**Ms. Christie Morgan**, Senior Policy Advisor, Council Office, led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

## 2. CITIZEN PUBLIC INPUT

**Mr. Lawrence Horman** stated a member of the Salt Lake Valley Coalition to End Homelessness recently lost her life due, in part, to the improper handling of an encounter with law enforcement. He would like law enforcement officers to receive training on how to deescalate incidents with the homeless.

## 3. REPORT OF ELECTED OFFICIALS:

### 3.1. Council Members

**Council Member Stewart** introduced his policy advisor, Kim Coleman.

**Ms. Kim Coleman**, Senior Policy Advisor, Council Office, stated she was excited for this new position. She served in the State Legislature for six years, and prior to that, she served as a planning commissioner in West Valley City. She has a background in law enforcement.

**Council Member Harrison** introduced her policy advisor, Kathryn Calderon. She is currently a graduate student at the University of Utah who is pursuing a Masters Degree in public administration.

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**Ms. Kathryn Calderon** stated she was excited to be in this role and she has worked in local government over the years as well as for various nonprofit organizations.

Later in the meeting:

**Council Member Stringham** stated the Municipal Services District, with the help of several members of the Utah House of Representatives, received about \$10 million in Federal funding for a project in Kearns.

**Council Member Stewart** asked when the United Fire Authority board appointments would take place.

**Council Member Newton** stated an email was sent earlier asking for feedback. The feedback would be compiled and distributed this week. If time permitted, it would be put on the agenda for the next meeting.

**Council Member Stewart** asked if all Council meetings following a Monday holiday were to be cancelled. He was unsure if he needed to take time off for a business trip.

**Council Member Newton** asked Hannah Gorski, Administrative and Communications Coordinator, Council Office, and Christie Morgan, Senior Policy Advisor, Council Office, to compile a calendar of likely cancellations.

**Mr. Mitchell Park**, Legal Counsel, Council Office, stated many Council Members would be attending the National Association of Counties (NACo) conference in February, and with Presidents Day also that month, this could result in two weeks of cancelled meetings.

**Council Member Newton** asked Mr. Park to collaborate with Ms. Gorski and Ms. Morgan.

**Mayor Jennifer Wilson** thanked Lawrence Horman for his comment and stated

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there was a lot going on currently with the issue. She feels the County is moving in the right direction on these challenging issues. As the Mayor, she feels an ownership of the overall challenge and will be speaking more about this at the State of the County address. She also welcomed the new Council Members and stated she was happy to be working with them.

#### A PROCLAMATION OF THE SALT LAKE COUNTY COUNCIL PROCLAIMING JANUARY 2023 AS NATIONAL MENTORING MONTH IN SALT LAKE COUNTY, UTAH

WHEREAS, January is National Mentoring Month, an annual campaign to recruit quality mentors to provide additional networks of support for young people; and

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County recognizes the contributions of volunteer mentors, who guide young people to success in their education, career, and wellbeing; and

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WHEREAS, mentoring programs like Big Brothers Big Sisters of Utah make our county and communities stronger by enabling impactful relationships that increase social capital for young people and provide invaluable support networks; and

WHEREAS, throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, mentoring programs have stepped up to ensure that mentoring relationships continued virtually, while also connecting families to critical resources and services; and

WHEREAS, mentors can help young people explore careers and build skills to achieve higher lifetime economic outcomes through activities like helping them set career goals, write a resume, practice for an interview, connecting them to opportunities, and more; and

WHEREAS, research has demonstrated that mentoring programs have a significant, positive impact on a variety of academic achievement measures, including truancy and absenteeism, scholastic efficacy and engagement, school-related misconduct, and peer support; and

WHEREAS, mentoring can be an especially effective prevention and intervention strategy for young people with marginalized identities, such as youth with disabilities, BIPOC youth, LGBTQIA+ youth, and youth with experience in foster care; and

WHEREAS, quality mentoring promotes healthy relationships and communication, positive self-esteem, emotional well-being, and relationship growth for young people; and

WHEREAS, with a mentor, youth facing risk are more likely to enroll in college, less likely to start using drugs, and more likely to volunteer regularly in their communities; and

WHEREAS, while one in three young people still grow up without a mentor, demonstrating the need for additional awareness and resources for mentoring programs; and

WHEREAS, Utah Mentoring Month is the time of year to celebrate, elevate, and encourage mentoring throughout our county and recruit caring adult mentors in Salt Lake County;

## RESOLUTION NO. 6045

A RESOLUTION OF THE SALT LAKE COUNTY COUNCIL APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE JORDAN VALLEY WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS FOR AN INTEGRATED LAND USE AND WATER CONSERVATION MUNICIPAL PARTNERSHIP.

### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County (the "County") and the Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District (the "District") are "public agencies" as defined by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, UTAH CODE §§ 11-13-101 to -608, and are therefore authorized to enter into an Agreement to act jointly and cooperatively in a manner that will enable them to make the most efficient use of their resources and powers; and

WHEREAS, the County has received federal funds under section 603(b) of the Social Security Act as added by section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act (Public Law 117-2) (March 11, 2021) ("ARPA Funds") to provide funding to combat and address the effects of the novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 within Salt Lake County; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to use a portion of the ARPA Funds, in partnership with the District and the Utah League of Cities and Towns, to help integrate municipal land use planning with water resource conservation and planning; and

WHEREAS, the County now desires to enter into an interlocal cooperation agreement with the District, which agreement is attached hereto as **ATTACHMENT A** (the "Interlocal Agreement"), to provide for the transfer



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of ARPA Funds to the District for the water conservation partnership described in the Interlocal Agreement;

## RESOLUTION

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the County Council of Salt Lake County:

1. That the Interlocal Agreement between Salt Lake County and the Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District is approved, and that the Salt Lake County Mayor's execution of the same is ratified.
2. That the Interlocal Agreement will become effective as stated therein.
