Public comment:

Colene Ogden wanted to thank Donald Childs and JD Bunnell for all their work to get the park ready for the family fun night. She stated that they had a very successful night, and a lot of community members came out.

Colene also stated that they are worried that the Gunnison Gazette might go out of business. She asked the council for ideas about helping them stay in business. The council stated that they feel like it has lost the hometown feel. They feel as though someone local needs to be involved for it to be successful.

Discussion with proposed approval of park rental fee changes:

Mayor Lori Nay feels like they should give the city residents a discount. The council agreed that residents would be charged \$80 for a full day and \$40 for a half day. Non-Residents will pay \$100 for a full day and \$50 for a half day. Councilwoman Stella Hill made the motion, Councilman Shawn Crane seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous

Discussion with proposed approval to amend city code 9-2-3.13 Water Use Efficiency in Amenity Landscape Irrigation:

Mayor Nay discussed the option to add fines to the city code for watering during the day. They went over the rough draft from the attorney. They feel as though they should cite a warning first then have a fine for additional offenses. The suggestion was made to define what landscaping is. Stella wondered if a farm would fall under landscaping. Rod felt as though farmers should be exempt because they are delivered water based on the shares owned. They felt as though the 2nd warning would be \$100 and the 3rd warning would be \$300. The mayor will discuss the changes with the attorney and have it ready to be passed at the next meeting.

Proposed approval of bills and adjustments.

The council went over the bills and adjustment. Robert Andersen made a motion to approve the bills, Shawn seconded, the vote was unanimous.

Proposed approval for City Council minutes; April 6th, 2022, April 13th, 2022, May 18, 2022, and Work meeting minutes, May 18, 2022:

The council went over the minutes. The names of those present were not on the minutes. They decided to table them. Valerie will have them ready to be approved for the next meeting.

Other business:

Rod Taylor stated that he spoke with Samuel Roach and let him know about all the fees that would be associated with building their home. They will have to take water and sewer to their property.

Mike Wanner stated that he rode 5.5 miles on the new G-Hill trail. He stated there has been a lot of progress with the project.

Shawn Crane said that they got the fliers out this week for the city's 4th of July celebration. Shawn asked where Mike was with the car show. Mike stated that he has shirts and awards ordered. He said that they don't have a lot signed up yet, but he is confident that they will get a good turnout.

Mike Wanner said that a lot of community members are very excited for the celebration this year.

They asked Valerie if she would call Whites Sanitation to make sure we can get a large dumpster for the celebration.

Stella Hill wanted to thank all the public works employees for the wonderful work they did on the cemetery. She also stated that Gunnison Floral placed a beautiful wreath in front of the veteran's memorial. She thinks that the council

should send a thank you. She also wondered who she needed to contact to get the list of veterans on the memorial. Robert stated that Jorgan Jensen would be a great contact for that. She has had requests for the list to be posted for those that don't live in the community.

The mayor thinks that the city should review the road frontage assessment fee. She stated that they need to have Kelly with Ensign Engineering go over this. She thinks that there will be at least a 30% increase due to inflation.
