Call to Order

Board Chair Trent Staggs called the Riverton Law Enforcement Service Area Board Meeting to order at 8:05 PM and conducted a roll call. Board members Buroker, McCay, McDougal, Stewart, and Wells were present.

Public Hearing

RLESA Resolution No. 22-20 – Adopting a RLESA Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023

Board Chair Staggs called for public comments; there being none, he closed the Public Hearing.

Board Chair Staggs explained that RLESA is its own taxing entity on property taxes and covers the cost of Riverton's law enforcement services.

Board Member Stewart **MOVED** that the Riverton Law Enforcement Service Area Board approve RLESA Resolution No. 22-20 – Adopting a RLESA Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. Board Member McCay **SECONDED** the motion. Board Chair Staggs called for discussion on the motion. There being none, he called for a roll-call vote. The vote was as follows: Buroker-yes, McCay-yes, McDougal-yes, Stewart-yes and Wells-yes. The motion passed unanimously.
