Deputy Attorney Devin Snow explained that preservation and conservation measures are ongoing in the Pine Valley area and the property owner is ready to grant a conservation easement. The County will be a joint holder of the conservation easement of the Pine Valley Meadows Preservation Project along with the Virgin River Land Preservation Association.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2022-2990, A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN WASHINGTON COUNTY AND THE STATE OF UTAH DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, DIVISION OF STATE PARKS FOR TRT FUNDING TO IMPROVE AND EXPAND A PORTION OF ROAD INSIDE SAND HOLLOW STATE PARKS

Chairman Iverson explained that road improvements are being made in Sand Hollow State Park to allow for course modifications for the annual IRONMAN events. Improvements to the Sand Hollow Road will alleviate traffic congestion in the various areas of the County affected by the IRONMAN. Tourism Tax Revenue Tax (TRT) will pay for a portion of the project with the remaining balance being paid for by the State of Utah Facilities Construction and Management (DFCM).

Motion by Commissioner Almquist to Adopt Resolution No. R-2022-2990, A Resolution Approving an Interlocal Agreement Between Washington County and the State of Utah Department of Natural Resources, Division of State Parks for TRT Funding to Improve and Expand a Portion of Road Inside Sand Hollow State Parks. Motion seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Iverson, Snow and Almquist voting aye.

## CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2022-2991, A RESOLUTION REGARDING BUDGETARY AND INFLATIONARY PRESSURE

Chairman Iverson stated that ongoing economic effects are being felt within Washington County including increases in energy prices, food costs, and general inflation. The County will be

analyzing all cost-cutting measures to continue to function efficiently in order to relieve inflationary pressure and the negative effects of any potential recession.

Commissioner Snow stated that the County is working to establish a culture of cost cutting from within while also maintaining a competitive level of service with the outside market.

Commissioner Almquist mentioned there are significant differences between government and private businesses and stated that the state tax rate varies from time to time but the mill levy rate has been frozen for several years which causes taxes to rise which increased property valuation.

Attorney Snow stated that the resolution clarifies the authorized services provided by the proposed Western Fire Special Service District. The newly consolidated district would have parks and recreation service for the Dammeron Valley park.

County Administrator Nicholle Felshaw explained that legal representation is provided for indigent criminal defendants and indigent parents/guardians in child welfare proceedings as well as youth with indigent parents/guardians in delinquency proceedings for cases in the Utah 5<sup>th</sup> District Court and Juvenile Court in Washington County. These newly updated contracts with replace and supersede the existing contracts for the juvenile defenders

Public Works Director Ron Whitehead explained that the Natural Resources Conservation District (NRCS) provides watershed plan environmental assessments or environmental impact statements pursuant to the watershed protection and flood prevention acts. The original agreement is being amended in order to expand the scope of work.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2022-2997, A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF A COMMENT LETTER TO THE BLM REGARDING A PROPOSED INTEGRATED WEED MANAGEMENT PLAN IN THE BEAVER DAM WASH AND RED CLIFFS NATIONAL CONSERVATION AREAS

Attorney Snow explained that the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) issued a draft programmatic environmental assessment regarding a proposed integrated weed management plan which has been reviewed by public works and the Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) offices. A comment letter in regards to weed management in the Beaver Dam Wash and Red Cliffs Conservation areas will be submitted for the draft EA.

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Snow to Adopt Resolution No. R-2022-2997, A Resolution Approving the Issuance of a Comment Letter to the BLM Regarding a Proposed Integrated Weed Management Plan in the Beaver Dam Wash and Red Cliffs National Conservation Areas. Motion seconded by Commissioner Almquist and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Iverson, Snow and Almquist voting aye.

#### **COMMISSIONERS' REPORT**

Mr. Whitehead stated that the road crew is working in the New Harmony and Black Ridge areas continuing with chip sealing projects. He cautioned drivers to be mindful of road workers while traveling on the highways.

Chairman Iverson reported that UDOT will begin widening the freeway between Exit 10 and Exit 13 along with the addition of the new interchange into Washington.

Commissioner Almquist mentioned the County Beautification crew is continuing to collect trash and debris in the medians across the County.

Commissioner Snow thanked the Sheriff's Office as some of the deputies were recently commended on their response to citizens

Having no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:25 p.m.












# Washington County TRAVEL BOARD FUND CASH and FUND BALANCE TREND




# Washington County TRAVEL BOARD FUND: REVENUE/EXPENSE TREND (Including Transfers)




































07/18/2022 @ 1850, Stranded Vehicle - Babylon - Man Hours - 4

SAR and Deputies responded to a stranded vehicle in Lower Babylon. The vehicle was within feet of the Virgin River. The vehicle was pulled out and the subjects escorted back to the main roadway. No medical was needed.

07/23/2022 @ 1130, UTV Accident - Sand Mountain - Man Hours - 24

SAR responded to a UTV rollover on Sand Mountain. A 43 year old male rolled the vehicle and was thrown out. He was in and out of consciousness and had possible internal injuries. Life Flight was called to respond. SAR and EMS responded up the dunes. Life Flight arrived on scene and assessed the subject. They loaded him in the helicopter and flew him to St George Regional hospital with serious injuries.

07/29/2022 @ 1500, UTV Accident - Sand Mountain - Man Hours - 30

SAR responded to a 54 year old male that rolled a UTV. The male was complaining of a severe arm pain. SAR and EMS located him and stabilized his arm. He was placed in a UTV and driven back to the IC. He was transported by EMS to SGRH for treatment.

08/04/2022 @ 1100, Ill Subjects – Upper Babylon – Man Hours – 45

SAR responded to three subject complaining of Heat Exhaustion. A 49 year old female and two males 18 and 15. The subjects had hiked in to get their motorcycle that was stuck in the sand from the previous day. SAR and EMS went in and located the subjects. They were all treated for heat exhaustion and brought out to the Incident Command. SAR also recovered their motorcycle.

08/05/2022 @ 1800, Unknown Suspicious – Sand Hollow Res. – Man Hours – 18

SAR responded to a suspicious circumstance and Sand Hollow State Park. A male subject said he was swimming at the Jumping Rocks and said he saw what looked like a foot and possibly a leg in a cove. The SAR Dive Team deployed and located the suspicious object. It was the bottom sole of a Barefoot water shoe.

08/09/2022 @ 1330, Jeep Accident - Sand Mountain - Man Hours - 42

SAR responded to a Jeep that rolled over on Sand Mountain. It was reported the Jeep was laying on a 78 year old male and a second person, a 73 year old male, was trapped inside the vehicle. Life Flight was launched. EMS and SAR went in on UTV's. SAR arrived and got both subjects free from the vehicle. Life Flight flew one male to SGRH. The second male was brought back to the IC in a SAR vehicle. He was taken to SGRH by ambulance.

08/10/2022 @ 0900, Mountain Bike Accident – Bear-Claw Poppy – Man Hours – 22

SAR was dispatch to a Mountain Bike crash on the Bear-Claw Poppy Trail. A 25 year old female wrecked and went unconscious. She regained consciousness, but had an altered mental status. SAR located her and stabilized her in a UTV. She was brought back to the IC and turned over to EMS. She was taken to SGRH by ambulance.

08/15/2022 @ 1345, Ill Hiker – Scout Cave Trail – Man Hours – 20

SAR responded to a 55 year old female hiker showing signs of dehydration. SAR deployed in Johnson Canyon and from the south toward Scout Cave. The subject was located up a wash on the south end of the trail. She was brought back to the Johnson Canyon Trail head. EMS checked her out and she was released.
