#### Welcome

The meeting was called to order at 8:03 pm with Jon Eborn, Chelsea Welch, Robyn Derbidge, Bob Zentner and Joel Woodruff joining electronically on the phone. Joel Woodruff joined the board meeting in person at 8:41 p.m.

# **Public Comment**

Lindsay Simons: She is a parent of four children that attend Summit Academy. They have been dealing with a bully for the past year. They have had a meeting with the Vice President at the Elementary School and the teacher and tried to resolve the issue. Her child was punched in the face. Her son has a feeding tube and this bully ripped it out of his stomach and the bully pulled it out. Her son has to have surgery to have it put back in. This is unsafe. They have continued to report the bullying. This summer she reached out to the director Mr. Clark. He said that it was the parent's fault for not notifying the school that her son had a feeding tube even though it has been in her son's record. She educates the class when her child is in the class. She tried several times to reach out to the director. She told the director that she was going to get the police involved and he told her to go for it. Her children are not safe at this school.

Asucena Ledesma: Her child is dealing with the same thing. Her child is not safe at this school. She feels like the school doesn't care. This bully is the same bully. The school doesn't seem to care about her son being bullied. This bully left marks on her child. This bully threatened to kill himself and others. This should be a big red flag. This bully left marks on her son's body. She says that something must be done.

Jessica Howell: She appreciates that Summit listened to parents regarding SEL. Her plea as a parent is to keep providing excellent academics. She hopes that Summit will continue to provide a top Academic experience for students. She hopes that Summit will put the focus on education and insure that policies are clear on the following topics, Pornography, graphic material in school libraries, gender fluidity, regulations for gender specific bathrooms, lockers, etc. She has a huge list of things that keep happening at schools. At a neighboring school a student was dressed as a cat furry and wouldn't get off of the

lunchroom table. Parents are worried about what books will be available in the library? Will a biological male be able to use a girls bathroom, will my child have to call a teacher by a gender neutral pronoun. Please make Summit a beacon of Academic Excellence and keep these social issues out of Education. She would like a clear policy regarding bullying. She would like clear rules for behavior.

Megan Reeves: She would like Summit Academy to have clear policies regarding the following issues: School bathroom access for transgenders, Kids who identify as furries, behavior problems, Boundaries between personal information shared between teacher and student. Once these policies are in place she would like them to be available on the school website so that parents can access them easily..

# **Summit Academy Preschool**

Our 4 Year Old Classes are planning their first field trip to Wilkerson Farm and each student will get a pumpkin. We will also be bringing our enrichment classes along with us! Teachers are excited to add field trips to our program!

We are starting the coaching cycle in preschool. Our Coach Ms. Rachael has already made visits with all staff, staff are welcoming of Rachael and we are excited to be able to support our teachers in the coaching cycle.

We have implemented play based learning centers in our preschool classes where we embed LA, math and science into the play based center. Students have loved the play centers, they are learning and playing at the same time! We also started an art center to increase creativity in our students. Each room has an art cart where teachers place materials and during centers preschoolers can collage and have free art! The art cart has become one of the preschoolers favorite centers, it has been fun to watch them be creative!

# Draper- Ms. Hatch

Elementary music classes have begun before school.. We had more than 30 third-fifth graders sign up. We are excited to provide this option to parents. Our first concert will be in December Our JH students are all enjoying the lunch recess we are providing this year. We have several types of yard games for them to play including giant Connect 4. This helps with behavior issues. They purchased a lot of outdoor games and activities that they might be interested in. The Draper Journal came and did an article on it.

To help bridge our connection to the high school we are providing a 'Spirit Shuttle' for our JH students. Attendance has doubled and students absolutely love it. Cheerleaders from the high school join our JH students as they ride to the home high school football games.

#### Independence-Lisa Cutler

Student voice and choice is a big thing for us right now. We love to have our students lead out. We coordinated getting input from all of our junior high students using a word cloud and mentimeter to figure out what norms we should have for hallway expectations. The input was then examined and 3 norms rolled out that our STUDENTS made. The effect is already evident by having students create their own guidelines-they are doing it!

Our student council presented some new ideas including starting some after school activities beginning with our vice president having a "speedcubing" group on Fridays. This is a Rubik's cube group. Our junior high students say they don't like school but hang around after school a lot which tells us we are doing something right. Our community engagement visitors noted that.

# **Finance Report**

# Joint LEAs-

Financial Statements through August -

We just recently finished up our Internal Audit and they will come and present it to the board either October or November. It is nice to have them come and explain everything. There is a Special Ed Audit coming in December and there is a Safety Audit coming up as well.

# Finance Update

In the financial statements that were prepared. We are down 42 students from where the budget was. We will be short, and we will be reduced. On the high School side, we are at 516 and we budgeted for 550. We knew that it was a possibility. We would like to see the enrollments higher. We were prepared for this. Mr. Eborn asked about money from August allotments in September. Mr Zentner asked about the reds and greens. Then enrollment numbers seem to be stable but they would like them to be higher than that. The first reimbursements will start to come in. Once October hits, the reds will turn to green.

#### Discussion and Action item to review

#### Joint LEAs-

Org Chart - Mr. Eborn asked Brad Wilkinson to put together an organization chart chart and he is asking everyone to look at that. Brad has a significant part of that chart. With the change in director, there have been a few changes made temporarily. Mr. Eborn has met with principals and other board members and others to come together and be proactive with changes that were made. Mr. Eborn thanks all of those that have been proactive and helped out in this situation. Mr. Eborn met with Alana and Alysha to make sure that everything is moving forward in the direction that they want it to. Mr. Eborn is super impressed with those that dug in and helped with the changes that were made. The Organization Chart should be accurate and not leave any gaps.

Recently the State Charter School Board delivered 57 state required policies that will need to be discussed, revised, and passed in the coming months. Chelsea Welch will work with Kim on that.

#### Textbook and Instructional Material Discussion

The board is going to spend some time on the Curriculum policy and what that looks like. The board would like to make the teacher's job easier and the student's educational experience better. The board has ultimate accountability for what Curriculum is used at the school. Kim will work with Chelsea on some of these new policies. Kim has left some Redlined areas on this new policy regarding Sex Education. Chelsea Welch does let everyone know that there is a Sex Ed policy currently in existence and that maybe the two could be combined.

Principals meeting review and Job Function- We are grateful for the principals included in the meeting. Mr. Eborn is super impressed with the principal's knowledge in filling the gaps possibly left by Mr. Clark. The board agreed about an Advisory Committee if there is an escalating situation. The board may approve a temporary statement during the interim period. Kim reminds the board that there are many policies that state actions including action by the executive director. Mr Eborn wonders if we can make a blanket statement to direct any policies requiring director actions to go to an Advisory Committee during this temporary time.

# Revision to current Fiscal Policies and Procedures

Of the 58 policies, this is a big one. Brad created a policy in 2021 and has changed a few things to keep it current. Anything highlighted in Red is a change. A big one is section 5.5 on procurement. He is trying to align it with State procurement Law. He is not proposing any changes for the level of Board

procurement. Brad's biggest thing is to make sure that policy is what we are doing. One is dealing with cash. The other is about a Signature Stamp. The stamp is locked in Brad's drawer. We didn't include this before. Amounts over \$50,000.00 still require board approval. The last one is clarifying travel. Bob Zentner asks about the Cash boxes. Brad states that each box has about \$35.00. It is just for start-up money for events. On travel, they added the level of backup for mileage. Some campuses were concerned that there would be a trip that could come up when a board meeting wasn't scheduled in time to approve it. The state has done the hard work for us because it is the state. Any activity that takes a team over 150 miles one way must be locally board approved. Mr. Woodruff suggests that they have a pre approval process for the finals in any given sport that would need approval between board meetings. Mr. Eborne suggests that Ms. Grimmer look ahead to possibilities that could happen. Mr. Wilkinson doesn't have any concerns. Mr. Zentner asks if UHSSA reimburses teams that travel far away. No mileage is reimbursed. Ticket sales are shared.

#3502 Rehabilitation Act Section 504 Policy - Jacque Shmidt

This is an updated 504 policy. The grievance didn't flow well. We tried to make it easier to read. There are some monetary obligations if a claim is filed. It is a very important policy. The attorney is looking it over to make sure that it is clear. The big umbrella is Major life activity. Mr. Eborn read about an eligibility team. Each school has a team that gathers to decide yes or no. This is anything that requires using funds. Mr. Eborn asks about information regarding movement for service animals. The state is gathering the cost of instituting these changes. Mr. Zentner asked about Grieving and if that was included. She will work with principals if there is any question about where it falls under that umbrella.
