

# 2022 Sales Tax

# Sales Tax Collections (Percentage Growth for 12 months ended October 31, 2022)



### How to Pay

You can pay for your ride in the UTA On Demand app using a credit or debit card, FAREPAY card, or passes like the Eco Pass or Student Pass linked to your account. These cards can be added in your app or added to your account over the phone, just call 385-217-8191.

For those booking rides for **multiple riders** (ie. groups going to the same destination), you can book using your method of payment and include up to 4 additional riders at no extra cost. This means the fare for a one-way ticket/ride is only \$2.50. This is a trial feature and may be removed without notice.



## Accounts Created Trend


Number of accounts created segmented by acquisition source.





# 2022 Evaluation of Fare Promotions

## ■ Multi-rider Trial Fare (+1s)

- Launched on January 1, 2022
- Before the trial, approximately 19 daily trips (5%) for multiple rider
- Preliminary Results
  - After the trial approximately 33 daily trips (12%) for multiple riders
  - Annual fiscal impact est. \$19,278
  - Customer friendly, efficient, and not significant

- Consistency with UTA's future fare strategy
- Flexibility to manage growth of UTA On Demand
- Select promos: Multi-rider +1 trial, Referral credits, New rider promos if necessary



Request seeks to:

- Add \$11 M to MSP185 - Ogden/Weber State (OGX) BRT Project
- This corrects a budget preparation oversight and recognizes additional funding available to the project:
  - Additional fund request is 100% revenue backed from new and existing grants or local partner participation
  - Funds will be used to complete the project construction activities and fund potential property resolutions needed to finish out construction.

# MSP185- Ogden/Weber State (OGX) BRT Project

- Request seeks to add funding to advance and complete project
- Request adds \$11 M to the overall project budget. Funding Sources are shown below:
  - \$6.25 M from executed ARPA grant award
  - \$4.75 M from existing Small Starts Grant. To maintain match requirements, breakout is below:
