

## Summary of Appointments.

1. Candice Cox, Application for Burglar Alarm Company Agent License.
  - a. On or about September 15, 2022, Applicant submitted an application to the Division to operate as a Burglar Alarm Company Agent. As part of the application, Applicant disclosed that they had previously been convicted of a misdemeanor and/or felony.
  - b. Applicant, on or about December 07, 2009, in Fourth District Court, Provo, Utah, case number 091403529, pleaded guilty to Possession with Intent to Distribute a Controlled Substance, a 1st Degree Felony, Theft by Receiving Stolen Property, a 2nd degree felony, and Endangerment of a Child or Elder Adult, a 3rd degree felony. In 2011, after successful completion of probation, these charges were reduced to class A misdemeanors pursuant to Utah Code 76-3-402.
  - c. Applicant, on or about June 02, 2016, in Fourth District Court, Provo, Utah, case number 151400993, pleaded guilty to Possession w/Intent to Distribute a Controlled Substance, a 3rd degree felony. In 2017, after successful completion of probation, the charge was reduced to a class A misdemeanor pursuant to Utah Code 76-3-402.
  
2. Alison Olsen, Applicant for Burglar Alarm Company Agent License.
  - a. On or about September 19, 2022, Applicant submitted an application to the Division to operate as a Burglar Alarm Company Agent. At that time, Applicant **did not** have pending criminal action. Since that date, charges have been filed and are pending. No plea has been entered.
  - b. Applicant, on or about, September 07, 2022, in Fourth District Court, Provo, Utah, case number 221402180, applicant was charged with Possession or Use of a Controlled Substance, a class A misdemeanor and Use or Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, a class B misdemeanor.

### From the Probable Cause Statement:

On September 7th, 2022, approximately 2315 hours, at 426 W 200 N #206, Springville, Utah, I responded on reported harassment of Alison Olsen. I received a phone call from Alison, she began telling me she was being watched by her upstairs neighbors. Alison said her neighbors would turn off her "Alexa" device while it was playing and she would hear them talking about her. Alison stated her neighbors followed her and began filming Alison and her daughter on two different occasions today. While I asked questions, Alison would cry uncontrollably, began speaking about her husband, and how her air conditioning wasn't working. After receiving multiple phone calls from Alison, I responded to her residence. Upon arrival at Alison's residence, I spoke with Alison and her 11- year old daughter. I observed Alison having uncontrollable and rapid bodily movements as we spoke with her. Alison was unable to concentrate on our conversation, she would excitedly utter about her air conditioning being broken, her neighbors following and recording her, and how she wanted to be admitted to the mental health hospital or taken to jail. During the conversation, she would fling her arms around and her head moving side to side appearing unable to focus. While speaking with her I observed Alison appear to be extremely paranoid, unable to maintain reasonable thoughts, and appeared to be in mental health crisis. Officers called Wasatch Mental Health to consult with a therapist on her condition to find the best resources for Alison. Officers were advised based on Alison's actions Officers would be permitted to involuntary commit. Alison on her person was carrying a small back pack she possessed during the whole incident.

Officers searched Alison and her back pack to transport Alison in the patrol car. I searched her back pack and discovered small zip lock bags with what crystal-like residue inside. I also found a bag with white crystal-like substance and a short cut straw inside the zip lock bag. Based on my training and experience I observed this substance to appear to be methamphetamine, later it field tested positive for methamphetamine. The short straw I observed to be a "tooter" an instrument used to ingest controlled substances. I read Alison her Miranda rights and I asked Alison what the bags were and she stated they were "meth bags". I asked how much she had and Alison stated she bought "\$300 or something."

3. Joseph D. Royal, Applicant for Burglar Alarm Company Agent License.

- a. On or about September 16, 2022, Applicant submitted an application to the Division to operate as a Burglar Alarm Company Agent. At that time, Applicant **did not disclose that they** had pending criminal action.
- b. Applicant, on or about March 29, 2022, in Franklin County District Court, Preston, Idaho, case number CR21-22-0200, applicant was charged with Sexual Battery Committed by Lewd or Lascivious Acts on a Minor Child 16-17 years of age.

4. Abderrahim Mark Dkhissi, Applicant for Burglar Alarm Company Agent License.

- a. On or about October 14, 2022, Applicant submitted an application to the Division to operate as a Burglar Alarm Company Agent. As part of the application, Applicant disclosed that they had previously been convicted of a misdemeanor and/or felony.
- b. Applicant, on or about September 12, 2017, in Orem City Justice Court, Utah, case number 171900555, pleaded no contest to Possession or Use of a Controlled Substance, a class B misdemeanor.
- c. Applicant, on or about June 13, 2019, in Fourth District Court, Provo, Utah, case number 181403380, pleaded guilty to Possession or Use of a Controlled Substance Marijuana/Spice, a class B misdemeanor and Use or Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, a class A misdemeanor.

- b. Applicant, on or about December 17, 2013, in United States District Court, Utah, case number 2:13-cr-00062-TS-2, pleaded guilty to Money Laundering-Controlled Substance-Sell/Distribute/Dispense Conspiracy to Commit Money Laundering, a felony.

6. Katelyn Irene Hansen, Applicant for Burglar Alarm Company Agent License.
  - a. On or about September 22, 2022, Applicant submitted an application to the Division to operate as a Burglar Alarm Company Agent. As part of the application, Applicant disclosed that they had previously been convicted of a misdemeanor and/or felony.
  - b. Applicant, on or about June 24, 2019, in First District Court, Logan, Utah, case number 181100272, pleaded no contest to Distribute/Offer/Arrange Distribution of Controlled Substance, a 3rd Degree Felony.
