a \$461,000 business would increase from \$405.22 to \$512.17, which is \$106.95 per year.
- If the proposed budget is approved, Spanish Fork City would increase its property tax budgeted revenue by 26.41% above last year's property tax budgeted revenue excluding eligible new growth.

All concerned citizens are invited to a public hearing on the tax increase.

Tax Rate Increase Advertisement Requirements

Instructions for newspaper publication:

- The advertisement shall be no less than 1/4 page in size
- The type used shall be no less than 18 point
- A 1/4 inch border shall surround the advertisement
- The advertisement may not be placed in that portion of the newspaper where legal notices and classified advertisements appear

Instructions for the taxing entity:

- The advertisement shall be published in:
 - 1) a newspaper or combination of newspapers of general circulation in the taxing entity
 - 2) Electronically in accordance with Section 41-1-101: on a website established by the collective efforts of Utah newspapers www.utahlegals.com
 - 3) On the Utah Public Notice Website created in Section 63F-1-701 www.utah.gov/pmn/index.html
- It is the legislative intent that whenever possible the advertisement should appear in a newspaper that is published at least one day per week
- The newspaper or combination of newspapers selected shall be of general interest and readership in the taxing entity and not of limited subject matter
- The advertisement shall run once each week for two weeks preceding the hearing.
- If the taxing entity is in a county that is required to publish a list (59-2-919.2), the taxing entity is only required to published one advertisement, one week before the public hearing
- The advertisement shall state that the taxing entity will meet on a certain day, time, and place fixed in the advertisement. The exact wording for the advertisement can be found in 59-2-919
- The scheduled hearing shall not be held less than ten (10) days after the mailing of the "Notice of Property Valuation and Tax Change" by the county auditor
- The scheduled meeting on the proposed tax increase may coincide with the hearing on the proposed budget
- The scheduled meeting shall begin at or after 6:00 P.M.
